ocus on Plan Ahead Smiles: Hygienist uses theater, education to help kids get excited about brushing

How many of us were told what exactly was happening? Sure, we sat still and frigid, staring into the bright light over the dentist's chair as she or he educated us as much as possible, realizing that our young brains were trying to just keep calm. How many of us really took in the message? Tracy Laughner, public dental health hygienist, firmly believes that these conversations around oral health education are an enormously important way to prevent the many cases of dental caries and decay that affect our young neighbors. With a background in education, theater, and dental hygiene, Tracy knew it would take more than assemblie with speeches, or workbooks and videos. She knew the best way to really engage and educate young children, she would need a new strategy. Tracy began to build. And build, and build, and craft, and spray, and glue, and cut, and shape, until she had an entire cast of characters that help her tell the story of oral health. Mr. Tooth, Mr. Plaque, the Big Brusher- a lively cast soon lined the floor of classrooms and gymnasiums across Northern Kentucky. As a team of one, Tracy has been able to reach nearly 4,400 students in 27 schools in the last school year alone. While she is happy wit her work, she is not willing to stop until she has reached as many children as possible. Each school appearance requires hours of preparation, and she does not currently charge a fee for her educational program, or for the dental supplies bags she puts together for each child. The most common feedback she hears from adults? "I wish there was something like this when I was young," and "I learned a lot, too!" These adults have seen what happens to a child's school attendance and health when they are suffering from oral health issues. These adults know that education makes an enormous difference. Take a look at some of the fun photos and videos of the Plan Ahead Smiles program, and consider Tracy's work, as a staff of one, giving her time and talent to ensure healthy smiles for all. Tracy leaves us with a fina thought: Let your smile affect the world, don't let the world affect your smile!

What is Plan Ahead Smiles Program?



Plan Ahead Smiles Program is an interactive Oral Health Science Course in the school setting that makes learning The biology of the mouth fun!





Requests for this fully-funded program have made it double in size yearly over the last 3 years. In 2016 PASP became a nonprofit 401-c 3 corporation. It now reaches into more than 18 counties. This is made possible by many sponsors, especially Delta Dental Of Kentucky. As part of the Kentucky Oral Health Coalition, our goal is to reach as many as possible with a clear, understandable message of how Oral Health for a lifetime can

be achieved, thus "Plan Ahead Smiles". We connect families to our tutorials and teachings through the website planaheadsmilesprogram.org Each child gets a dental care supply bag and a connection postcard for their parents. PASP inspires children in Kentucky through visualization of scientific principles that govern oral health that many would only learn in dental school. What if every Kentucky child could go to dental school....at least for one hour?

What is Taught?



Gum Disease

With lipstick playing the blood of gingivitis, the process of inflammation dissolving the jaw bones gradually becomes very simple. The process and prevention of this very common oral health issue are well explained. Living bacteria make acid that dissolves bone. Simple,

Cavity Prevention This same process of how acid dissolves bone now transitions to the tooth, which is a bone. The challenge to protect their new grandma/grandpa teeth is made. In the future how

will they protect their own new teeth? Kids meet plaque monster and learn how to kill him!



Sealants How do these protective covers placed on their teeth prevent a cavity? What can we do to keep them for a long time? Sealants Protection!

Fluoride- How does it help our teeth? What are the ways we can use fluoride to harden our teeth?

Nutrition How can what we eat and drink create the acid that gets on our teeth, causing cavities. Good food keep us healthier, gums, teeth and body!





Smoking Prevention- How can we plar on keeping our smiles healthy without the explanation of how smoking impact oral health?



Dental Visits We teach why going to the dentist twice a year is important, what to expect and how going to the dentist can be fun. We encourage fun dental careers.

How Do I Set Up Our School?

Delta Dental has made it possible to invite this program to schools in Kentucky. In cooperation with the Northern Kentucky Health Department, we hope to reach as many schools as possible. The program is approximately 50 minutes long and is held in a Gymnasium, cafeteria or Large Library area. We now focus on 1st and 3rd grades so that the students get the scientific concepts twice- two years apart. 1st and 3rd grades have separate assemblies, except in some small schools.

The program can be coordinated by a school nurse, curriculum director, Principal or family recourse leader. By emailing Tracy Laughner RDH at planaheadsmilesprogram@gmail.com, a time and day can be scheduled. We need to know how many children will need dental supply bags. We let the teachers pick program participants and always are respectful to have permission for any pictures. Always put your school name on the subject line of the email correspondence.
