FACILITIES SHOWCASE - CROFTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Mr. Brad Hawkins, Chief Operations Officer and Trevor Herndon, Facilities Coordinator, gave the board a PowerPoint facilities showcase on Crofton Elementary School (a copy of which is attached to the minutes). Mr. Hawkins and Mr. Herndon reviewed facility rating, capacity, work needed and work completed. They also reviewed upcoming estimated replacement dates of Roof, HVAC and renovations.

SCORECARD UPDATE

Mary Ann Gemmill, Superintendent, began the presentation by stating that the District has updated their Scorecard based on the most recent survey results and each person would like to give their Scorecard update in their respective departments.

Laura Morris, Chief Administrative Officer, discussed her Scorecard updates in the Staff and Student Support Services area. Susie Hartline, Director of Strategic Planning, Federal Programs, and Grant Development, discussed her Scorecard updates in the Community Partnerships area.

Ms. Kim Stevenson, Director of Alternative Programs and Melanie Barrett, Director of Pupil Personnel, presented a PowerPoint Update on District Discipline for the first semester of the 2019-2020 school year (a copy of which is attached.) Ms. Stevenson compared discipline data from 2014 to present.

DRAFT BUDGET UPDATE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020-2021

Ms. Mary Ann Gemmill, Superintendent and Jessica Darnell, Director of Business, provided the following information in a power-point presentation for the Board Members on the Draft Budget for Fiscal Year 2020-2021. Ms. Gemmill states that Senate Bill 1 has created \$1.3 million dollars in unfunded mandates for CCPS and they will continue to monitor new legislation as it is passed.
