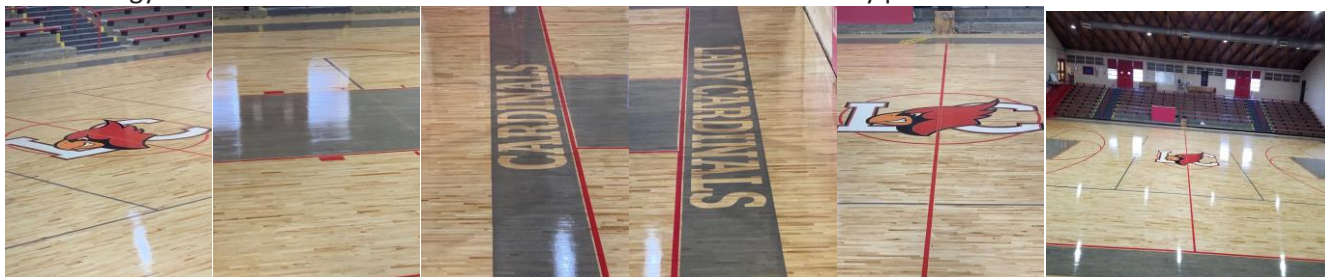
North Livingston

Average English for March 17.5 - Up 1.5 from October

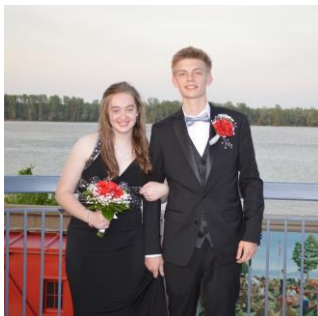
Average Reading for March 17.5 - Up .5 from October
