- II. Opening Business
 - a. Approval of the Agenda Cole/Tackett
 - b. Reading of the Minutes
 - c. Good News Report APEX Fundraiser Results very happy with the results of the fundraiser. The student council is currently working on suggestions for playground equipment some suggestions discussed were basketball court, soccer goals, swings, shaded area, kickball field. The suggestions of the student council meeting will be reviewed after they are presented.
 - d. Public Comment Ms. Sweazy spoke concerning the survey for professional development through Google docs. The Instructional Practices Committee is currently working to work through some problems with the survey. They should have it ready to go soon.
- III. Student Achievement Report/Data
 - a. Field Tests Practice Feb. 24 It was reported by Mr. Rucker that the field test practice went pretty well. He reported that 95% went without a hitch, there were some bugs on Pearson's side. Ms. Heiss is working with Pearson to remedy the problems. We were pleased with technology. There were about 21 students absent that needed to take the make-up test.

- V. Budget Report Treasurer's Report
 - a. Treasurer's Report was reviewed and technology was discussed we will re-evaluate at the end of the year.
- VI. New Business
 - a. FRYSC Report Lindsey Cain presented her annual FRYSC report and FRYSC SBDM/Principal Agreement. Motion to adopt the SBDM/Principal Agreement as read: Little/Cole; motion approved.

- b. PASS Students Policy & Procedures; estimate of students Council members discussed what the policies and procedures were for moving students into the PASS program. Questions were asked about if both schools were following the procedures. Number of students and staff in the program were discussed and if we had approximate numbers for next year, as well.
- c. Estimated class size & number of classrooms for 20/21: Mr. Rucker presented the Teacher Allocation Forecast for 20/21. Due to our student percentages in intermediate, we do not qualify for 24 teachers next year. We are looking at losing one teaching position. Possible scenarios were given to the Council. After reviewing the information, the Council agreed that the best scenario would be to move to 3 classrooms in 3rd grade where we have the lowest number of students enrolled which is currently at 86 students/28 per classroom. If we had 3 classrooms in 4th or 5th grade we would be looking at 31-33 students per classroom. We would need an additional 20 students enrolled in 4th & 5th grade to qualify for another classroom teacher.
- d. Math program Bridges Intervention samples are in the front office, ready to disperse and be reviewed by teachers. This program would be implemented for Tier 2 Math intervention, if we are interested.
