


The Purpose


The Backpack League was created to engage incoming third through sixth graders through authentic, projectbased experiences specially designed to support numeracy and literacy.












Student Outcomes

Students maintained their reading and math skills over the summer.

They did not experience the "summer slide."

Student Outcomes

Students uploaded over 5,000 artifacts to their Backpack of Success Skills





 Students also improved their attendance by .2% during the first 20 days of the school year

Teachers reported that they would incorporate more project based learning activities and opportunities for student voice in classes this fall -

- Teachers were able to take the materials and resources they ordered to support their "Adventures" with them in order to use those materials in their classrooms and schools.
