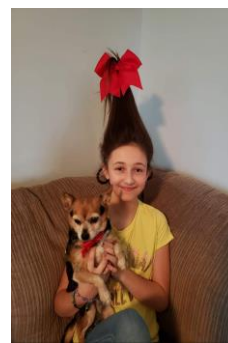

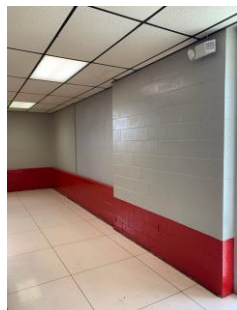
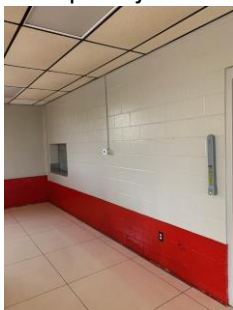
Mrs. Doyle has been using the Zoom platform to help her scholars keep in touch, and that is working out well.

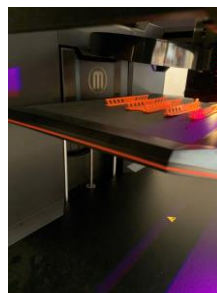

Big Smiles dentists visited SLES again during the week of March 9th-12th to provide dental care to many students.

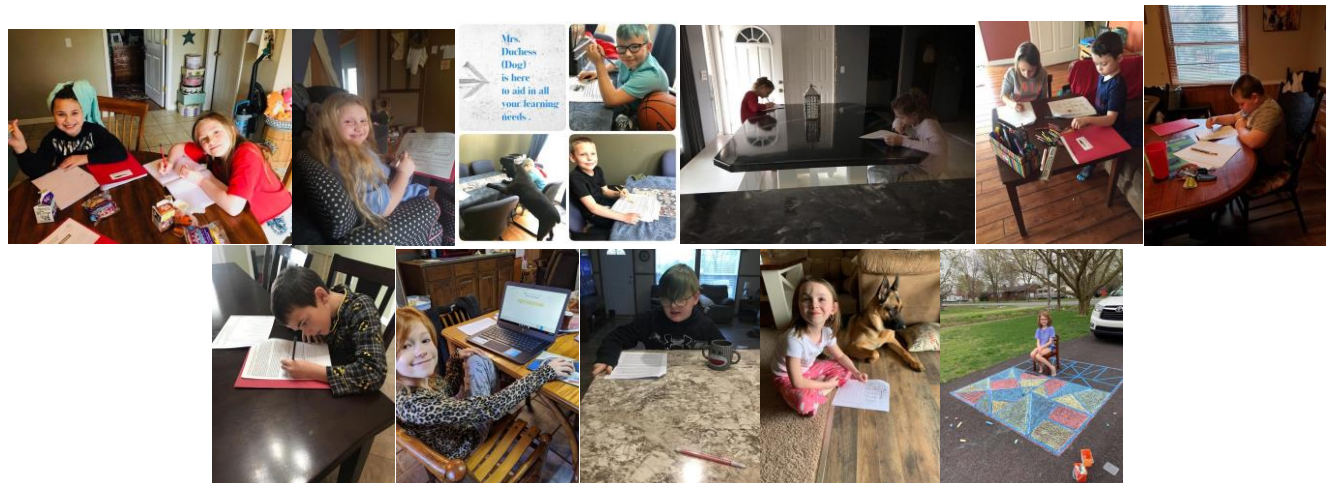
During the week of March 9th-12th, SLES students completed their third round of district common assessments.
