




Average Daily Active Cases

The chart above illustrates the seven day average of the number of Daily Active COVID-19 cases as reported by the Bullitt County Health Department



Students/Staff in Isolation/Quarantine

The chart above illustrates the number of students (black line) and staff (gold line) that are in isolation or quarantine due to a positive COVID-19 test or a close exposure to a positive case as reported to BCPS Health Services



Average Daily Cases per 100k Population

- Critical (>25)
- Accelerated Spread (> 10 25)
- Community Spread (> 1 10)
- On Track (0 1)



September 28th: Pre K, Kindergarten, 1st, & 2nd grade

October 5th: 3rd, 4th, & 5th grades

October 20th: 6th & 9th grades

October 26th: 7th, 8th, 10th, 11th, 12th

Positives:

• Gradual approach allows for better management of protocols and procedures

Gets younger students and transition students back sooner

Negatives:

- Does not decrease class sizes.
- Remote Learning will continue for 4 weeks
