8. MUNICIPAL ORDERS

8.A. Municipal Order 31-2019 entitled A MUNICIPAL ORDER APPROVING 1.6% COST-OF-LIVING INCREASE FOR ALL ELIGIBLE PENSION ANNUITANTS UNDER THE (CLOSED) CITY EMPLOYEES' PENSION FUND, was approved 5-0 on one reading upon motion of Commissioner Smith-Wright with a second by Commissioner Conder.

The Board of Trustees of the (closed) City Employees' Pension Fund met and by unanimous vote recommends a 1.6% cost of living increase for eligible annuitants effective with pension checks received in January 2020. City Manager Pagan further explained the fund closed in 1986 and does not contain current employees and the increase was based off the social security increase.

8.B. Municipal Order 32-2019 entitled A MUNICIPAL ORDER APPROVING A 1.6% COST-OF-LIVING INCREASE FOR ALL ANNUITANTS OF THE OWENSBORO POLICE AND FIREFIGHTERS' RETIREMENT FUND ("CLOSED"), was approved 5-0 on one reading upon motion of Mayor Watson with a second by Commissioner Sanford.

The Board of Trustees of the Police and Firefighters' Retirement Fund (closed) met and unanimously recommends a 1.6% cost of living increase for annuitants effective with pension checks received in January 2020. City Manager Pagan explained the closed fund does not contain current employees and the increase was based off the social security increase.

The agreement allows the school to pay one annual fee and rides be given to their students anywhere in the City. There have been approximately 2,600+ riders in the first $2\frac{1}{2}$ (two and one-half) months.
