- All students in grades kindergarten through sixth grade are working on their winter MAP benchmarking tests. The students are challenged to meet their individual MAP goals and all students are working hard to do their best on these tests. Teachers and administrators will use this MAP data along with our Winter CASE assessment data to help determine individual student needs and to enhance our instructional practices.
- We held our 2nd Quarter Recognition Assemblies on Friday, January 10th. During our primary and intermediate assemblies, students were recognized in a multitude of different areas for their hard work: perfect attendance, sight word mastery (primary), meeting AR goals, Math Facts goals, and honor roll (intermediate) are just a few.
