The Arts Inclusion Award Program is Arts for All Kentucky's largest program, serving schools in every Congressional District in the Commonwealth and is designed to help schools provide experiential learning through the arts for children with and without disabilities in an inclusionary setting. With Arts Inclusion projects, the student becomes the artist in all areas of the arts including dramatic arts, creative movement/dance, literary arts, music, visual arts, film, photography, etc. Your project may focus on one arts discipline/area or integrate more than one. (Arts Inclusion funds cannot be used for performances, assemblies, or equipment.) All artist contact/instruction with students must be hands-on or experiential and interface with classroom curriculum and Academic Standards. A core group of students must receive a minimum of FIVE experiential instructional hours with the teaching artist.

Note: Under federal regulations, these funds may not be used for the purchase of equipment. It is recommended but not mandatory to include other sources of financial support for a proposed project. Teacher salaries may not be used as in-kind or supplemented in the Arts Inclusion Awards program unless contact time is after the conclusion of the school day.

Technical/Consultant: Payments to persons for fees specifically identified with the project. This includes technical, lighting, sound, video and film technicians, etc. Arts for All Kentucky funds *may not* be used to pay for this item, however, matching funds from another source may be used.

Materials/Supplies

Include any materials and supplies to be purchased with funds that are specifically related to the project and are "consumables." Examples of materials that can be purchased with Arts for All Kentucky funds are props, costumes, art supplies, blank CDs or DVDs, etc. (Equipment such as books, cameras, computers, stages, sound systems, musical instruments, etc. **may not** be purchased with these funds.) Marketing/Promotion

Travel

Travel of .45 per mile can be paid to artists traveling beyond 50 miles one way to your site. A *total* per diem of \$70 (motel & food) is allowed for artists who will have to stay overnight because of a very long distances. It is important to include a breakdown of individual travel expenses on your budget page. For instance, if the artist travels 350 miles round trip, you would indicate: 350 miles @.45 per mile= \$157.60.

In-kind

In-kind refers to the value of any service, fee, supplies or other items used for the project that are *donated* to the project. Only items for which no money is paid can be categorized as in-kind. Supplies already on hand at the school qualify for in-kind if they are being used for the project. The use of a performance space when the normal rental fee is not charged to the school can be used as in-kind, as another example.

Cash Match

Money received for the project outside of the Arts for All Kentucky award should be classified as cash match on the first page and the budget page of the application. This might include funds provided by the school, PTA/PTO, individuals, community businesses or agencies. Supplies, fees or services purchased (other than with Arts for All Kentucky funds) should be included in the cash match category. Cash matches are not required.

Final Report

If your school's project is approved for funding, a final report form is required to be filed within 10 days of the completion of your project, so it is necessary to keep all *receipts, invoices, documentation, evaluation instruments and results, and promotional materials* from your project for that report.

The core group of second grade students will work with the teaching artist to create an original work of art to enrich their learning from reading and science in the area of animals. Students will have options in choosing to make a model of an animal, the animal and its habitat, or a creative presentation of the animal that the students decides upon. Materials will include paper and found objects for collage or dioramas, paper, lead and color pencils for drawing, and/or markers and watercolors. Mr. Dye will provide instruction on how to use media to create and communicate expressive works of art.

After the residency:

Second (target group) and third grade students will perform their spring musical, <u>Amazing</u> Animals.

Students art works will be on display in the library for the student body to view during the school day as well as before and after the evening musical performance.

Students in the core group will go through the full process to create a work of art from choosing a concept, planning and organizing their work, to creating, refining and completing their work for sharing with others on display. Students will share their ideas and work with each other through viewing and discussing each other's work using artistic vocabulary.

Students with IEPs due to speech/language of specific learning needs are already included in the second grade schedule.

Our nine students with mild to moderately severe disabilities will be scheduled into the three target group classes of second graders. These students will come to the artist sessions with a special education instructional assistant.

Adaptive strategies and tools that are already in place in the classroom will be used that are unique to the learning needs of each student based on their specific disabilities. This will include pencils, crayons, markers, or paint brushes that are larger to accommodate the fine motor skills and grip of the student. When these tools are inappropriate, substitutions will be used such as sponges, stamps, or other creative tools as needed for the students to participate successfully.

- d) What are the expected student learning outcomes? How will the students benefit?

Learning about and through the arts makes learning memorable for students, so they will increase and retain their academic knowledge about animals and their unique place in our world. The teaching artist will show students how to draw, paint, collage, or shape a model of the animal of their choice. Each student will use his/her own creativity and ability to make a work of art that is uniquely their own and very special to them. Students will feel pride and accomplishment of an artistic project well-done that is theirs to keep forever. Students will benefit from the social interaction of creating art in a studio-type setting with their peers. They will talk and share ideas as they enjoy and encourage each other's art work. Musical learning from singing and later performing the musical Awesome Animals will also contribute to this residency being a "mountain-top" learning experience that students will carry with them for a very long time.
