- Selling items- it is documented that food items can be sold 30 minutes after lunch- Bowling Green high has a bake sale twice to three times a week- this is what is used to supplement supplies/groceries - she clears anywhere from 150-300 a week. I asked how this was possible and she said that we are allowed because we are considered co-curricular.

This is on the Kentucky Regulatory Statute 158.854, enacted in 2005, and requires the state Board of Education to promulgate an administrative regulation to specify the minimum nutritional standards for food and beverages sold outside the school meal programs. As a result, Kentucky Administrative Regulation 702, Section 6.090 was established. As of July 1, 2014, Kentucky schools must adhere to whichever standard is more restrictive—the U.S. Department of Agriculture’s interim final rule or state law.

The time between the first student’s arrival at the school building and the end of the last instructional period. This policy does not apply to the extended school day, meaning after-school activities are not affected. No school may sell competitive foods or beverages from the arrival of the first student at the school building **until 30 minutes after the last lunch period.***
