1. Pursuant to KRS 156.060 (2) (a) and Owsley County School Board Policy 01.83 General Powers and Duties of the Board, the Owsley County Board of Education requests a waiver from Administrative Regulation 701 KAR 8:020 Section 3(4) (a) 1 requiring school boards to obtain additional in-service training on Charter School topics.

While Charter School Training would be beneficial for school districts who have received Charter School Applications, to date Owsley County School Board has not received such an application. Additional language may be added to the Kentucky Administrative Regulation to specify that "The authorizer, or its designee for charter authorizing, shall participate in annual in-service training once the school district contains a Charter School or has received a Charter School application."

The current requirement of twelve (12) hours of annual in-service training for local Board Members has added a financial burden to the district through providing training registration costs, travel reimbursements and lodging expenses for school board members. The additional required training hours have also placed a hardship on local elected school board members due to their time away from jobs and the resulting loss of income.

The Kentucky School Board Association provides multiple subject areas of training throughout the year that school board members are unable to take advantage of due to the Charter School requirement; such as Policy and Procedure, School Facilities, Construction/General Contracting, Liability & Insurance Requirements and Media/Community Relations. Expertise and knowledge in these subject areas would prove to be more valuable to the board member, as well as the school district.

Additionally, participation in the KSBA Academy of Studies has been eliminated because school board members are forced to take repeated sessions on specific topics and are not able to personalize training needs outside of required hours. Specifically, a school board member is not able to receive a well rounded curriculum, thereby impairing their ability to make effective decisions for students and staff.

The Owsley CountySchool Board of Education feels that the Kentucky Administrative Regulation pertaining to mandatory Charter School training for local School Board Members should be specific and applicable to school districts that contain Charter Schools or have received Charter School applications within their representative district.
