- Expand knowledge to meet the unique needs of students
- Provide training on enhancing printable materials using items at home

Support for Special Education Students (ECE)



- Provide live interpreter support and create sign language
 layovers that are placed into videos and lessons
- Provide parent training on managing NTI
- Provide training to help parents visually and tactually enhance materials using items from around the home
- Schedule teacher virtual check-ins to introduce new material, review contents, and discuss expectations
- Assist parents on how to adapt and provide prompts

Breakfast and Lunch




- Served 1.7 million meals since March

Racial Equity


