Behind the Haze Message Testing (KDPH) Project Proposal



Rescue is proposing to plan and conduct a total of four in-person focus groups in order to test Behind the Haze messaging in Kentucky on behalf of the Kentucky Department for Public Health (KDPH).

Introduction and Purpose

Behind the Haze is a Decision Blocks campaign designed to deliver educational content that exposes the truth about vapes and discourages teens from vape use. Rescue will conduct four message testing focus groups in two high schools in up to two cities. All participants will be in high school (ages 13-18 years old).

Focus group objectives include the following:

- Assess receptivity and reactions to message framing, tone, and delivery of concepts via video storyboards, which consist of a series of animations, background music, and narrative;
- · Gather feedback on modifications necessary to maximize message appeal and impact;
- Identify methods to reach the target audience by exploring social media use and engagement.

City and School Selection

Rescue will consult with KDPH to select two schools to participate in this project. Schools should have a minimum student body of 750 students. Rescue will recruit and secure research approval from two high schools in the selected cities. However, it would be extremely beneficial for KDPH to make the initial introductions to leverage local connections.

Research Materials Development

Rescue will develop research materials including a Screener Survey, Check-In Survey, Moderator Guide, and other instruments to use for recruitment and focus groups. Rescue will also print, collate, and produce all documents necessary for research.

Onsite Focus Groups

Rescue will conduct a total of four focus groups and will aim to recruit 8-12 participants per group. To the extent possible, teens who use vape will be prioritized for focus group inclusion. Focus groups will last approximately two hours each and focus group participants will receive a \$25 gift card as a 'thank you' for participation. Activities will include a mix of individual written surveys as well as semi-structured group discussions:

- Check-in Survey
- Personal Values Survey
- General Discussion
- Storyboard Message Testing Discussion & Survey

Data Analysis & Report Development

At the conclusion of all focus groups, Rescue will enter, clean, and analyze data. Rescue will then produce a final report in slide format, summarizing the key findings and recommendations for KDPH.

Project Milestones

The project will encompass the major milestones listed below. Data collection occurring the week of 11/18/20 is contingent upon 1) KDPH sharing with Rescue contact information for schools with whom KDPH has an existing relationship by 10/15/19, and 2) School research agreements signed by 11/4/19. If there are delays or challenges with school recruitment, a new timeline will be proposed for data collection and the remainder of the project.

The 2017 Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) reported that 14.1% of high school students in Kentucky use e-cigarettes, and that number will unfortunately continue to rise. While 2019 Kentucky-specific data is not yet available, the 2019 National Youth Tobacco Survey reported an alarming 135% increase of teen vape use from 11.7% in 2017 to 27.5% in 2019.

The Kentucky Department of Public Health Tobacco Prevention & Cessation Program is developing a teen vaping prevention program to combat the teen e-cigarette epidemic. We hope that SCHOOL NAME can support this critically important project by participating in our information gathering process.
