WellSat Assessment

- We currently use the KSBA wellness policy.
- Compared to the model policy though it meets requirements this one is weak in many areas.
- There are 2 federal requirements that the current policy does not cover, however we are doing them. (Providing free drinking water and protecting the privacy of students). These need to be added to the policy.
