5. ORDINANCES - 2ND READING

5.A. Ordinance 36-2019 entitled AN ORDINANCE CLOSING AND ABANDONING A PORTION OF AN ALLEY RIGHT-OF-WAY AT THE REAR OF 418 AND 424 BOLIVAR STREETS IN THE CITY OF OWENSBORO, KENTUCKY, AT THE REQUEST OF STS. JOSEPH & PAUL CATHOLIC CHURCH, was approved 5-0 on motion of Mayor Watson with a second from Commissioner Conder.

Sts. Joseph & Paul Catholic Church has petitioned the City to close and abandon a 10 foot wide alley right-of-way at the rear of 418 and 424 Bolivar Streets. Sts. Joseph & Paul Catholic Church is the owner of the only adjoining lots.

5.B. Ordinance 37-2019 entitled AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND UPDATING SECTIONS 5-127, 5-129, 5-130, 5-136, AND 5-137 OF THE PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE AS CODIFIED IN CHAPTER 5, ARTICLE IV, DIVISION 1 OF THE OWENSBORO MUNICIPAL CODE, was unanimously approved by motion of Mayor Watson and seconded by Commissioner Smith-Wright.

The Property Maintenance Code is codified in Chapter 5, Article IV, Division 1 of the Owensboro Municipal Code. The Code has had few amendments since its enactment in 2011 and it is necessary to amend certain sections to better serve the citizens of the City.

6. ORDINANCES – 1ST READING

6.A. Ordinance 1-2020 entitled AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TO THE CITY OF OWENSBORO CERTAIN UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY IN THE COUNTY OF DAVIESS ADJOINING THE PRESENT BOUNDARY LINE OF THE CITY, BEING PROPERTY OWNED BY PROFESSIONAL PROPERTIES & CONSTRUCTION, LLC & THE OFFICES CREEKSIDE PROPERTIES LOCATED AT 1030 BURLEW BOULEVARD (PROPERTY ASSOCIATED WITH BUILDING "A"), CONTAINING 0.408 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, was introduced and publicly read on first reading.

An Ordinance annexing the property located at 1030 Burlew Boulevard (Property associated with Building "A"), containing 0.408 acres. There will be an annexation incentive agreement for the property. City Manager Pagan explained the annexation included a building that had previously been bisected by a prior annexation.

6.B. Ordinance 2-2020 entitled AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TO THE CITY OF OWENSBORO CERTAIN UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY IN THE COUNTY OF DAVIESS ADJOINING THE PRESENT BOUNDARY LINE OF THE CITY, BEING PROPERTY OWNED BY JED RENTALS, LLC, LOCATED AT 3509 FAIRVIEW DRIVE, CONTAINING 3.461 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, was introduced and publicly read on first reading.

An Ordinance annexing the property located at 3509 Fairview Drive, containing 3.461 acres. There will be an annexation incentive agreement for the property. City Manager Pagan explained the property includes an apartment complex with thirty (30) units.
