- Students must complete a 30 minute college success counseling session with their high school counselor
- Students are responsible for any books or materials used in the courses



DUAL CREDIT
Memorandum of Agreement

Between

Campbellsville University

and

Bullitt County Public Schools

The purpose of this agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions required to award credit for Campbellsville University dual credit courses successfully completed by high school students attending a Bullitt County Public Schools (BCPS) site.

This agreement allows students to earn college credit for comparable high school coursework. Upon enrollment at Campbellsville University, a student who has successfully completed one or more dual credit courses will have the option of completing his/her college program in less time. This agreement supersedes any previous dual credit agreement established between Campbellsville University and Bullitt County Public Schools in the same content area. This agreement is exclusive to BCPS and Campbellsville University, and no assurance is given that courses awarded through this agreement will transfer to any other postsecondary institution.

Campbellsville University is listed as a partnering school in the KHEAA offered Dual Credit Scholarship program for the Academic Year 2020-2021. Tuition for a dual credit course is set by KRS 164.786 at 40% of the KCTCS credit hour rate, offering our courses at \$70 per credit hour. Students who have previously exhausted their scholarship through another offering, will be responsible for the cost of these courses should they decide to enroll with Campbellsville University. We will be sending out an invoice in October for the fall term and in March for the spring term to each family. Students are also responsible for any books or materials used in the course as demonstrated by the faculty member.

Financial responsibility for unsuccessful completion of either course (W/U) will remain with Campbellsville University. If a student drops this course, it will need to occur within the first full week of classes. Grading procedures will be reflected in the course syllabus.

Neither party shall discriminate against any student, instructor, employee or other person because of race, color, national origin, age, religion, marital or parental status, political affiliation or beliefs, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, veteran status, genetic information, disability or limitations related to pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions.

Per Federal guidelines, students with an Individual Education Plan will receive documented services from the high school when taking Dual Credit courses on the high school campus with a high school teacher. Students taking courses at Campbellsville University will be connected to the Accessibility Resource Center (ARC).
