#### Applicable Statute

- KRS 158.6453 (2) (j) directs that:
- The Department of Education shall provide or facilitate statewide training sessions for existing teachers and administrators on how to:
  - 1. Integrate the revised content standards into classroom instruction;
  - Better integrate performance assessment of students within their instructional practices; and
  - 3. Help all students use higher-order thinking and communication skills.



# Four Key Commitments to Close Gaps and Boost Achievement

- Teachers who hold HIGH EXPECTATIONS for students and believe they can meet grade-level standards
- Consistent opportunities to work on GRADE-APPROPRIATE ASSIGNMENTS
- > STRONG INSTRUCTION, where students do most of the thinking in a lesson
- DEEP ENGAGEMENT in what students are learning




#### Phase 1: KAS Leadership Meetings

- In March, Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) staff hosted regional meetings for district and school leaders to:
  - assist districts with planning for implementation of the statewide expectations established in the newly revised Kentucky Academic Standards (KAS);
  - build knowledge and capacity around the depth and rigor of the standards and the alignment to grade-appropriate assignments; and
  - provide resources to support improved practice and strong instruction around the grade-level standards.






