Art for All Kentucky Arts Inclusion Application Guidelines and Checklist Postmark Deadline, October 20

The Arts Inclusion Award Program is Arts for All Kentucky's largest program, serving schools in every Congressional District in the Commonwealth and is designed to help schools provide experiential learning through the arts for children with and without disabilities in an inclusionary setting. With Arts Inclusion projects, the student becomes the artist in all areas of the arts including dramatic arts, creative movement/dance, literary arts, music, visual arts, film, photography, etc. Your project may focus on one arts discipline/area or integrate more than one. (Arts Inclusion funds cannot be used for performances, assemblies, or equipment.) All artist contact/instruction with students must be hands-on or experiential and interface with classroom curriculum and Academic Standards. A core group of students must receive a minimum of FIVE experiential instructional hours with the teaching artist.

Note: Under federal regulations, these funds may not be used for the purchase of equipment. It is recommended but not mandatory to include other sources of financial support for a proposed project. Teacher salaries may not be used as in-kind or supplemented in the Arts Inclusion Awards program unless contact time is after the conclusion of the school day.

<u>Personnel</u>

Artistic: Payments to artists for fees charged for services that are specifically related to the project. Artists are paid for direct contact hours with students. Up to two hours total of this project can be included for initial observation by the artist of the classroom culture and one hour of face-to-face planning WITH teacher(s). No resumes are needed for artists on our Arts for All Kentucky Teaching Roster. Go to: www.artsforallkentucky.org to see approved Roster Artists. If the artist is not a Roster Artist, a resume including educational and artistic background and instructional experience with children with disabilities is required with application. A background or police check from the Dept. of Courts is also required for artists not on the approved Artist Roster (background check must be included with application if not using a Arts for All KY Roster teaching artist).

Technical/Consultant: Payments to persons for fees specifically identified with the project. This includes technical, lighting, sound, video and film technicians, etc. Arts for All Kentucky funds *may not* be used to pay for this item, however, matching funds from another source may be used.

Materials/Supplies

Include any materials and supplies to be purchased with funds that are specifically related to the project and are "consumables." Examples of materials that can be purchased with Arts for All Kentucky funds are props, costumes, art supplies, blank CDs or DVDs, etc. (Equipment such as books, cameras, computers, stages, sound systems, musical instruments, etc. **may not** be purchased with these funds.) Also refreshments **may not** be purchased.

Marketing/Promotion

Include all costs for marketing, publicity and promotion specifically identified with the project. Include costs of newspaper, radio, and television advertising, printing and mailing of invitations, brochures, flyers, posters, photography, etc.

Travel

Travel of .45 per mile can be paid to artists traveling beyond 50 miles one way to your site. A *total* per diem of \$70 (motel & food) is allowed for artists who will have to stay overnight because of a very long distances. It is important to include a breakdown of individual travel expenses on your budget page. For instance, if the artist travels 350 miles round trip, you would indicate: 350 miles @.45 per mile= \$157.60.

In-kind

In-kind refers to the value of any service, fee, supplies or other items used for the project that are *donated* to the project. Only items for which no money is paid can be categorized as in-kind. Supplies already on hand at the school qualify for in-kind if they are being used for the project. The use of a performance space when the normal rental fee is not charged to the school can be used as in-kind, as another example.

Cash Match

Money received for the project outside of the Arts for All Kentucky award should be classified as cash match on the first page and the budget page of the application. This might include funds provided by the school, PTA/PTO, individuals, community businesses or agencies. Supplies, fees or services purchased (other than with Arts for All Kentucky funds) should be included in the cash match category. Cash matches are not required.

Final Report

If your school's project is approved for funding, a final report form is required to be filed within 10 days of the completion of your project, so it is necessary to keep all *receipts, invoices, documentation, evaluation instruments and results, and promotional materials* from your project for that report.

Project Narrative

- 1. Describe the project and *specifically* how it will be implemented. Include the following:
 - a) Arts discipline (music, dance, visual, film, drama, etc.) and the specific activities that will be used. *A core group of students must receive a minimum of five experiential instructional hours with the teaching artist.

The project "Barn Quilts" will begin with an introduction by the teaching artist, Kim Soule about the history and heritage of barn quilts in and around Kentucky. The focus will be on visual art for this project. In order to make it experiential for all students we will implement the following activities under the direction of teaching artist, Kim Soule and art teacher/facilitator, Christy Matthews:

- 1. <u>Students will be introduced to the art and history of barn quilts through the use of a powerpoint presentation and selected you tube videos which feature art and music.</u>
- 2. <u>Students will share their own observations of barn quilts and ideas. Students will observe the quality and workmanship of handmade quilts brought in by the artist.</u>
- 3. Students will work independently in sketchbooks (or sketch paper) to create a series of 3-5 ideas. The artist or teacher will choose one or two of the ideas for the student to recreate. The use of the ruler and measuring skills will be taught as well as balance and color theory. Students with special needs will work with peer tutors or receive independent instruction from the teaching artist or the art teacher/facilitator. Some students may come accompanied by an aide or assistant. Students with visual impairment will be placed near the board and given appropriate materials.
- 4. _Students will select a class design and work together to create a large scale 4x4 quilt design on blue Styrofoam from Lowes. All students will participate in the creation. These designs will be displayed in the hall and outside. Students with special needs will work side by side with other students. Some of the special needs include; learning disabilities, autisim, ADHD, visually impaired, hearing impaired and mental disabilities.

b) Which US Department of Education Objectives and KAS will be addressed in this project? (See Descriptors page for list of Objectives.)

We will focus on the artistic process of creating, responding and presenting. We will include as many students with special needs throughout the school as possible. The goal will be to increase the awareness of the students to the art in the world around them and to help them develop and interface math and art skills as they create barn quilts with special meaning and symbolism.

c.Inclusion will be accomplished through the students who are a part of the individual classes. Students with special needs are a natural part of an art class. Each class will have students who have some type of special needs. Some students with special needs will be invited to attend from other classes in order to meet the artist and receive this special inclusive instruction opportunity. Mrs. Matthews will work with the special Education department at FSMS to ensure many students are included.

Inclusion will be accomplished through the students who are a part of the individual classes. Each class will have students who have some type of special needs. Some students with special needs will be invited to attend from other classes in order to meet the artist and receive this special inclusive instruction opportunity. Students with visual impairment will be placed closer to the board and be given large print documents.

Students with behavior issues will be accompanied by an aide or Mrs. Matthews will have already a plan in place for rewarding or disciplining as needed to guide them during class.

Mrs. Matthews will have access to IEP's and 501 plans for her students and will inform the teaching artist of plans in place or needs of the individual students in the different classes.

Mrs. Soule and Mrs. Matthews will provide individualized instruction as needed and use peer tutors to help guide those that need a little extra guidance.

 - 1. Arts learning

Students will be exposed to the art of quilting and barn quilts. Students will learn about folk art in Kentucky and the importance of our heritage. Students will have a hands on experience creating their own designs for barn quilts and then collaborate on a larger 4x4 barn quilt that can be displayed in the school or outside. During the collaboration process students will experience social and emotional learning. Because of the use of measuring and symmetry in our designs the students will interface with Math.
