

SEC EVENT MANAGEMENT CONSIDERATIONS

(UPDATED JUNE 8, 2020)

The following is a prioritized list of post COVID-19 event management ideas and concepts for further evaluation developed by the SEC event managers. This list specifies items to consider for the development of consistent conference policies.

- 1. Social distancing plans for fans and attendance expectations [ID or S/L]
- 2. Entry and exit procedures for fans and media [ID]
- 3. Reducing number of media (including photographers) and their access to the field and postgame interviews [C]
- 4. Reducing non-essential invitations (e.g., bowl representatives) [C]
- 5. Distancing requirements between media members in the press box [C]
- 6. Require non-participants to wear masks [S/L; ID if S/L does not mandate]
- 7. Procedures for game officials and other essential personnel:
 - a) adopt medical policies (e.g., temperature checks, mandated self-reporting of illness) [C]
 - b) consider disinfectant/sanitization and social distancing procedures for the game officials locker room [C]
 - c) consider whether game officials still ride together to/from the game in the same vehicle [C]
 - d) other procedures as identified by the SEC Coordinator of Officials [C]
- 8. Revise alcohol policy to allow serving in plastic bottles/cans [C]
- 9. Eliminate visiting team band/spirit squads from attending (assists with reducing the number of staff and law enforcement who are devoted to support them) [C]
- 10. Reduce the number of tickets provided to the visiting team [C]
- 11. Consider restrictions on prospective student-athlete pre-game and post-game access to sidelines [C]
- 12. Eliminate the pre-game and post-game field access/credentials for non-essential people [C]
- 13. Reduce the number of people who attend 110-minute meeting and revise the format (e.g., virtual meeting the day prior) [C]
 - C = Conference Policy
 - ID = Institutional Decision
 - S/L = State or Local Government Decision
