

Introducing the New Summer Backpack League





The Purpose

The Backpack League was designed to engage incoming third through sixth graders through authentic, project-based experiences designed to accelerate reading and math skills.



Campers were able to choose their own adventures. Field trips and hands-on learning opportunities took students into the community to learn.



Special learning opportunities were offered to students including CrossFit Kids and Culinary Class.



Students' experiences led to many new artifacts for their backpacks – 2394 after the first two weeks!

81 Teachers and Instructional Assistants








Reflections and Next Steps

Innovation in teaching and learning is deeper learning! - The Backpack League created a space for all involved to take risks, promote active learning, and experience school from a different lens.

All means all! - All students were in the classroom during Backpack League, learning alongside their peers. No student was served in a resource room or self-contained. This includes EBD students.

Relationships Matter! - Teachers and students have repeatedly commented on the impact of quality leadership and positive relationships (teacher to student, student to student, teacher to teacher).

Next year, we are committed to serving even more students.





Challenges

- Compliance in every school site
- Quality control checks
- Communication at all levels
- Training and monitoring systems

Improvement Strategies

- Post monthly financial timelines for all principals
- Implement quality checks by Internal Audit department
- Provide individual support provided based on data reviews





Finance – Summary of Evidence

- Conducted over 100 school level checks on key CAP Finance areas by JCPS internal audit
- Modified all job descriptions to incorporate training and compliance requirements
- Designed and implemented on-line training modules (207 views)
- Developing IT database to track internal audit findings




Safe Crisis Monitoring

Challenges

- Clear procedures aligned to policies
- Robust training and monitoring systems
- Compliance at every school site

Improvement Strategies

- Deliver on-going and targeted professional development to multiple staff (principals, assistant principals, SROs, security monitors)
- Provide individualized support based on data reviews
- Update procedures based on policy changes and new district handbook





SCM – Summary of Evidence

- Provided 341 SCM trainings provided in 18-19 school year to over 2,000 staff
- Conducted 25-30 data reviews during the 18-19 school year
- Increased communication strategies (i.e. individual emails, YouTube, twitter)
- Published JCPS SCM practice on the KDE Best Practice website
- Accepted for presentation at KDE Continuous Improvement Summit in September
