Minutes:

The King Middle School Site Based Council met on Wednesday, March 11, 2020 at 4:00 p.m. in the King Middle School media center.

The following council members were present for the meeting: Terry Gordon, John Ingram, Delora Severance, Shawn Markham, Mark Dunn, and Julie Peavler. Brian Pendygraft was also in attendance.

1. Opening Business
  - a. Agenda approval- The SBDM Council approved the March agenda by consensus.
  - b. February meeting minutes - The SBDM Council reviewed the February meeting minutes and they were approved by consensus.
  - c. Good news reports- Mrs. Markham stated that the GT field trip went well at the Norton Center. Mrs. Peavler was excited that spring was finally here. Mrs. Severance and Mr. Ingram stated that the year has gone well. Mr. Dunn seconded that and stated that all appeared to be in testing mode.
