RENOVATIONS/ADDITIONS**

Andrew Owens with Sherman, Carter, Barnhart Architects was present to provide an update on Gateway Academy/Breathitt Center Renovations and Additions. Mr. Owens stated all renovations are completed as well as any punch list items. The building is occupied by staff and students. Mr. Owens thanked the board and stated it was a pleasure to complete the project.

OPENING DAY OF SCHOOL UPDATE AND BACK TO SCHOOL INTRODUCTION

Ms. Mary Ann Gemmill, Superintendent, introduced each school's Principal and Assistant Principals to the Board and community (a PowerPoint is attached to the minutes).

SCORECARD UPDATE

Mary Ann Gemmill, Superintendent, stated that the District has updated their Scorecard based on the latest survey results and each person would like to give their Scorecard update in their respective departments. Ms. Gemmill also mentioned that the two Continuous School Improvement schools, Martin Luther King, Jr and Freedom Elementary will also present their Scorecard update in conjunction with the District Scorecard update.

Amy Wilcox, Chief Instructional Officer, discussed her Scorecard updates in the Student Learning area.

Laura Morris, Chief Administrative Officer, discussed her Scorecard updates in the Staff and Student Support Services area.

Susie Hartline, Director of Strategic Planning, Federal Programs, and Grant Development, discussed her Scorecard updates in the Community Partnerships area.

Brad Hawkins, Chief Operations Officer, discussed his Scorecard updates in the Fiscal and Operational area.

Carrie Caples, Principal, Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary and Renisha Elam, Principal, Freedom Elementary both discussed their scorecard updates at their respective schools.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mr. Moore

Mr. Moore stated the PBIS committee met this morning and discussed the process of getting the remaining schools on Tier 1. Mr. Moore stressed that communication is very important with PBIS through the student handbooks and site based decision making councils. They are working on getting more parents and guardians involved. He stated they are also working on expectations for students as well as parents. He said special needs area is also being reviewed. Mr. Moore stated Tier 2 will begin soon and will focus on praise, reward and recognition. He mentioned a quote regarding students “they don’t care how much we know, until they know how much we care” and that is what teachers, administrators and leadership is needing to implement for PBIS to work.

Mr. Bell

Mr. Bell stated he has been on the Service Excellence tour speaking to several different groups. He also attended the District Leadership Retreat where he took “sail”. Mr. Bell stated the work Mr. Crider did with his team at Boys and Girls Club was very special. Children went out in different neighborhoods to see some of the challenges students face as not all students show up for school the same way. That is the difference between fair and equitable. Mr. Bell also attended the Partners in Education luncheon with the Prichard Committee and reviewed some interesting data for scorecard decision making.

Ms. Hayes

Ms. Hayes said the more she reads the more she believes we are very fortunate to have nurses in every school. She read an article that interviewed children and one child said “my teacher is the only one that loves me”. Ms. Hayes stated teachers have a tremendous job to let their students know how important they are to them.

Mr. Clark

Mr. Clark added that not only are teachers an influence to children, but also bus drivers, cafeteria workers, etc. Mr. Clark stated he reached out to our state legislators and all have said there are no updates at this time. He did received an email from KY Board of Education and during their August 7th meeting they are requesting in the 2020-2021 budget that additional money should be allocated for teacher recruitment, ACT testing and Career and Technical Education. During their meeting they also mentioned fully funding all-day kindergarten and transportation for that program.

MR. BELL

Mr. Bell appreciated those who made public comments tonight at the tax levy hearing. He recently seen a rendering of the expansion of the walking trail on County Club Lane and said it would be exciting if a new Hopkinsville High School academic building were sitting behind it. Mr. Bell thanked the transportation department for their hard work and he would like to go on some bus routes for a firsthand experience. He thanked the Personnel Department for the recruitment of the new leadership in Christian County. He also thanked Millbrooke for their work finding alternatives with the bridge closure. He encouraged all employees to take the Christian County 2030 Vision Survey as they need input for the direction of Hopkinsville.

MS. HAYES

Ms. Hayes is excited over the possibility of passing the nickel tax levy to replace Hopkinsville High School. She visited both high schools on opening day and was very pleased that everything was running smoothly. She stated students were excited to see each other and hope that continues throughout the year.

MR. CLARK

Mr. Clark thanked employees for being at the board meeting. He stated everyone does a great job. He mentioned the public doesn't realize how hard it is when the state continues to cut funding. Mr. Clark stated with the leadership of Ms. Gemmill we will run a "tight ship" this year. He is excited for football season!

MR. MOORE

Mr. Moore thanked everyone for the job they do and he knows it is a huge effort. He urged the media to stress that we need more parents, grandparents and guardians to participate in school board meetings, site based council meetings, schools, etc. He mentioned that citizens believe there is money wasted, but there is no money to waste. Everyone needs to be involved and knowledgeable. He thanked all board members and Mr. Lackey for their hard work.

MS. KELLER

Ms. Keller echoed that school districts across the state are struggling because of inadequate state funding. State funding has decreased 15.8 percent in real dollars since 2008. Ms. Keller thanked the board members, principals, district staff, Ms. Darnell and the finance department for helping the district be good stewards of the money in Christian County for our students. It is amazing last year we increased our fund balance even though we had the 8th lowest property tax rate in the state. Ms. Keller doesn't believe that Ms. Darnell and her team receive enough credit for their work. She went on to say that our books are audited every year by an independent auditing firm and every year our books have been clean. While

our district could use the increased revenue from the 4%, she believes the board did the right thing tonight by leaving the tax rates unchanged. She doesn't believe it would be right to ask citizens to pay an increased tax rate on top of the nickel tax they are asking citizens to vote for in November. Ms. Keller encouraged everyone to vote for the nickel tax as it is so important to our students and our community.

MS. GEMMILL

Ms. Gemmill echoed the support for the staff and their hard work. Ms. Gemmill stated she was blown away by the opening of Gateway Academy Breathitt location. She thanked Trevor and his staff for all their hard work in making sure the building was ready for students. The opening of school went great as everyone takes pride in their work.
