Dual Credit

Through our partnership with Hazard Community and Technical College and Morehead State University, qualifying Breathitt High School juniors and seniors have the opportunity to earn college credits while completing their high school requirements.

Dual Credit Benefits:

- Provides a step ahead into college life and the skills needed to succeed.
- Lowers the overall cost of a college education while reducing the time it takes to complete your college degree.
- Enhances college and career readiness.

Costs:

Hazard Community & Technical College-

- All Dual Credit Students will be assessed a tuition cot of \$56.00 per credit hour (1/3 HCTC tuition rate).
- Students are eligible for two Kentucky Dual Credit Scholarships through KHEAA.

Morehead State University-

All MSU classes taught on our campus are no charge to our students.

Morehead State University is pleased to partner with Breathitt County High School as part of our dual credit Eagle Scholars Program. The courses taught at BCHS as well as Breathitt Area Technology Center are taught by high school that have been evaluated and approved by the MSU academic departments. These courses are taught at the college level and students will have grades captured on their Morehead State University transcript that can be used for college credit at MSU or other colleges and universities.

These dual credit courses are taught with additional academic rigor and will require extra work and effort to secure your desired grade. These courses are taught with university and academic departmental standards are offered to insure students will have a successful transition from BCHS to college.

These courses are billed at the KY Dual Credit Scholarship rate. BCHS juniors and seniors receive 2 scholarships during their high school career. Upon receipt of these 2 scholarships, MSU will allow students to take any additional MSU dual credit course with no additional tuition charged. You really can take all MSU dual credit courses at no out of pocket costs (for tuition) with the KY Dual Credit Scholarship Program.

Dual Credit Scholarship

The Dual Credit Scholarship provides assistance for Kentucky high school students who are taking dual credit classes at a participating Kentucky college or university. Eligible students may receive scholarships for up to two classes.

Students Must:

- Be enrolled in a Kentucky public or private high school, or Kentucky home school, in grades 11 or 12; and
- Be enrolled, or approved for enrollment, in an approved dual credit class at a participating Kentucky college or university; and
- Complete a 30-minute college success counseling session each year a scholarship is awarded.

How do you Apply?

Your school will send your information to KHEAA to apply on your behalf. KHEAA will contact you via your school email after your information is received and ask that you sign into your MyKHEAA account at www.kheaa.com to select your desired college for the scholarship award.

Next Generation Academy

Breathitt High School's Next Generation Academy is an opportunity for students to acquire their high school diploma as well as an associates degree (AA and/or AS). Selection shall be based on an application process heavily weighted on academic performance, ACT scores and attendance. Students may complete the application process for Next Gen during the Spring of their sophomore year or the fall of their junior year. Applications shall be scored by a district committee comprised of Breathitt County Schools' employees on the following criteria:

GPA (Cum Unweighted)	30
Attendance (96% min)	20

1st Gen College Student	5

*The following minimum ACT state benchmark is required:

English-18, Mathematics-19, Reading- 20 In addition, an ACT composite of 18 meets the minimum requirement.

Costs:

- The Next Generation Academy is free to student who qualify and maintain satisfactory progress (Cumulative semester GPA 3.0).
- Parents shall be responsible for the cost of all text books/ebooks.
- Academy or drops a class, the student parent or guardian shall be responsible for the reimbursement of tuition and any other fees associated with the student withdrawal.

Why Next Gen?

College is expensive! Adding tuition costs, room and board, and transportation together results in a yearly cost of:

\$9,289 for public college students living at home

\$13,585 for public college students living off-campus without family

Four year college programs typically require 120 credits. The more credits you take through dual enrollment, the fewer you'll need to complete after high school to earn a college degree. Finally, College classes are a fast-paced, rigorous alternative to traditional high school courses.
