

**ORDINANCE NO \_\_\_\_\_:2020**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF MOREHEAD, KENTUCKY  
CODE OF ORDINANCES, TITLE 9, GENERAL REGULATIONS,  
CHAPTER 95, RECREATION REGULATIONS SECTION 95.01 HOURS OF  
OPERATION TO AMEND THE TIMES THAT RODBURN HOLLOW PARK  
SHALL BE OPEN FOR PUBLIC USE

**WHEREAS**, at the requests of the citizens, the Board of City Council of the City of Morehead desires to amend the times that Rodburn Hollow Park is open to the public;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of City Council of the City of Morehead, Kentucky that Title 9 General Regulations, Chapter 95, Recreation Regulations, Section 95.01 shall be amended as follows:

**Section 95.01 HOURS OF OPERATION**

(1) The Don Greenhill City Park, including all baseball fields, skate park and picnic area, shall be opened to the public daily from 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., except for recreational sporting events approved by the City of Morehead Director of Recreation. The shelter areas shall be opened to the public during said times so long as said shelters have not been reserved for private use.

(2) Peggie's Place shall be opened to public use by reservation only during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

(3) Rodburn Hollow Park shall be opened to the public daily from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. during the months of March through October and 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. during the months of November through February. The shelters in said Park shall be opened to the public and for private use by reservation during said times.
