

The ARC has developed a plan for increasing the day by 30 minute increments every 4 weeks of meeting short term objectives/benchmarks. The student will be able to redirect anxiety and acquire coping skills to meet objectives and sensory needs. Success will mean that staff will be able to teach necessary skills and the student will then be able to return to the activity. A visual schedule will be developed to help transition the extended day. Sensory breaks will be given to calm anxiety and reduce stress within the classroom. A Positive Behavior Support Service provider has been contracted through December to help transition the student to the school setting as well. The school will continue to collaborate with the parents and providers to support a successful transition to school. The student will continue to receive ABA therapy to support the behavior issues.
