Consider/Approve District Instructional Dashboard with revised District Decision Matrix and corresponding testing plan

<u>APPLICABLE BOARD POLICY</u>: 01.11 – General Powers & Duties of the Board

#### **HISTORY/BACKGROUND:**

The Board previously approved the District Instructional Dashboard to return to in-person instruction. However, the Department of Public Health released a recommended dashboard for districts in the commonwealth to follow regarding in-person learning on 9/14/20. The district team reviewed the dashboard and made adaptations to meet the needs of the local district.

#### COVID-19 Testing Program

The Kenton County School District is implementing a COVID-19 testing program for school staff and students for the 2020-2021 school year when community transmission moves into the 25+ per 100,000 "Red Category". This program is designed to determine if the community transmission rate per 100,000 is having an impact on our local schools before making a determination to close the school district or individual schools to in-person learning. The local school matrix will be utilized for making decisions on closing schools.

The program will be implemented as follows:

- The program will be initiated "only' when community transmission moves into the "Red Category" of 25+ cases per 100,000
- The program will only test students in grades 2-12
- All staff and students will have the ability to "opt out" by completing the district "opt out" form.
- When community transmission moves into the "Red Category", each school site will test 10% of staff and students (selected randomly) Monday-Wednesday weekly.
- Results will be reviewed on Friday morning to make decisions about the district or individual schools for the following week.
- All cost associated with the testing will be paid by the district. The cost for testing is potentially reimbursable by FEMA and/or CARES funding.
- Also, 10% of athletes participating in sports identified by the National Federation of High School Sports (NFHS) and Kentucky High School Athletic Association (KHSAA) as moderate and high risk will be tested weekly to maintain continuity in sports activities when community transmission is in the "Red Category".
- Testing protocols will be developed with the selected testing company to ensure accuracy and consistency in our testing program.
- According to testing companies, the PCR test being utilized is 99.5% accurate.
- The test will be a "self-administered", however, district health staff will be trained and available to assist with all tests.
- Test samples will be sent directly to the lab and all results will be delivered to the district within 24 hours.
- Positive results will be shared with the local health department and the guidance from the department of public health will be followed.

While we understand that there may be conflicting information on testing asymptomatic individuals. The district believes that the implementation of a testing program when community transmission enters the "Red Category" enables the district to make informed decisions based on school district data regarding closing schools to in-person learning rather than simply closing all schools.
