

**A Resolution of the Livingston County, Kentucky Board of Education**

**Regarding Certified Evaluations During the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) Health Emergency**

**WHEREAS**, on March 6, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-215, declaring a state of emergency throughout Kentucky pursuant to his power under the Kentucky Constitution and KRS Chapter 39A regarding the threats to public health presented by the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, the Kentucky Department of Education, and the Governor have each recommended the cessation of in-person classes until April 20, 2020 and advised that all Kentuckians practice “social distancing” during the state of emergency, including but not limited to keeping a distance of at least six (6) feet between individuals and the cancellation of large “community gatherings;” and;

**WHEREAS**, Board Policy 03.18 requires a system to evaluate all certified employees; and;

**WHEREAS**, the Livingston County Schools Certified Personnel Evaluation Plan cannot be fully implemented under the current conditions;

**NOW, THEREFORE: Be it resolved by the Livingston County, Kentucky Board of Education:**

- 1 Any provisions of the Certified Evaluation Plan that cannot realistically or reasonably be adhered to during the current state of emergency shall be waived, including but not limited to, the holding of pre-conferences for classroom observations, formal full and mini classroom observations, and site visits.
- 2 In the case of any appeal of a summative evaluation, the appeals process of the Livingston County Schools Certified Evaluation Plan shall be implemented.
