PRESENTATIONS: GATEWAY ACADEMY/BREATHITT CENTER RENOVATIONS/ADDITIONS

Andrew Owens with Sherman, Carter, Barnhart Architects was present to provide an update on Gateway Academy/Breathitt Center Renovations and Additions. Mr. Owens updated the board on the work completed and what work is in progress and stated that the project is on schedule. Mr. Owens stated the construction is due to conclude on July 1, 2019 and the district may take possession of the building. He stated within 30 days of that date, all punch list items will be completed as well.

ARCHERY PROGRAM AT MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

David Sparks, KY NASP Region 2 Coordinator, was present to give the board an update on the implementation of an Archery Program at Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School. He also presented Ms. Carrie Caples, Principal, Martin Luther King, Jr Elementary with a \$3200.00 scholarship to begin the program on behalf of West Kentucky Archery Alumni Association.

TECHNOLOGY PLAN UPDATE

Tracy Pelletier, District Technology Coordinator, along with Jason Wilson, incoming District Technology Coordinator were present to give the board a PowerPoint Technology Plan Update (a copy of which is attached).

Ms. Pelletier began the presentation by welcoming Jason Wilson who will be taking over her position July 1, 2019. She states she has been working with Mr. Wilson over the past couple of months training him. She also outlined all accomplishments from the previous technology plan in the 2018-2019 school year. She stated the Technology Exchange will be held in the summer of 2019 for professional development

hours. They have already sold over 200 tickets after opening sales this week.

Mr. Wilson ended the presentation by outlining the new District Technology Plan for the 2019-2020 school year which includes many major activities slated for implementation and how these activities will advance curriculum and instruction integration, student technology literacy, professional development and technology infrastructure.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS OVERVIEW

Susie Hartline, Director of Strategic Planning, Federal Programs, and Grant Development was present to give the board a PowerPoint update of the English Language Learners Program (a copy of which is attached).

Ms. Hartline gave a brief overview of the English Language Learner Program and what the program goals are.

Ms. Hartline covered student performance, resources provided and the different languages in the district.

Also on hand for the presentation was Ms. Vicki Barnes, ELL Teacher as well as previous ELL student, Yeffry Macario, who explained to the Board the importance of the ELL program and what type of impact it had on his academic career in Christian County Public Schools.

INSTRUCTIONAL UPDATE: DIAGNOSTIC REVIEW TURNAROUND PLAN

Mary Ann Gemmill, Superintendent; Amy Wilcox, Chief Instructional Officer; Laura Morris, Chief Administrative Officer; Brad Hawkins, Chief Operations Officer; Susie Hartline, Director of Strategic Planning, Federal Programs, and Grant Development; Brooke Stinson, Principal, Freedom Elementary School and Carrie Caples, Principal, Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School were all present to give the board a PowerPoint Diagnostic Review Turnaround Plan Update (a copy of which is attached).

Ms. Gemmill began the presentation by stating they are going to give a more in depth overview of the results of the Diagnostic Review completed by KDE at Freedom and Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary Schools. Ms. Gemmill mentioned as previously stated that the KDE team was very complementary of the leadership of both principals in their respective buildings as well as the leadership team at the district level and that all have the capacity to lead the turnaround and improvement efforts at both schools.

Amy Wilcox, Chief Instructional Officer; Brad Hawkins, Chief Operations Officer and Susie Hartline, Director of Strategic Planning, Federal Programs, and Grant Development shared District Improvement Priorities and action plans for improvement.

Both Ms. Brooke Stinson, Principal, Freedom Elementary School and Ms. Carrie Caples, Principal, Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School shared each of their school improvement priorities and their action plan for improvements in each area.

CAPSTONE PRESENTATION

Ms. Mary Ann Gemmill, Superintendent, presented a PowePoint of her Capstone presentation (a copy of which is attached.) The presentation included all seven standards and indicators the board requested she rate herself in. Ms. Gemmill also provided evidence for each standard outlined. She also thanked her staff by stating all the work done would not be possible without them.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Mr. Clark</u>

Mr. Clark stated he spoke to a State Representative as well as a State Senator this week. The State Representative informed Mr. Clark that interim committees will be meeting in June to begin discussing the upcoming budget. The State Senator informed Mr. Clark that everyone is waiting for a special session to be called to discuss the pension system, but those discussions do not include the KTRS pension. Mr. Clark stated he will attempt to reach out to our Federal Representatives and will hopefully have an update from them at the next board meeting.

<u>Mr. Bell</u>

Mr. Bell stated he is continuing his book study "Building a Vibrant Community". He stated many things the book discusses, we are already doing. Mr. Bell stated the book speaks about skills young people need including: empathy, humbleness, having the ability to carry conversations in person and how can we integrate that into our curriculum. Mr. Bell states they will meet again in two weeks to discuss the importance of youth in the community.

Mr. Moore

Mr. Moore stated they met this morning for PBIS. He stated two schools have shown great gains this year – HHS and MLK, Jr. The goal for the summer is to have all schools begin the 19-20 school year on Tier 2.

INDIVIDUAL BOARD MEMBER AND SUPERINTENDENT COMMENTS

MR. BELL

Mr. Bell said the ending is better than the beginning and we are at the end of another year school with graduation set for next Friday night. He is excited to see the graduates. He hopes since graduation falls on Memorial Day Weekend that we will have out of town guests and show Hopkinsville in the most positive light. Mr. Bell liked the tentative budget proposed tonight for the 19-20 school year as the STEP increase for employees will be reenacted. He also feels that going through the Diagnostic Review process with Freedom and Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary Schools may not feel good, but he believes it will make the District better. Mr. Bell stated he has been to a couple of field days and enjoyed watching the students have fun with their friends.

MS. HAYES

Ms. Hayes stated she is disappointed in the vote tonight. She hates to continue to expose everyone on the board and at the Central Office to more things written about them that are not true and unfounded by people who are not knowledgeable and have never even been to a board meeting before. She is not affected by any attacks, but does hope that the nickel tax is passed in November. She states if we don't do something about the condition of the schools and catch up with the surrounding counties and what they are offering, the children are going to suffer.

MR. CLARK

Mr. Clark stated it's an exciting time of year to see our graduates and their accomplishments. Mr. Clark appreciates the many years of service the retirees gave to the District. He states you never know what influence you have in a child's life whether it be a bus driver, cafeteria worker, teacher, etc. He thanked the staff at the Central Office for their hard work and pointed out that the budget out of the district office is 3%.

MR. MOORE

Mr. Moore expressed he has been on the board for one year now and he truly enjoys it. He thanked the retirees for all their time they had given in the school system. He believes the nickel tax is very hard for a school board and he doesn't understand why people would put false rumors out in the public. Mr. Moore expressed concern over the split vote and hopes the board can become united again. Mr. Moore states the board has a tough job, but the teachers and supporters of the board have a tough job as well. He said it's been an exciting first year and he is looking forward to a couple more.

MS. KELLER

Ms. Keller stated sometimes you have to spend money to make money. Ms. Keller addressed Mr. Moore's concern about being a divided board due to the split vote, but says she does not consider them divided as they still want the same outcome. She is concerned that money is tight across the entire county and many people want our schools to thrive because they know it will better our community. She agrees with the student who spoke earlier this evening - you come into the county and see you a brand new sportsplex, a brand new sheriff's department, a brand new municipal building, a brand new courthouse but our two high schools are lacking. Ms. Keller stated they will continue to strive forward as a united board. There are still tough decisions to be made, but she thanked the board members for standing up and having tough shoulders. Ms. Keller congratulated all student athletes for signing their scholarships the past several weeks. She hopes all teachers have a restful summer.

MS. GEMMILL

Ms. Gemmill thanked the board members as this is a tough matter. She stated "All things work together for the good of those that love the Lord and our children". She believes the board loves our children and that's what it is about. She hopes within time Christian County will have nice facilities for the students. She thanked the board, Mr. Lackey and everyone for the work they have done.
