RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY MUNICIPAL ENERGY AGENCY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Municipal Energy Agency ("KYMEA") desires to prepare an Integrated Resource Plan (the "IRP") for future power sources to serve KYMEA and its Members; and

WHEREAS, the IRP will be developed under the direction of KYMEA's President and CEO and the other KYMEA officers; and





WHEREAS, KYMEA desires to plan for its future power sources with a broad range of opportunities that may include KYMEA participation with other public agencies, municipal electric systems, joint agencies, cooperatives or independent operators, within or without the Commonwealth of Kentucky ("Potential Participants") who may be soliciting or needing power resources; and

WHEREAS, one or more Potential Participants, who are considered a public agency, may desire or request membership in KYMEA as such Potential Participant is soliciting proposals for power resource requirements for itself; and

WHEREAS, the KYMEA Board acknowledges that it may be mutually beneficial to KYMEA and its Members to plan jointly with Potential Participants for the purpose of participation with KYMEA in acquiring power resources and developing the IRP;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

Section 1. That KYMEA officers are hereby directed to develop an IRP, which may include joint resources with Potential Participants, and the KYMEA officers may review, disseminate and receive information relating to potential power resources, subject however to information which KYMEA officers determine should not be disclosed by KYMEA or any of its Members due to its confidential nature or any non-disclosure agreements.

Section 2. The President and CEO and other officers are authorized and directed to undertake and exercise such strategies and options as they deem necessary or prudent to develop

a comprehensive IRP and to communicate with Potential Participants, for as long as there appears to opportunities for potential benefits of the parties, that may include an ongoing relationship between KYMEA and one or more Potential Participant for the purposes of power supply planning, transmission facility planning and coordination, and potential membership in KYMEA.

Section 3. For the purpose of affecting the desires of the Board as set forth in this Resolution and to provide assistance, direction and guidance, if needed, to the President and CEO and other officers, the Executive Committee is directed to meet as necessary in the absence

of the Board being able to meet and provide such assistance, direction and guidance.

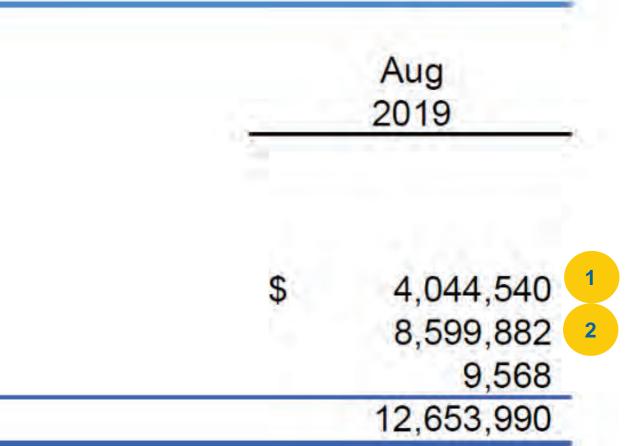

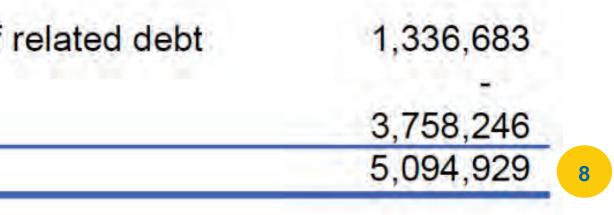

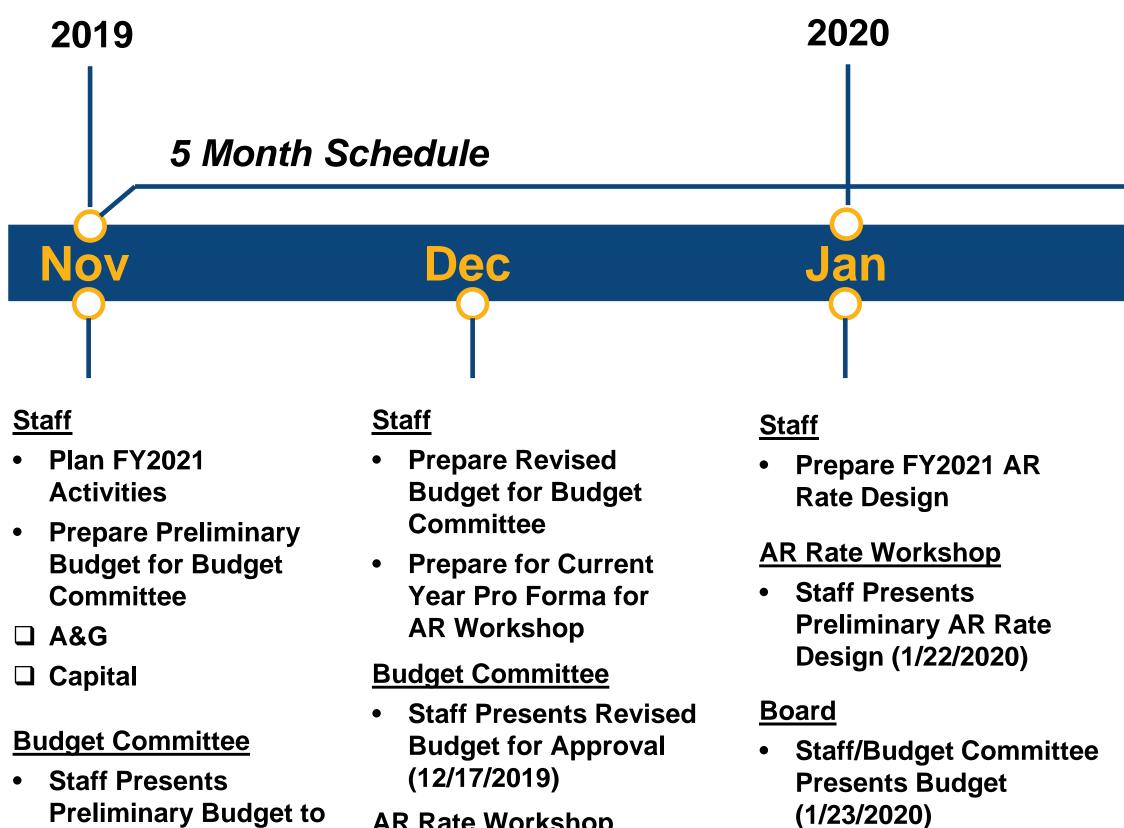
