C. Data Security and Breach Notification Best Practice

Enc. 5

In accordance with Board Policy 1.61 for Records Management, it is necessary to review Data Security and Breach Notification Best Practice Guidelines with staff each fiscal year and to report the status of the annual effort to the Board prior to August 31st.

In addition to the annual training requirement, it is further mandated that each school district implement best practice guidelines. Recommendation: It is recommended that the Board approve the 2016-17 Unaudited Annual Financial Report as presented.

C. Job Description - Revision - Support Operations Supervisor Enc. 21

The job description for the position of "Support Operations Supervisor" is currently paid on the classified grade 19 pay scale. It is recommended the level of pay be increased to grade 23 on the classified pay scale. This change in pay grade is equivalent to the pay for this position in previous years. The revised job description accurately reflects the level of pay commensurate with the responsibilities of managing the district's support operations staff, which includes the oversight of all plant managers, building supervisors and building support operation staff. This change would be effective beginning July 1, 2017.

<u>Recommendation:</u> It is recommended that the Board approve the job description revision for the position of Support Operations Supervisor and pay the current employee at the new pay scale beginning July 1, 2017.

D. Job Position - Addition - Human Resources Coordinator Enc. 22 Human Resources requests the addition of one Human Resources Coordinator (HRC)

effective immediately beginning with the 2017-18 fiscal year. The additional HRC will focus on the hiring, processing and servicing of classified staff, as well as assume the processing and management of worker's compensation, which is currently handled by the District's Safety Officer. If granted an additional HRC, worker's comp would

be assigned to the HR administrative assistant. This shift in duties will free up a substantial amount of the Safety Officer's time to focus on districtwide safety.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the Board approve the new position of Human Resources Coordinator.

E. Job Position – New – Special Education Consultant 210 days Enc. 23

A request is being made to create an additional special education consultant position for the district with a 210 day contract and revised responsibilities. Currently we have two special educations consultants serving our special education population. Data in the areas of gap closure and behavioral incidents support the need for additional assistance for our schools and our students with disabilities. Additionally, a focus of closing gaps thorough RTI and other systemic approaches will occur during the 2017-2018 school year and beyond. The Leadership Cabinet reviewed and supported the recommendation.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the Board approve the new position of Special Education Consultant with a 210 day contract.

F. Job Positions – Abolish – Deputy Superintendents (2)

During the 2016-2017 school year, our school district central office had two additional senior level administrative positions. (Assistant Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent) Within the last few months, the board changed the Assistant Superintendent position to a Deputy Superintendent position which established two Deputy Superintendent positions for the district. After review and discussions with our leadership cabinet, the two Deputy positions are not needed at this time. The funding saved by the elimination of these positions will fund the requested two additional positions at CO to support building capacity and assisting schools. Additionally, it is estimated that this will result in an additional savings of approximately \$150,000 annually.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the Board abolish the two Deputy Superintendent positions.

G. Miscellaneous Positions – New -2017-2018 Salary Schedule

Enc. 24

The Health Services Department is requesting adding a pay for additional hours for RN Nursing staff who do trainings and other required work beyond their normal workday. Based on the beginning pay of a Certified Nurse zero hours, we are recommending \$30 per hour for RN additional hours.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the Board approve the \$30 per hour rate for additional hours worked for RN nursing staff who work beyond or in addition to their normal workday.

H. Contract Approval – PCA Architecture Scott High School Renovation Phase IV

The Kenton County School District awarded a Request for Proposal to PCA Architecture for the development and implementation of a master renovation plan for Scott High School. Three phases of construction have been completed to date. The

Kentucky Department of Education requires a separate AIA contract to be executed for each individual phase of construction.

The fee for this work is based upon the final construction bid award and in accordance with the guidelines established by the Kentucky Department of Education.

<u>Recommendation:</u> It is recommended that the Board approve the AIA contract with PCA Architecture for the Phase IV renovation at Scott High School contingent on KDE approval.

I. Contract Approval – PCA Architecture Hinsdale Secure Vestibule Entrance The Kenton County School District previously awarded a Request for Proposal to PCA Architecture for the design of secure vestibules to be constructed at eight schools. New entrances have been constructed at Piner Elementary, Summit View Elementary, and Summit View Middle. Ft. Wright Elementary is now under construction. Kentucky Department of Education requires an AIA contract to be executed for each individual phase of construction for Secure Vestibule Entrances. The scope of work involves the construction of a new secure vestibule entrance and administrative suite. The construction of three new classrooms as part of the new entrance will allow the removal of all mobile classrooms located on the school site.

The fee for this work is based upon the final construction bid award and in accordance with the guidelines established by the Kentucky Department of Education.

<u>Recommendation:</u> It is recommended that the Board approve the AIA contract with PCA Architecture for the R.C. Hinsdale Elementary Secure Vestibule Entrance contingent on KDE approval.

J. Contract Approval – PCA Architecture Demolition of former Twenhofel Middle School and Excavation/Grading

The scope of work involves the removal of all environmental materials and complete demolition of the former Twenhofel Middle School. The area will be graded and filled to accommodate parking and site circulation between the current bus parking and staff parking. Electric service and data service currently running through the former school will be removed and refed to accommodate existing bus operations. New asphalt and site lighting will be installed. Design work will be performed by Bayer & Becker Engineers, CMTA Engineers, and Air Source Technologies. PCA Architecture will be responsible for preparation of the bidding documents. All of this work will be considered phase I and setup a future phase to construct a new garage, transportation office, and maintenance operations facility.

The fee for this work is based upon the final construction bid award and in accordance with the guidelines established by the Kentucky Department of Education.

<u>Recommendation:</u> It is recommended that the Board approve the AIA contract with PCA Architecture for the demolition of the former Twenhofel Middle School and excavation/grading project contingent on KDE approval.

K. Change Order No. 9 – Monarch Construction – Ft. Wright Elementary School Renovation – BG 16-007 Enc. 25

This is the ninth change order of the Ft. Wright Elementary School Renovation – BG 16-007 associated with Monarch Construction Company. The original contract with the Ft. Wright Elementary School Renovation is \$13,314,712.19. This change order of \$329,475 with previous change orders of \$254,300 makes the new contract sum \$13,898,487.19.

Item #1 – Provide materials and labor to rehabilitate and restore existing low slope built-up roof areas for the 1994 building addition. Replace all areas of wet insulation and provide new flashing at all plumbing penetrations. Reseal all roof drains, provide new metal expansion joints, and install new roof edges. Provide new reflective aggregate surfaces and new walk pads.

Division 02: Existing Conditions

02.01: 2017.07.10 – The sewage ejector pit in the basement had been removed and the subgrade had been filled. The plumber was actively working on the underslab sanitary line which would finalize connection of the existing plumbing to the new gravity main.

02.02: 2017.07.13 – The demolition subcontractor was actively removing remaining interior masonry walls at the former admin area.

02.03: 2017.07.13 – The temporary corridor partition which will serve as the student entrance from the bus loop had been framed and boarded.

Division 03: Concrete

03.01: 2017.06.29 – Underpinning at the old cafeteria foundation was underway. Reinforcing was in place and concrete trucks were cycling through the site. Piers nearby had recently been poured.
03.02: 2017.07.13 – The ICF subcontractor was on-site and installing forms at the new entrance / admin area. A problem area was identified where the formwork was installed incorrectly relative to an existing foundation. The contractor was advised to correct. No concrete had been placed at that time.
03.03: 2017.07.13 – Concrete finishers were actively finishing floor patches around interior piers in Phase 2 classrooms.



Division 09: Finishes

09.01: 2017.06.29 – Cafeteria linoleum flooring was complete, including the stage. The gym corridor was 50% complete. Phase 1B classrooms were 40% complete. Protection was in place in classrooms where overhead work was occurring.



Kenton County School District (DRAFT) Data Security and Breach Notification Guidebook As of August 7, 2017

Board Policy – Records Management 1.61

The Kenton County School District Administration shall acknowledge to the Board of Education in a public meeting prior to August 31st of each year that the District has reviewed the Data Security and Breach Notification Best Practice Guide and implemented best practices that meet the needs for reasonable security protection over personal information.

<u>Personal Information</u> is defined as an individual's first and last name or first initial and last name; personal mark; or unique biometric or genetic print or image, along with any of the following data elements:

- Account number, credit or debit card number, that, in combination with any required security code, access code, or password would permit access to an account;
- Social Security number;
- Taxpayer identification number that incorporates a Social Security number;
- Driver's license number, state identification card number, or other individual identification number issued by any agency;
- Passport number or other identification number issued by the United States government; or
- Individually identifiable health information as defined in 45 C.F.R. sec. 160.103
 (Appendix A) except for education records covered by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, as amended, 20 U.S.C. sec. 1232g. (Appendix B)

<u>Security Breach</u> is defined as an unauthorized acquisition, distribution, disclosure, destruction, manipulation, or release of unencrypted or unredacted records or data that compromises or is reasonably believed to compromise the security, confidentiality, or integrity of personal information and results in the likelihood of harm to one or more individuals; or the release of encrypted records along with the key or process necessary to unencrypt the records.

KRS 61.931 – House Bill 5

Procedures and practices to safeguard against security breaches must be implemented by any entity that maintains or possesses personal information in accordance with applicable KRS and federal laws.

For any contracts involving personal information that are entered into or amended after January 1, 2015, specific language requiring protection of the data must be included. The following Memorandum of Understanding was developed by the Kenton County School District legal counsel and shall be utilized with all software purchases:

The following guidelines were prepared around three major areas of consideration as identified by the Kentucky Department of Education:

- Protection and Prevention
- Preparation for Notification
- Notification

Protection and Prevention

All District employees are charged with protecting the confidentiality of personal information whether it pertains to customers, employees, parents, or students. The basic premise is to remain vigilant in the safekeeping of all paper records and all electronic records. Employees are encouraged to collect the minimum amount of personal information necessary to accomplish the given task and retain the information for the minimum time required by law.

The following Kenton County School District departments are identified and charged with the use, maintenance, and safeguard of records which contain personal and confidential information:

- Personnel
- Student Support Services
- Finance
- Technology
- Special Education
- Preschool
- Food Service
- Transportation
- Support Operations
- School Level Office Staff
- Nursing Services

There are many departments and employees that come into contact with and use information that can be considered personal and confidential. As such, all district employees will be provided a brief overview and basic training in order to strengthen our coverage and safeguard the protection of restricted personal records from unauthorized personnel.

Each department shall inventory all records which contain very personal and restricted information which must be considered for appropriate protection. These records shall be reviewed periodically (annually at a minimum) in order to determine the rights and privileges of district staff that have primary responsibility to utilize the restricted personal information. More importantly, the district staff charged with maintaining the records shall adhere to strict guidelines which are designed to protect the restricted information reflected in the documents.

The following guidelines are to be utilized by all district staff responsible for the safeguarding of personal and restricted information:

- Maintain an inventory of all electronic and paper records that contain personal information
- Classify information contained in all restricted records according to sensitivity and level of risk if that information was accidentally or intentionally accessed by anyone without a need to know
- Strictly adhere to the records retention requirements for all sensitive records
- Supervisors shall annually assess the access rights afforded to district staff as it pertains to restricted files and data bases
- Whenever practical, all high-risk information shall use data encryption to protect the sensitive files in combination with host protection and access control
- Remove rights and access privileges immediately upon severance of employment for employees that have the responsibility to use and maintain sensitive files; retrieve all keys and building access control devices; remove all staff from security alarm code systems
- All employees shall have an annual awareness training regarding the importance of protecting and safeguarding restricted personal information contained in paper files and electronic data bases; the annual training shall also include a comprehensive review of Data Security and Breach Notification Best Practice Guide.
- All employees shall review the following awareness training videos located on the Safe Schools Training Site:
 - Cybersecurity Overview
 - Protection Against Malware
 - FERPA: Confidentiality of Records
- Use strong passwords or pass phrases and change them frequently
- Keep a password, PIN, or pass code on all devices including laptops, tablets, and smart phones
- Require all contract vendors that utilize personal information on behalf of the school district to sign and adhere to the guidelines established in the District Memorandum of Understanding; all MOU's must be maintained and renewed annually
- Each district staff member that is charged with the maintenance or access to personal restricted information shall adhere to appropriate office maintenance requirements designed to protect access to confidential records throughout the course of the work day and after work hours
 - Only print files or records that contain restricted personal information if necessary
 - Never leave restricted files on common space printers or copiers

- Never leave restricted files on desk top computer screens or printed files laying on the desk surfaces when you are away from the work space
- File all confidential information in securely fastened spaces when not in use
- Properly manage and control all confidential conversations
- Pay attention to confidential information being displayed on monitors in an open setting
- Establish language for solicitation of Request for Proposals that reflects the desired restrictions and controls necessary to safeguard personal restricted information to be utilized as part of the third-party work

Preparation for Notification of Affected Individuals

In the event there is a suspect data breach, the Kenton County School District will initiate the appropriate response plan. The Preparation for Notification of Affected Individuals was prepared using elements from the Best Practice Guide and pertinent data breach legislation. The Director of Technology shall be the Lead agent for the District and assume responsibility for the coordination of all internal investigation and notification procedures. The process for investigating a potential data breach is outlined in the following procedures:

- 1) The <u>lead staff member</u> charged with managing the breach of data security process shall be Chris Setters (Director of Technology).
- 2) The lead staff member shall immediately notify the Superintendent of Schools regarding any data breach incident.
- 3) The Superintendent of Schools shall notify District legal counsel regarding any data breach incidents.
- 4) The lead staff member shall engage the District Safety and Security Officer to assist with the investigation.
- 5) The lead staff member shall work with the departmental supervisor to ascertain the scope of the data breach as well as the schedule of affected individuals for the notification process.
- 6) Notification to affected individuals whose unencrypted personal information have been, or are reasonably believed to have been, acquired by an unauthorized person shall be prepared and disseminated within 35 days in accordance with House Bill 5. A draft notification letter to individuals is found in Appendix D.
- 7) Outside law enforcement agencies with expertise in investigating crimes that involve technology shall be contacted for advice and assistance with any data breach incidents. Identify any and all agencies that may be of assistance with an investigation and secure contact information in the case of a data breach incident.
- 8) Immediately assess and prepare strategies to contain, control, and correct any data security breach incidents. Document any issues discovered and response actions taken.
- 9) Perform a thorough review of the actions and flaws with the District data security platform leading up to the data breach. Make any necessary adjustments to the structure in order to prevent future incidents.
- 10) Consider the use of a Cyber Resilience Review to evaluate the operational resilience and cyber-security practices.

Notification

As of January 1, 2015, Kentucky requires notification of suspected or confirmed data breaches. KRS 61.931, ET SEQ. (HB 5), Kentucky School Districts are required to notify both the individual of a breach and various state officials. House Bill 5 addresses the safety and security for personal information held by public agencies and requires public agencies and nonaffiliated third parties to implement, maintain, and update security procedures and practices, including taking any appropriate corrective action to safeguard against security breaches.

House Bill 232 requires consumer notification when a private party data breach reveals personally identifiable information. This bill also requires cloud computing service providers contracting with educational institutions to maintain security of student data. The District Technology Coordinator shall assume responsibility for approving and finalizing all cloud based service provider agreements.

The District Technology coordinator shall utilize the following forms developed by the Commonwealth Office of Technology for use in the event of a breach or a suspected breach of data.

- Data Breach Notification Form FAC-001 See Appendix E
- Delay of Notification Form FAC-002 See Appendix F

The notification requirements are designed to alert individuals of such data breaches and provide those affected individuals with an opportunity to take appropriate actions to mitigate the personal damage from potential identity theft or other harm. The following guidelines were established by the Kentucky Data Breach legislation:

- Prepare a description of the categories of information that were subject to the security breach, including elements of personal information that were believed to be acquired;
- Contact information for the notifying agency, including the address, telephone number;
- A description of the general acts of the agency, excluding disclosure of defenses used for protection of information from the following sources about steps the individual may take to avoid identity theft, for:
 - The major consumer credit reporting agencies;

- The Federal Trade Commission; and
- The Office of the Kentucky Attorney General

The data breach legislation that went into effect in January 2015, each District has a total of 35 days from the time of their formal notification of agency contacts to notify all individuals impacted by the security breach. If the internal investigation leads to a reasonable conclusion that an unauthorized person through criminal activity may be involved in the data breach then the local law enforcement should be notified.

The appropriate State staff should be notified within 48 Hours if the investigation finds that the misuse of personal information has occurred or is likely to occur. The length of the investigation is not established by this bill and will vary with each incident.

Within 72 hours of a suspected of confirmed breach, notification shall be sent utilizing form FAC-001 to KDEDataBreachNotification@Education.ky.gov and to the following agencies as required by KRS 61.933:

- Attorney General's Office
- Auditor of Public Accounts
- Finance and Administration Cabinet
- Kentucky State Police
- Kentucky Department of Library and Archives
- Commonwealth Office of Technology

The Department of Data Breach Notification at the Kentucky Department of Education will provide the most current contact information for each State agency representative. If the investigation involves law enforcement officials and prevents the full disclosure of information to the Department, then form FAC-002 shall be utilized as required by KRS 61.933. The investigation shall be conducted in a reasonable and prompt manner in order to determine whether the security breach resulted in or is likely to result in the misuse of personal information

Except as otherwise provided, the following definitions apply to this subchapter:

Act means the Social Security Act. Administrative simplification provision

- (3) Sections 13400-13424 of Public Law 111-5; or

- ANSI stands for the American National Standards Institute.

Business associate: (1) Except as provided in paragraph (4) of this definition, business associate means, with respect to a covered entity, a person who:

(i) On behalf of such covered entity or of an organized health care arrangement (as defined in this section) in which the covered entity participates, but other than in the capacity of a member of the workforce of such covered entity or arrangement, creates, receives, maintains, or transmits protected health information for a function or activity regulated by this subchapter, including claims processing or administration, data analysis, processing or administration, utilization review, quality assurance, patient safety activities listed at 42 CFR 3.20, billing, benefit management, practice management, and repricing; or

- (ii) Provides, other than in the capacity of a member of the workforce of such covered entity, legal, actuarial, accounting, consulting, data aggregation (as defined in § 164.501 of this subchapter), management, administrative, accreditation, or financial services to or for such covered entity, or to or for an organized health care arrangement in which the covered entity participates, where the provision of the service involves the disclosure of protected health information from such covered entity or arrangement, or from another business associate of such covered entity or arrangement, to the person.
- (2) A covered entity may be a business associate of another covered enti-
- (3) Business associate includes:
- (i) A Health Information Organization, E-prescribing Gateway, or other person that provides data transmission services with respect to protected health information to a covered entity and that requires access on a routine basis to such protected health informa-
- (ii) A person that offers a personal health record to one or more individuals on behalf of a covered entity.
- (iii) A subcontractor that creates, receives, maintains, or transmits protected health information on behalf of the business associate.
- (4) Business associate does not include:
- (i) A health care provider, with respect to disclosures by a covered entity to the health care provider concerning the treatment of the individual.
- (ii) A plan sponsor, with respect to disclosures by a group health plan (or by a health insurance issuer or HMO with respect to a group health plan) to the plan sponsor, to the extent that the requirements of §164.504(f) of this subchapter apply and are met.
- (iii) A government agency, with respect to determining eligibility for, or enrollment in, a government health plan that provides public benefits and is administered by another government agency, or collecting protected health information for such purposes, to the

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extent such activities are authorized by law.

(iv) A covered entity participating in an organized health care arrangement that performs a function or activity as described by paragraph (1)(i) of this definition for or on behalf of such organized health care arrangement, or that provides a service as described in paragraph (1)(ii) of this definition to or for such organized health care arrangement by virtue of such activities or services.

Civil money penalty or penalty means the amount determined under \$160.404 of this part and includes the plural of these terms.

CMS stands for Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services within the Department of Health and Human Services.

Compliance date means the date by which a covered entity or business associate must comply with a standard, implementation specification, requirement, or modification adopted under this subchapter.

Covered entity means:

- (1) A health plan.
- (2) A health care clearinghouse. (3) A health care provider who trans-
- (3) A health care provider who transmits any health information in electronic form in connection with a transaction covered by this subchapter.

Disclosure means the release, transfer, provision of access to, or divulging in any manner of information outside the entity holding the information.

EIN stands for the employer identification number assigned by the Internal Revenue Service, U.S. Department of the Treasury. The EIN is the taxpayer identifying number of an individual or other entity (whether or not an employer) assigned under one of the following:

(1) 26 U.S.C. 6011(b), which is the portion of the Internal Revenue Code dealing with identifying the taxpayer in tax returns and statements, or corresponding provisions of prior law.

(2) 26 U.S.C. 6109, which is the portion of the Internal Revenue Code dealing with identifying numbers in tax returns, statements, and other required documents.

Electronic media means:

(1) Electronic storage material on which data is or may be recorded electronically, including, for example, devices in computers (hard drives) and any removable/transportable digital memory medium, such as magnetic tape or disk, optical disk, or digital memory card;

(2) Transmission media used to exchange information already in electronic storage media. Transmission media include, for example, the Internet, extranet or intranet, leased lines, dial-up lines, private networks, and the physical movement of removable/transportable electronic storage media. Certain transmissions, including of paper, via facsimile, and of voice, via telephone, are not considered to be transmissions via electronic media if the information being exchanged did not exist in electronic form immediately before the transmission.

Electronic protected health information means information that comes within paragraphs (1)(i) or (1)(ii) of the definition of protected health information as specified in this section.

Employer is defined as it is in 26 U.S.C. 3401(d).

Family member means, with respect to an individual:

(1) A dependent (as such term is defined in 45 CFR 144.103), of the individual; or

(2) Any other person who is a first-degree, second-degree, third-degree, or fourth-degree relative of the individual or of a dependent of the individual. Relatives by affinity (such as by marriage or adoption) are treated the same as relatives by consanguinity (that is, relatives who share a common biological ancestor). In determining the degree of the relationship, relatives by less than full consanguinity (such as half-siblings, who share only one parent) are treated the same as relatives by full consanguinity (such as siblings who share both parents).

- (i) First-degree relatives include parents, spouses, siblings, and children.
- (ii) Second-degree relatives include grandparents, grandchildren, aunts, uncles, nephews, and nieces.
- (iii) Third-degree relatives include great-grandparents, great-grandchildren, great aunts, great uncles, and first cousins.
- (iv) Fourth-degree relatives include great-great grandparents, great-great

grandchildren, and children of first cousins.

- Genetic information means:
- (1) Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3) of this definition, with respect to an individual, information about:
- (i) The individual's genetic tests;
- (ii) The genetic tests of family members of the individual;
- (iii) The manifestation of a disease or disorder in family members of such individual; or
- (iv) Any request for, or receipt of, genetic services, or participation in clinical research which includes genetic services, by the individual or any family member of the individual.
- (2) Any reference in this subchapter to genetic information concerning an individual or family member of an individual shall include the genetic information of:
- (i) A fetus carried by the individual or family member who is a pregnant woman; and
- (ii) Any embryo legally held by an individual or family member utilizing an assisted reproductive technology.
- (3) Genetic information excludes information about the sex or age of any individual.
- Genetic services means:
- (1) A genetic test;
- (2) Genetic counseling (including obtaining, interpreting, or assessing genetic information); or
- (3) Genetic education.
- Genetic test means an analysis of human DNA, RNA, chromosomes, proteins, or metabolites, if the analysis detects genotypes, mutations, or chromosomal changes. Genetic test does not include an analysis of proteins or metabolites that is directly related to a manifested disease, disorder, or pathological condition.
- Group health plan (also see definition of health plan in this section) means an employee welfare benefit plan (as defined in section 3(1) of the Employee Retirement Income and Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), 29 U.S.C. 1002(1)), including insured and self-insured plans, to the extent that the plan provides medical care (as defined in section 2791(a)(2) of the Public Health Service Act (PHS Act), 42 U.S.C. 300gg-91(a)(2)), including items and services paid for as medical care, to employees or their de-

pendents directly or through insurance, reimbursement, or otherwise, that:

- (1) Has 50 or more participants (as defined in section 3(7) of ERISA, 29 U.S.C. 1002(7)); or
- (2) Is administered by an entity other than the employer that established and maintains the plan.

HHS stands for the Department of Health and Human Services. Health care means care, services, or

Health care means care, services, or supplies related to the health of an individual. Health care includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- (1) Preventive, diagnostic, therapeutic, rehabilitative, maintenance, or palliative care, and counseling, service, assessment, or procedure with respect to the physical or mental condition, or functional status, of an individual or that affects the structure or function of the body; and
- (2) Sale or dispensing of a drug, device, equipment, or other item in accordance with a prescription.

 Health care clearinghouse means a

Health care clearinghouse means a public or private entity, including a billing service, repricing company, community health management information system or community health information system, and "value-added" networks and switches, that does either of the following functions:

(1) Processes or facilitates the proc-

- (1) Processes or facilitates the processing of health information received from another entity in a nonstandard format or containing nonstandard data content into standard data elements or a standard transaction.
- (2) Receives a standard transaction from another entity and processes or facilitates the processing of health information into nonstandard format or nonstandard data content for the receiving entity.

Health care provider means a provider of services (as defined in section 1861(u) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. 1395x(u)), a provider of medical or health services (as defined in section 1861(s) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. 1395x(s)), and any other person or organization who furnishes, bills, or is paid for health care in the normal course of business.

Health information means any information, including genetic information, whether oral or recorded in any form or medium, that:

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- (1) Is created or received by a health care provider, health plan, public health authority, employer, life insurer, school or university, or health care clearinghouse; and
- (2) Relates to the past, present, or future physical or mental health or condition of an individual; the provision of health care to an individual; or the past, present, or future payment for the provision of health care to an individual.

Health insurance issuer (as defined in section 2791(b)(2) of the PHS Act, 42 U.S.C. 300gg-91(b)(2) and used in the definition of health plan in this section) means an insurance company, insurance service, or insurance organization (including an HMO) that is licensed to engage in the business of insurance in a State and is subject to State law that regulates insurance. Such term does not include a group health plan.

Health maintenance organization (HMO) (as defined in section 2791(b)(3) of the PHS Act, 42 U.S.C. 300gg-91(b)(3) and used in the definition of health plan in this section) means a federally qualified HMO, an organization recognized as an HMO under State law, or a similar organization regulated for solvency under State law in the same manner and to the same extent as such an HMO.

- Health plan means an individual or group plan that provides, or pays the cost of, medical care (as defined in section 2791(a)(2) of the PHS Act, 42 U.S.C. 300gg-91(a)(2)).
- (1) Health plan includes the following, singly or in combination:
- (i) A group health plan, as defined in this section.
- (ii) A health insurance issuer, as defined in this section.
- (iii) An HMO, as defined in this section.
- (iv) Part A or Part B of the Medicare program under title XVIII of the Act. (v) The Medicaid program under title XIX of the Act. 42 U.S.C. 1396, et seq.
- XIX of the Act, 42 U.S.C. 1396, et seq.
 (vi) The Voluntary Prescription Drug
 Renefit Program under Part D of title
- Benefit Program under Part D of title XVIII of the Act, 42 U.S.C. 1395w-101 through 1395w-152.
- (vii) An issuer of a Medicare supplemental policy (as defined in section 1882(g)(1) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. 1395ss(g)(1)).

- (viii) An issuer of a long-term care policy, excluding a nursing home fixed indemnity policy.
- (ix) An employee welfare benefit plan or any other arrangement that is established or maintained for the purpose of offering or providing health benefits to the employees of two or more employers.
- (x) The health care program for uniformed services under title 10 of the United States Code.
- (xi) The veterans health care program under 38 U.S.C. chapter 17.
- (xii) The Indian Health Service program under the Indian Health Care Improvement Act, 25 U.S.C. 1601, et seq.
- (xiii) The Federal Employees Health Benefits Program under 5 U.S.C. 8902, et seq.
- (XÍV) An approved State child health plan under title XXI of the Act, providing benefits for child health assistance that meet the requirements of section 2103 of the Act, 42 U.S.C. 1397, et seq. (XV) The Medicare Advantage pro-
- (xv) The Medicare Advantage program under Part C of title XVIII of the Act, 42 U.S.C. 1395w-21 through 1395w-28.
- (xvi) A high risk pool that is a mechanism established under State law to provide health insurance coverage or comparable coverage to eligible individuals.
- (xvii) Any other individual or group plan, or combination of individual or group plans, that provides or pays for the cost of medical care (as defined in section 2791(a)(2) of the PHS Act, 42 U.S.C. 300gg-91(a)(2)).
- (2) Health plan excludes:
- (i) Any policy, plan, or program to the extent that it provides, or pays for the cost of, excepted benefits that are listed in section 2791(c)(1) of the PHS Act. 42 U.S.C. 300gg-91(c)(1); and
- (ii) A government-funded program (other than one listed in paragraph (1)(i)-(xvi) of this definition):
- (A) Whose principal purpose is other than providing, or paying the cost of, health care; or
 - (B) Whose principal activity is:
- (1) The direct provision of health care to persons; or
- (2) The making of grants to fund the direct provision of health care to persons.

Implementation specification means specific requirements or instructions for implementing a standard.

Individual means the person who is the subject of protected health information.

Individually identifiable health information is information that is a subset of health information, including demographic information collected from an individual, and:

- (1) Is created or received by a health care provider, health plan, employer, or health care clearinghouse; and
- (2) Relates to the past, present, or future physical or mental health or condition of an individual; the provision of health care to an individual; or the past, present, or future payment for the provision of health care to an individual; and
- (i) That identifies the individual; or
- (ii) With respect to which there is a reasonable basis to believe the information can be used to identify the individual

Manifestation or manifested means, with respect to a disease, disorder, or pathological condition, that an individual has been or could reasonably be diagnosed with the disease, disorder, or pathological condition by a health care professional with appropriate training and expertise in the field of medicine involved. For purposes of this subchapter, a disease, disorder, or pathological condition is not manifested if the diagnosis is based principally on genetic information.

Modify or modification refers to a change adopted by the Secretary, through regulation, to a standard or an implementation specification.

- Organized health care arrangement means:
- (1) A clinically integrated care setting in which individuals typically receive health care from more than one health care provider;
- (2) An organized system of health care in which more than one covered entity participates and in which the participating covered entities:
- (i) Hold themselves out to the public as participating in a joint arrangement; and
- (ii) Participate in joint activities that include at least one of the following:

- (A) Utilization review, in which health care decisions by participating covered entities are reviewed by other participating covered entities or by a third party on their behalf;
- (B) Quality assessment and improvement activities, in which treatment provided by participating covered entities is assessed by other participating covered entities or by a third party on their behalf, or
- (C) Payment activities, if the financial risk for delivering health care is shared, in part or in whole, by participating covered entities through the joint arrangement and if protected health information created or received by a covered entity is reviewed by other participating covered entities or by a third party on their behalf for the purpose of administering the sharing of financial risk.
- (3) A group health plan and a health insurance issuer or HMO with respect to such group health plan, but only with respect to protected health information created or received by such health insurance issuer or HMO that relates to individuals who are or who have been participants or beneficiaries in such group health plan;
- (4) A group health plan and one or more other group health plans each of which are maintained by the same plan sponsor; or
- (5) The group health plans described in paragraph (4) of this definition and health insurance issuers or HMOs with respect to such group health plans, but only with respect to protected health information created or received by such health insurance issuers or HMOs that relates to individuals who are or have been participants or beneficiaries in any of such group health plans.

Person means a natural person, trust or estate, partnership, corporation, professional association or corporation, or other entity, public or private.

Protected health information means individually identifiable health information:

- (1) Except as provided in paragraph(2) of this definition, that is:
- (i) Transmitted by electronic media;
- (ii) Maintained in electronic media; or
- (iii) Transmitted or maintained in any other form or medium.

TITLE 20-EDUCATION

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§ 1232g. Family educational and privacy rights

(a) Conditions for availability of funds to educational agencies or institutions; inspection and review of education records; specific information to be made available; procedure for access to education records; reasonable-ness of time for such access; hearings; written explanations by parents; definitions

(1)(A) No funds shall be made available under any applicable program to any educational agency or institution which has a policy of denying, or which effectively prevents, the parents of students who are or have been in attendance at a school of such agency or at such institution, as the case may be, the right to inspect and review the education records of their children. If any material or document in the edu-cation record of a student includes information on more than one student, the parents of one of such students shall have the right to inspect and review only such part of such material or docu-ment as relates to such student or to be informed of the specific information contained in such part of such material. Each educational agency or institution shall establish appropriate procedures for the granting of a request by parents for access to the education records of their children within a reasonable period of time, but in no case more than forty-five days after the request has been made.

(B) No funds under any applicable program shall be made available to any State educational agency (whether or not that agency is an edu-cational agency or institution under this section) that has a policy of denying, or effectively prevents, the parents of students the right to inspect and review the education records maintained by the State educational agency on their children who are or have been in attendance at any school of an educational agency or institution that is subject to the provisions of this sec

(C) The first sentence of subparagraph (A) shall not operate to make available to students in institutions of postsecondary education the following materials:

(i) financial records of the parents of the student or any information contained therein;

(ii) confidential letters and statements of recommendation, which were placed in the education records prior to January 1, 1975, if such letters or statements are not used for purposes other than those for which they were specifically intended;
(iii) if the student has signed a waiver of the

student's right of access under this subsection in accordance with subparagraph (D), confidential recommendations-

(I) respecting admission to any educational agency or institution,

(II) respecting an application for employment, and

(III) respecting the receipt of an honor or

honorary recognition.

(D) A student or a person applying for admission may waive his right of access to confidential statements described in clause (iii) of subparagraph (C), except that such waiver shall apply to recommendations only if (i) the student is, upon request, notified of the names of all per-

sons making confidential recommendations and (ii) such recommendations are used solely for the purpose for which they were specifically intended. Such waivers may not be required as a condition for admission to, receipt of financial aid from, or receipt of any other services or benefits from such agency or institution.

(2) No funds shall be made available under any applicable program to any educational agency

or institution unless the parents of students who are or have been in attendance at a school of such agency or at such institution are provided an opportunity for a hearing by such agency or institution, in accordance with regulations of the Secretary, to challenge the content of such student's education records, in order to insure that the records are not inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the privacy rights of students, and to provide an opportunity for the correction or deletion of any such inaccurate, misleading or otherwise inappropriate data contained therein and to insert into such records a written explanation of the parents respecting

the content of such records.

(3) For the purposes of this section the term "educational agency or institution" means any public or private agency or institution which is the recipient of funds under any applicable pro-

(4)(A) For the purposes of this section, the term "education records" means, except as may be provided otherwise in subparagraph (B), those records, files, documents, and other materials which-

(i) contain information directly related to a student; and

(ii) are maintained by an educational agency or institution or by a person acting for such agency or institution.

(B) The term "education records" does not include

(i) records of instructional, supervisory, and administrative personnel and educational personnel ancillary thereto which are in the sole possession of the maker thereof and which are not accessible or revealed to any other person except a substitute;

(ii) records maintained by a law enforcement unit of the educational agency or institution that were created by that law enforcement unit for the purpose of law enforcement;

(iii) in the case of persons who are employed by an educational agency or institution but who are not in attendance at such agency or institution, records made and maintained in the normal course of business which relate exclusively to such person in that person's pacity as an employee and are not available

pacity as an employee and are not available for use for any other purpose; or (iv) records on a student who is eighteen years of age or older, or is attending an insti-tution of postsecondary education, which are made or maintained by a physician, psychia-trist, psychologist, or other recognized professional or paraprofessional acting in his profes-sional or paraprofessional capacity, or assist-ing in that capacity, and which are made, maintained, or used only in connection with the provision of treatment to the student, and are not available to anyone other than persons providing such treatment, except that such

records can be personally reviewed by a physician or other appropriate professional of the student's choice.

(5)(A) For the purposes of this section the term "directory information" relating to a student includes the following: the student's name, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and the most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student.

(B) Any educational agency or institution making public directory information shall give public notice of the categories of information which it has designated as such information with respect to each student attending the institution or agency and shall allow a reasonable period of time after such notice has been given for a parent to inform the institution or agency that any or all of the information designated should not be released without the parent's prior

consent.

(6) For the purposes of this section, the term "student" includes any person with respect to whom an educational agency or institution maintains education records or personally identifiable information, but does not include a person who has not been in attendance at such agency or institution.

(b) Release of education records; parental consent requirement; exceptions; compliance with judicial orders and subpoenas; audit and evaluation of federally-supported edu-cation programs; recordkeeping

(1) No funds shall be made available under any applicable program to any educational agency or institution which has a policy or practice of permitting the release of education records (or personally identifiable information contained therein other than directory information, as defined in paragraph (5) of subsection (a) of this section) of students without the written consent of their parents to any individual, agency, or organization, other than to the following—
(A) other school officials, including teachers

within the educational institution or local educational agency, who have been determined by such agency or institution to have legiti-mate educational interests, including the educational interests of the child for whom con-sent would otherwise be required;

(B) officials of other schools or school systems in which the student seeks or intends to enroll, upon condition that the student's parents be notified of the transfer, receive a copy of the record if desired, and have an oppor-tunity for a hearing to challenge the content

of the record; (C)(i) authorized representatives of (I) the Comptroller General of the United States, (II) the Secretary, or (III) State educational authorities, under the conditions set forth in paragraph (3), or (ii) authorized representa-tives of the Attorney General for law enforce-ment purposes under the same conditions as

apply to the Secretary under paragraph (3);
(D) in connection with a student's application for, or receipt of, financial aid;

- (E) State and local officials or authorities to whom such information is specifically allowed to be reported or disclosed pursuant to State statute adopted-
- (i) before November 19, 1974, if the allowed reporting or disclosure concerns the juvenile justice system and such system's ability to effectively serve the student whose records are released, or

- (ii) after November 19, 1974, if— (I) the allowed reporting or disclosure concerns the juvenile justice system and such system's ability to effectively serve, prior to adjudication, the student whose records are released; and
- (II) the officials and authorities to whom such information is disclosed certify in writing to the educational agency or insti-tution that the information will not be disclosed to any other party except as provided under State law without the prior written consent of the parent of the student.1
- (F) organizations conducting studies for, or on behalf of, educational agencies or institutions for the purpose of developing, validating, or administering predictive tests, administering student aid programs, and improving in-struction, if such studies are conducted in such a manner as will not permit the personal identification of students and their parents by persons other than representatives of such organizations and such information will be destroyed when no longer needed for the purpose for which it is conducted:
- (G) accrediting organizations in order to carry out their accrediting functions:
- (H) parents of a dependent student of such parents, as defined in section 152 of title 26:
- (I) subject to regulations of the Secretary, in connection with an emergency, appropriate persons if the knowledge of such information is necessary to protect the health or safety of the student or other persons;
- (J)(i) the entity or persons, designated in a Federal grand jury subpoena, in which case the court shall order, for good cause shown, the educational agency or institution (and any officer, director, employee, agent, or attorney for such agency or institution) on which the subpoena is served, to not disclose to any person the existence or contents of the subpoena or any information furnished to the grand jury in response to the subpoena; and
- (ii) the entity or persons designated in any other subpoena issued for a law enforcement purpose, in which case the court or other issuing agency may order, for good cause shown, the educational agency or institution (and any officer, director, employee, agent, or attorney for such agency or institution) on which the subpoena is served, to not disclose to any person the existence or contents of the subpoena or any information furnished in response to the subpoena; and
- (K) the Secretary of Agriculture, or authorized representative from the Food and Nutrition Service or contractors acting on behalf of

the Food and Nutrition Service, for the purposes of conducting program monitoring, evaluations, and performance measurements of State and local educational and other agencies and institutions receiving funding or providing benefits of 1 or more programs authorized under the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1751 et seq.) or the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1771 et seq.) for which the results will be reported in an aggregate form that does not identify any individual, on the conditions that—

(i) any data collected under this subparagraph shall be protected in a manner that will not permit the personal identification of students and their parents by other than the authorized representatives of the Secretary; and

(ii) any personally identifiable data shall be destroyed when the data are no longer needed for program monitoring, evaluations, and performance measurements.

Nothing in subparagraph (E) of this paragraph shall prevent a State from further limiting the number or type of State or local officials who will continue to have access thereunder.

(2) No funds shall be made available under any applicable program to any educational agency or institution which has a policy or practice of releasing, or providing access to, any personally identifiable information in education records other than directory information, or as is permitted under paragraph (1) of this subsection, unless—

(A) there is written consent from the student's parents specifying records to be released, the reasons for such release, and to whom, and with a copy of the records to be released to the student's parents and the student if desired by the parents, or

(B) except as provided in paragraph (1)(J), such information is furnished in compliance with judicial order, or pursuant to any lawfully issued subpoena, upon condition that parents and the students are notified of all such orders or subpoenas in advance of the compliance therewith by the educational institution or agency.

(3) Nothing contained in this section shall preclude authorized representatives of (A) the Comptroller General of the United States, (B) the Secretary, or (C) State educational authorities from having access to student or other records which may be necessary in connection with the audit and evaluation of Federally-supported education programs, or in connection with the enforcement of the Federal legal requirements which relate to such programs; Provided, That except when collection of personally identifiable information is specifically authorized by Federal law, any data collected by such officials shall be protected in a manner which will not permit the personal identification of students and their parents by other than those officials, and such personally identifiable data shall be destroyed when no longer needed for such audit, evaluation, and enforcement of Federal legal requirements.

(4)(A) Each educational agency or institution shall maintain a record, kept with the education

records of each student, which will indicate all individuals (other than those specified in paragraph (1)(A) of this subsection), agencies, or organizations which have requested or obtained access to a student's education records maintained by such educational agency or institution, and which will indicate specifically the legitimate interest that each such person, agency, or organization has in obtaining this information. Such record of access shall be available only to parents, to the school official and his assistants who are responsible for the custody of such records, and to persons or organizations authorized in, and under the conditions of, clauses (A) and (C) of paragraph (1) as a means of auditing the operation of the system.

ing the operation of the system.

(B) With respect to this subsection, personal information shall only be transferred to a third party on the condition that such party will not permit any other party to have access to such information without the written consent of the parents of the student. If a third party outside the educational agency or institution permits access to information in violation of paragraph (2)(A), or fails to destroy information in violation of paragraph (1)(F), the educational agency or institution shall be prohibited from permitting access to information from education records to that third party for a period of not less than five years.

(5) Nothing in this section shall be construed

(5) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit State and local educational officials from having access to student or other records which may be necessary in connection with the audit and evaluation of any federally or State supported education program or in connection with the enforcement of the Federal legal requirements which relate to any such program, subject to the conditions specified in the proviso in paragraph (3).

subject to the conditions specified in the proviso in paragraph (3).

(6)(A) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit an institution of postsecondary education from disclosing, to an alleged victim of any crime of violence (as that term is defined in section 16 of title 18), or a nonforcible sex offense, the final results of any disciplinary proceeding conducted by such institution against the alleged perpetrator of such crime or offense with respect to such crime or offense.

(B) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit an institution of postsecondary education from disclosing the final results of any disciplinary proceeding conducted by such institution against a student who is an alleged perpetrator of any crime of violence (as that term is defined in section 16 of title 18), or a nonforcible sex offense, if the institution determines as a result of that disciplinary proceeding that the student committed a violation of the institution's rules or policies with respect to such crime or offense.

(C) For the purpose of this paragraph, the final

results of any disciplinary proceeding—

(i) shall include only the name of the student, the violation committed, and any sanction imposed by the institution on that student; and

(ii) may include the name of any other student, such as a victim or witness, only with the written consent of that other student.

(7)(A) Nothing in this section may be construed to prohibit an educational institution

from disclosing information provided to the institution under section $14071^{\,2}$ of title 42 concerns ing registered sex offenders who are required to register under such section.

(B) The Secretary shall take appropriate steps to notify educational institutions that disclosure of information described in subparagraph (A) is permitted.

(c) Surveys or data-gathering activities; regula-

Not later than 240 days after October 20, 1994. the Secretary shall adopt appropriate regula-tions or procedures, or identify existing regula-tions or procedures, which protect the rights of privacy of students and their families in connection with any surveys or data-gathering activities conducted, assisted, or authorized by the Secretary or an administrative head of an education agency. Regulations established under this subsection shall include provisions controlling the use, dissemination, and protection of such data. No survey or data-gathering activities shall be conducted by the Secretary, or an administrative head of an education agency under an applicable program, unless such activities are authorized by law.

(d) Students' rather than parents' permission or

For the purposes of this section, whenever a student has attained eighteen years of age, or is attending an institution of postsecondary education, the permission or consent required of and the rights accorded to the parents of the student shall thereafter only be required of and accorded to the student.

(e) Informing parents or students of rights under this section

No funds shall be made available under any applicable program to any educational agency or institution unless such agency or institution effectively informs the parents of students, or the students, if they are eighteen years of age or older, or are attending an institution of post-secondary education, of the rights accorded them by this section.

(f) Enforcement; termination of assistance

The Secretary shall take appropriate actions to enforce this section and to deal with violations of this section, in accordance with this chapter, except that action to terminate assistance may be taken only if the Secretary finds there has been a failure to comply with this section, and he has determined that compliance cannot be secured by voluntary means.

(g) Office and review board; creation; functions

The Secretary shall establish or designate an office and review board within the Department for the purpose of investigating, processing, re-viewing, and adjudicating violations of this sec-tion and complaints which may be filed concern-ing alleged violations of this section. Except for the conduct of hearings, none of the functions of the Secretary under this section shall be carried out in any of the regional offices of such Department.

(h) Disciplinary records; disclosure

Nothing in this section shall prohibit an educational agency or institution from-

(1) including appropriate information in the education record of any student concerning disciplinary action taken against such student for conduct that posed a significant risk to the safety or well-being of that student, other students, or other members of the school commu-

nity; or
(2) disclosing such information to teachers and school officials, including teachers and school officials in other schools, who have le-gitimate educational interests in the behavior of the student.

(i) Drug and alcohol violation disclosures (1) In general

Nothing in this Act or the Higher Education Act of 1965 [20 U.S.C. 1001 et seq., 42 U.S.C. 2751 et seq.] shall be construed to prohibit an institution of higher education from disclosing, to a parent or legal guardian of a student, infora parent or legal guardian of a student, information regarding any violation of any Federal, State, or local law, or of any rule or policy of the institution, governing the use or possession of alcohol or a controlled substance, regardless of whether that information is contained in the student's education

(A) the student is under the age of 21; and
(B) the institution determines that the
student has committed a disciplinary violation with respect to such use or possession.

(2) State law regarding disclosure

Nothing in paragraph (1) shall be construed to supersede any provision of State law that prohibits an institution of higher education from making the disclosure described in sub-section (a) of this section.

(j) Investigation and prosecution of terrorism

(1) In general

Notwithstanding subsections (a) through (i) of this section or any provision of State law, the Attorney General (or any Federal officer or employee, in a position not lower than an Assistant Attorney General, designated by the Attorney General) may submit a written application to a court of competent jurisdiction for an ex parte order requiring an educational agency or institution to permit the Attorney General (or his designee) to—

(A) collect education records in the possession of the educational agency or institution that are relevant to an authorized investiga-tion or prosecution of an offense listed in section 2332b(g)(5)(B) of title 18, or an act of domestic or international terrorism as defined in section 2331 of that title; and (B) for official purposes related to the investigation or prosecution of an offense de-

scribed in paragraph (1)(A), retain, disseminate, and use (including as evidence at trial or in other administrative or judicial proor in other administrative or junctial pro-ceedings) such records, consistent with such guidelines as the Attorney General, after consultation with the Secretary, shall issue to protect confidentiality.

(2) Application and approval

(A) IN GENERAL.—An application under paragraph (1) shall certify that there are specific

and articulable facts giving reason to believe that the education records are likely to con-

tain information described in paragraph (1)(A).

(B) The court shall issue an order described in paragraph (1) if the court finds that the application for the order includes the certification described in subparagraph (A).

(3) Protection of educational agency or institu-

An educational agency or institution that, in good faith, produces education records in accordance with an order issued under this subsection shall not be liable to any person for that production.

(4) Record-keeping

Subsection (b)(4) of this section does not apply to education records subject to a court order under this subsection.

§ 1232h. Protection of pupil rights

(a) Inspection of instructional materials by parents or guardians

All instructional materials, including teacher's manuals, films, tapes, or other supplementary material which will be used in connection with any survey, analysis, or evaluation as part of any applicable program shall be available for inspection by the parents or guardians of the children of the children.

(b) Limits on survey, analysis, or evaluations

No student shall be required, as part of any applicable program, to submit to a survey, analysis, or evaluation that reveals information con-

- (1) political affiliations or beliefs of the stu-
- dent or the student's parent;
 (2) mental or psychological problems of the
- student or the student's family;
 (3) sex behavior or attitudes;
 (4) illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or
- demeaning behavior;
 (5) critical appraisals of other individuals with whom respondents have close family rela-
- tionships;
 (6) legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers, physicians, and ministers;
- (7) religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or student's parent; or (8) income (other than that required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such program),

without the prior consent of the student (if the student is an adult or emancipated minor), or in the case of an unemancipated minor, without the prior written consent of the parent.

(c) Development of local policies concerning stu-dent privacy, parental access to information, and administration of certain physical examinations to minors

(1) Development and adoption of local policies

Except as provided in subsections (a) and (b) of this section, a local educational agency

that receives funds under any applicable program shall develop and adopt policies, in consultation with parents, regarding the follow-

(A)(i) The right of a parent of a student to inspect, upon the request of the parent, a survey created by a third party before the survey is administered or distributed by a school to a student; and

(ii) any applicable procedures for granting a request by a parent for reasonable access to such survey within a reasonable period of

time after the request is received.

(B) Arrangements to protect student privacy that are provided by the agency in the event of the administration or distribution of a survey to a student containing one or more of the following items (including the right of a parent of a student to inspect, upon the request of the parent, any survey

containing one or more of such items):

(i) Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or the student's parent.

(ii) Mental or psychological problems of the student or the student's family.

(iii) Sex behavior or attitudes.

(iv) Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminat-ing, or demeaning behavior. (v) Critical appraisals of other individ-

uals with whom respondents have close family relationships.

(vi) Legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships, such as those of

lawyers, physicians, and ministers. (vii) Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or the student's par-

ent.
(viii) Income (other than that required by law to determine eligibility for partici-pation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such program).

(C)(i) The right of a parent of a student to inspect, upon the request of the parent, any instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum for the student: and

(ii) any applicable procedures for granting a request by a parent for reasonable access to instructional material within a reason-able period of time after the request is re-

(D) The administration of physical examinations or screenings that the school or

agency may administer to a student.

(E) The collection, disclosure, or use of personal information collected from students for the purpose of marketing or for selling that information (or otherwise pro-viding that information to others for that purpose), including arrangements to protect student privacy that are provided by the agency in the event of such collection, disclosure, or use.

(F)(i) The right of a parent of a student to inspect, upon the request of the parent, any instrument used in the collection of personal information under subparagraph (E) before the instrument is administered or distributed to a student; and

(ii) any applicable procedures for granting a request by a parent for reasonable access to such instrument within a reasonable period of time after the request is received.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN_____AND THE KENTON COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION TO DESIGNATE AN AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE KENTON COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR THE AUDIT/EVALUATION OF EDUCATION PROGRAMS AND TO AUTHORIZE THE RELEASE AND USE OF CONFIDENTIAL DATA

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the Kenton County Board of Education ("KCBOE") and _______ (hereafter "Authorized Representative") and establishes the procedures relating to an exchange of information between the Parties.

*** *** *** *** *** *** *** *** *** *** ***

WHEREAS, the KCBOE is the public local education agency organized under Kentucky Law and its duties include audit or evaluation functions of federal or state-supported education programs or enforcement or compliance with federal or state legal requirements that relate to those education programs (audit, evaluation or enforcement or compliance activity) in its role as the local education agency and in evaluation of education programs to identify or develop the best education practices to be used in public schools of Kenton County Kentucky;

WHEREAS, the Authorized Representative is an entity performing audit or evaluation functions at the direction and under the control of the KCBOE and the Authorized Representative is a contractor acting in the place of the KCBOE to perform the KCBOE's audit or evaluation functions of federal or state-supported education programs or to enforce or comply with federal legal requirements that relate to those education programs (audit, evaluation or enforcement or compliance activity) in its role as the state education agency and in evaluation of education programs, as described below;

WHEREAS, various elements of the data maintained by the agencies are protected by the Privacy Act of 1974, 5 U.S.C. 552a; the Kentucky Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, KRS 160.700 et seq.; the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. 1232(g); the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act, 42 U.S.C. 1751 et seq.; the Child Nutrition Act of 1966, 42 U.S.C. 1771 et seq.; the Personal Information Security and Breach Investigation Procedures and Practices Act, KRS 61.931 et seq.; and the Kentucky Open Records Act, KRS 61.820 et seq.;

NOW THEREFORE, the KCBOE and the Authorized Representative hereby mutually agree as follows:

Section 1. Designation of Authority.

A. The KCBOE hereby designates the Authorized Representative and its subcontractors identified below as an "authorized representative" of the KCBOE, as defined in 34 C.F.R. 99.31 (a)(3) and 99.35, with respect to the provision of audit or evaluation functions of federal or state-supported education programs or to enforce or comply with federal or state legal requirements that relate to those education programs (audit, evaluation or enforcement or compliance activity) in the KCBOE's role as the local education agency and in evaluation of education programs ("audit/evaluation services") and, specifically, with respect to the use of confidential data disclosed under this agreement.

B. The KCBOE and the Authorized Representative hereby agree that, if free or reduced price lunch eligibility data (i.e., free or reduced price lunch eligibility data which is the student poverty indicator for most education programs) is to be released to the Authorized Representative, then the KCBOE shall identify the Authorized Representative as a contractor acting in the place of the KCBOE; shall ensure that the audit/evaluation services include a "need to know" this data as required by 7 C.F.R. 245.6 (f); and shall ensure that the data will only be disclosed to the Authorized Representative upon written request utilizing the U.S. Department of Agriculture Prototype Agreement. The completed USDA Prototype Agreement shall be attached in Exhibit A and incorporated into this agreement as if set forth fully herein and KCBOE's agreement that the Authorized Representative meets the requirements for disclosure set forth in 7 C.F.R. 245.6 (f) and that the Authorized Representative has demonstrated a "need to know" shall be evidenced by the KCBOE's agreement to enter the USDA Prototype Agreement.

Section 2. Acknowledgment of Release of Confidential Data, Identification of Confidential Data to be Released to the Authorized Representative and Description of Use of Data by the Authorized Representative.

- A. The parties acknowledge that the KCBOE is releasing confidential data including student and nonstudent information to the Authorized Representative for the purposes outlined herein, and that the release of the KCBOE confidential data including student and non-student information to the Authorized Representative is necessary for the completion of the KCBOE's audit/evaluation services. The confidential data including student and non-student information to be disclosed is described in a document attached to this agreement as Exhibit A. The Authorized Representative shall notify the KCBOE and the KCBOE shall provide written consent, if approved, of any changes to the list of disclosed data necessary for the provision of audit/evaluation services. The Authorized Representative will use personally identifiable information from education records and other records in order to perform the audit/evaluation services described in Exhibit A. The description of the audit/evaluation services, as included in Exhibit A, shall include the purpose and scope of the audit/evaluation services, specific description of the methodology of disclosure and an explanation as to the need for confidential data including student and non-student information to perform these audit/evaluation services. The Authorized Representative shall notify the KCBOE and the KCBOE shall provide written consent, if approved, of any changes to the list of disclosed data necessary for the audit/evaluation services or any changes to the scope or purpose of the audit/evaluation services themselves. Any agreed upon changes to the data disclosed or to the audit/evaluation services shall be reduced to writing and included in Exhibit A to this agreement.
- B. If free or reduced price lunch eligibility data (i.e., free or reduced price lunch eligibility data which is the student poverty indicator for most education programs) is to be released to the Authorized Representative, then the KCBOE shall disclose this data to the Authorized Representative, upon written request utilizing the U.S. Department of Agriculture prototype request and confidentiality agreement, and upon the KCBOE agreeing that the Authorized Representative has demonstrated that disclosure is allowed by 7 C.F.R. 245.6. A description of any data protected by 7 C.F.R 245.6 which is to be disclosed under this agreement shall be included in Exhibit A, Section III. Any agreed upon changes to the data disclosed or to the audit/evaluation services shall be reduced to writing and included in Exhibit A, Section III to this agreement.

Section 3. The Authorized Representative and the Authorized Users' Obligations.

A. The Authorized Representative shall not share these confidential data with anyone, except those employees of the Authorized Representative and the Authorized Representative's subcontractors, ("Authorized Users") that are directly involved and have a legitimate interest under FERPA or a "need to know" (as defined in 7 C.F.R. 245.6 in the case of disclosure of free or reduced price lunch eligibility data which is the student poverty indicator for education programs) in the performance of the audit/evaluation

services according to the terms of this agreement or any overarching agreement between the KCBOE and the Authorized Representative in which the Authorized Representative agrees to perform these audit/evaluation services on the KCBOE's behalf ("Master Agreement").

- B. The Authorized Representative shall require all Authorized Users to comply with FERPA and other applicable state and federal student and non-student privacy laws. The Authorized Representative shall require and maintain confidentiality agreements or the KCBOE's Nondisclosure Statement(s) with each Authorized User of confidential data. If a confidentiality agreement with each Authorized User is used which is different from the KCBOE's Nondisclosure Statement(s), then the terms of the Authorized Representative's confidentiality agreements shall contain, at a minimum, the terms and conditions of this agreement and a copy of the current Authorized Representative's confidentiality agreement or the KCBOE's Nondisclosure Statement(s), as appropriate, shall be attached to this agreement as Exhibit B.
- C. Authorized Representative that receive Personal Information as defined by and in accordance with Kentucky's Personal Information Security and Breach Investigation Procedures and Practices Act, KRS 61.931, et seq., (the "Act"), shall secure, protect and maintain the confidentiality of the Personal Information by, without limitation, complying with all requirements applicable to "non-affiliated third parties" set forth in the Act.

"Personal Information" is defined in accordance with KRS 61.931(6) as "an individual's first name or first initial and last name; personal mark; or unique biometric or genetic print or image, in combination with one (1) or more of the following data elements:

- a) An account, credit card number, or debit card number that, in combination with any required security code, access code or password, would permit access to an account;
- b) A Social Security number;
- c) A taxpayer identification number that incorporates a Social Security number;
- d) A driver's license number, state identification card number or other individual identification number issued by an agency;
- e) A passport number or other identification number issued by the United States government; or
- f) Individually Identifiable Information as defined in 45 C.F.R. sec. 160.013 (of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act), except for education records covered by the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act, as amended 20 U.S.C. sec 1232g."

As provided in KRS 61.931(5), a "non-affiliated third party" means "any person or entity that has a contract or agreement with the Commonwealth and receives (accesses, collects or maintains) personal information from the Commonwealth pursuant to the contract or agreement."

Contractor shall not redisclose, without written consent of the KCBOE, any "personal information," as defined in KRS 61-931, or any other personally identifiable information of a student or other persons, such as employees.

D. The Authorized Representative hereby agrees to cooperate with the Commonwealth in complying with the response, mitigation, correction, investigation, and notification requirements of the Act.

- E. The Authorized Representative shall notify as soon as possible, but not to exceed seventy-two (72) hours, the Kentucky Department of Education, the Commissioner of the Kentucky State Police, the Auditor of Public Accounts, and the Commonwealth Office of Technology of a determination of or knowledge of a breach, unless the exception set forth in KRS 61.932(2)(b)2 applies and the vendor abides by the requirements set forth in that exception. If the agency is a unit of government listed in KRS 61.931(1)(b), the vendor shall notify the Commissioner of the Department of Local Government in the same manner as above. If the agency is a public school district listed in KRS 61.931(1)(d), the vendor shall notify the Commissioner of the Department of Education in the same manner as above. If the agency is an educational entity listed under KRS 61.931(1)(e), the vendor shall notify the Council on Postsecondary Education in the same manner as above. Notification shall be in writing on the form developed by the Commonwealth Office of Technology and incorporated by reference into Kentucky Regulation 200 KAR 1:015.
- F. The Authorized Representative hereby agrees that the Commonwealth may withhold payment(s) owed to the vendor for any violation of the Identity Theft Prevention Reporting Requirements.
- G. The Authorized Representative hereby agrees to undertake a prompt and reasonable investigation of any breach as required by KRS 61.933.
- H. Upon conclusion of an investigation of a security breach of Personal Information as required by KRS 61.933, the Authorized Representative hereby agrees to an apportionment of the costs of the notification, investigation, and mitigation of the security breach.
- I. In accordance with KRS 61.932(2)(a) the Authorized Representative shall implement, maintain, and update security and breach investigation procedures that are appropriate to the nature of the information disclosed, that are at least as stringent as the security and breach investigation procedures and practices established by the Commonwealth Office of Technology: http://technology.ky.gov/ciso/Pages/InformationSecurityPolicies,StandardsandProcedures.aspx.
- J. If Authorized Representative is a cloud computing service provider (as defined in KRS 365.734(1)(b) as "any person or entity other than an educational institution that operates cloud computing services"), Authorized Representative does further agree that:
 - Authorized Representative shall not process student data for any purpose other than providing, improving, developing, or maintaining the integrity of its cloud computing services, unless the provider receives express permission from the student's parent. The Authorized Representative shall work with the student's school and district to determine the best method of collecting parental permission. KRS 365.734 defines "process" and "student data".
 - With a written agreement for educational research, Authorized Representative may assist an educational institution to conduct educational research as permitted by the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as amended, 20 U.S.C.sec.1232g.
 - Pursuant to KRS 365.734, Authorized Representative shall not in any case process student data to advertise or facilitate advertising or to create or correct an individual or household profile for any advertisement purposes.
 - Pursuant to KRS 365.734, Authorized Representative shall not sell, disclose, or otherwise process student data for any commercial purpose.

K. Pursuant to KRS 365.734, Authorized Representative shall certify in writing to the agency that it will comply with KRS 365.734(2).

The Authorized Representative shall protect confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data in a manner that does not permit personal identification of students and their parents, and non-students by anyone except those bound by this agreement and the KCBOE. The Authorized Representative shall store all confidential data on secure data servers using current industry best practices. The Authorized Representative shall notify the KCBOE as soon as practicable if the Authorized Representative learns of any security breach to the server containing the confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data or of any disclosure of confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data to anyone other than the Authorized Representative's Authorized Users or the KCBOE officials authorized to receive confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data. The Authorized Representative shall cooperate and take all reasonable means prescribed by the KCBOE to secure any breaches as soon as practicable.

- L. The Authorized Representative shall not redisclose the KCBOE's confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data to any other party without the prior consent of the parent or eligible student except as allowed by applicable federal and state law.
- M. The Authorized Representative certifies that it has the capacity to restrict access to confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data solely to Authorized Users and to ensure that the confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data is accessed only for the purposes described in this agreement. A copy of the Authorized Representative's data security policies and procedures is attached to this agreement as Exhibit C.
- N. The Authorized Representative shall destroy all confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data within forty-five (45) days after it is no longer needed to perform the audit/evaluation services described in this agreement, upon KCBOE's request or upon termination of this agreement, whichever occurs first unless agreed otherwise in writing. The Authorized Representative's description of the method(s) which will be used to destroy all confidential data shall be attached to this agreement as Exhibit D. The Authorized Representative shall provide written verification of the data destruction to the KCBOE within forty-five (45) days after the data is destroyed.
- O. The Authorized Representative shall permit the KCBOE, at the KCBOE's cost and upon written reasonable request, to audit the Authorized Representative to confirm that the Authorized Representative is complying with the data security policies and procedures in Exhibit C and/or that the Authorized Representative has destroyed the data as verified.
- P. The Authorized Representative shall collect and use these confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data only for the purpose of helping the KCBOE perform audit/evaluation services related to the activities outlined in this agreement or in any Master Agreement.
- Q. The Authorized Representative shall obtain prior written approval from the KCBOE before accessing confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data for activities beyond the scope specified in this agreement or in a Master Agreement; and, any access beyond the scope of this agreement or a Master Agreement shall be consistent with federal and state law requirements. Any confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data collected by the Authorized Representative under activities approved by the KCBOE under this section, which are not regularly collected within the scope of this agreement but are consistent with the activities described in this agreement, shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this agreement.

- R. If the Authorized Representative becomes legally compelled to disclose any confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data (whether by judicial or administrative order, applicable law, rule or regulation, or otherwise), then the Authorized Representative shall use all reasonable efforts to provide the KCBOE with prior notice before disclosure so that the KCBOE may seek a protective order or other appropriate remedy to prevent the disclosure or to ensure the KCBOE's compliance with the confidentiality requirements of federal or state law; provided, however, that the Authorized Representative will use all reasonable efforts to maintain the confidentiality of confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data. If a protective order or other remedy is not obtained prior to the deadline by which any legally compelled disclosure is required, the Authorized Representative will only disclose that portion of confidential and otherwise personally identifiable data that the Authorized Representative is legally required to disclose.
- S. The Authorized Representative shall abide by and be bound by the requirements of the U.S. Department of Education, Family Policy Compliance Office's Guidance for Reasonable Methods and Written Agreements issued pursuant to the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("Guidance"). The Guidance is available by clicking the following hyperlink, http://www2.ed.gov/policy/gen/guid/fpco/pdf/reasonablemtd_agreement.pdf and made a part of this agreement as if stated fully herein.
- T. The Authorized Representative shall also, if the data shared by the KCBOE includes data protected by 7 C.F.R. 245.6 (i.e., free or reduced price lunch eligibility data which is the student poverty indicator for most education programs), abide by the restrictions of disclosure and confidentiality requirements contained in 7 C.F.R. 245.6 (f) applicable to the KCBOE.

Section 4. Permission to Use Data.

The KCBOE acknowledges that by entering this agreement it is approving, in writing, of the Authorized Representative's use of these confidential data within the scope of purposes outlined in this agreement.

Section 5. Transfer Protocol.

The KCBOE and the Authorized Representative shall work cooperatively to determine the proper medium and method for the transfer of confidential data between each other. The Authorized Representative shall confirm the transfer of confidential data and notify the KCBOE as soon as practicable of any discrepancies between the actual data transferred and the data described in this agreement. The same protocol shall apply to any transfer of confidential data from the Authorized Representative to the KCBOE.

Section 6. Breach of Data Confidentiality and Remedies.

The Authorized Representative acknowledges that the breach of this agreement or its part may result in irreparable and continuing damage to the KCBOE for which money damages may not provide adequate relief. In the event of a breach or threatened breach of this agreement by the Authorized Representative, the KCBOE, in addition to any other rights and remedies available to the KCBOE at law or in equity, may be entitled to preliminary and permanent injunctions to enjoin and restrain the breach or threatened breach. If the United States Department of Education's Family Policy Compliance Office determines that the Authorized Representative has violated paragraph 34 C.F.R. 99.31(a)(3), the KCBOE may not allow the Authorized Representative access to personally identifiable information from education records for at least five (5) years. If the Authorized Representative breaches the confidentiality requirements of 7 C.F.R. 245.6 relative to any confidential free or reduced price lunch eligibility data, then the Authorized Representative shall be responsible for any consequences or penalties which result from such breach.

Section 7. Amendment and Assignability.

The terms and conditions of this agreement may only be amended by mutual written consent of both the KCBOE and the Authorized Representative and the Authorized Representative shall not assign its respective rights or obligations under this agreement without the KCBOE's prior written consent. The rights and obligations of each party under this agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon each party and any respective successors and assigns.

Section 8. Choice of Law and Forum.

All questions as to the execution, validity, interpretation, and performance of this agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. The selected forum to hear any causes of action arising from this agreement, or any actions thereunder, is the Kenton Circuit Court, Covington, Kentucky.

Section 9. Waiver.

The failure by one party to require performance of any provision shall not affect that party's right to require performance at any time thereafter, nor shall a waiver of any breach or default of this agreement constitute a waiver of any subsequent breach or default or a waiver of the provision itself. No modification, amendment, waiver or release of any provision of this agreement or of any right, obligation, claim or cause of action arising from this agreement shall be valid or binding for any purpose unless in writing and duly executed by the party against whom they are asserted.

Section 10. Severability.

Any provision of this agreement that is declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction or by operation of law, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this agreement.

Section 11. Authority to Enter the Agreement.

The KCBOE and the Authorized Representative represent and warrant, by the signatures of their duly appointed representatives, that they are legally entitled to enter into this agreement.

Section 12. Data Custodians.

The individuals who are the designated data custodians for the Authorized Representative with respect to this confidential data release and use agreement are listed in Exhibit E with their contact information.

Section 13. Term and Termination.

The term of this agreement shall be the same as the term of any Master Agreement between the KCBOE and the Authorized Representative / for (length of time or insert a date here) unless terminated earlier by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice. Either party may terminate this agreement with thirty (30) days written notice.

Section 14. Effective Date of This Agreement.

This agreement will become effective once the KCBOE and the Authorized Representative have both signed.

We have advised the three major U.S. credit reporting agencies about this incident and have given those agencies a general report, alerting them to the fact that the incident occurred, however, we have not notified them about the presence of your specific information in the data breach.*

As a second step, you also may want to contact the three U.S. credit reporting agencies (Equifax, Experian and TransUnion) to obtain a free credit report from each by calling 1-877-322-8228 or by logging onto www.annualcreditreport.com.

Even if you do not find any suspicious activity on your initial credit reports, the FTC recommends that you check your credit reports periodically. A victim's personal information is sometimes held for use or shared among a group of thieves at different times. Checking your credit reports periodically can help you spot problems and address them quickly.

You also may want to consider placing a security freeze on your credit files. A freeze prevents an authorized person from using your personal identifying information to open new accounts or borrow money in your name.

You will need to contact the three U.S. credit reporting agencies to place the security freeze. The fee is \$10 for each credit reporting agency. The agencies may waive the fee if you can prove that identity theft has occurred. Keep in mind that when you place the freeze, you will not be able to borrow money, obtain instant credit, or get a new credit card until you temporarily lift or permanently remove the freeze.

I. General Regulations of Facility Usage

A. Guidelines for Facility Usage - The use of school facilities for K-12 school instructional and extracurricular programs, meetings of students, teachers, parent-teacher organizations, or other Organizations directly affiliated with the schools will have precedence over other requests. Sponsors of school activities and events are encouraged to schedule their facility needs in advance of the date of use to assist in the further scheduling of the facility. To ensure the care and preservation of school facilities and equipment and to ensure fairness and consistency in the implementation of Board policy governing use of facilities, the following categories have been established. These categories have been approved to determine priority for facility use and a fee schedule has been provided for approved users outside of regular programs or activities when designated space and facilities are available. There will also be a separate fee schedule for school day/time and non school day/time (see below the definition of both).

Category 1 will be given the highest priority and Category 5 the lowest priority. However, every effort will be made to accommodate all requests.

Category 1- K-12 Program Activities

Category 2 - Community E d. Programs/School Support Groups

Category 3 - Community Use Non-Profit Groups

Category 4 - Private Citizen Use/Non Profit Groups

Category 5 - Commercial Users

School Day/Time – Monday – Fridays from 6:30 AM – $\frac{1}{2}$ hour prior to each individual building's support staff work shift completion, when school is in session

Non School Day/Time – All Saturdays and Sundays, summers and any day or time when Kenton County Schools are not in session

B. Nature of Program -

Programs and activities of users must be of a nature suitable for presentation in a public school, must be lawful, and must conform to all of the policies of the Board of Education.

C. Supervision & Security –

All activities must be under competent adult supervision approved by the principal or principal designee of the building involved. User groups must take reasonable steps to insure orderly behavior and will be required at their expense to provide school-approved security personnel as determined necessary by the administration. In all cases the use of the school facilities will require that a school employee be present when the building is open. Outside organization rentals on Saturdays and Sundays must have custodian present the entire time (depending on size and nature of event, a separate supervisor may also be needed).

D. Damage and/or Property Loss -

Users will be responsible for paying for all damage incurred by their use of the facility or equipment, including property of pupils and employees. In the event that property loss or damage is incurred during use or occupancy of district facilities, the amount of damages shall be determined by the building principal or designee and approved by the administration, and a bill for damages will be presented to the group using the facilities. Payment for damage must be made within two weeks of receipt of the bill. The school district will not be responsible for any loss of valuables or personal property.

E. Restrictions on Use -

Approved users are restricted to the dates and hours approved and to the building area and facilities specified. Buildings will normally be opened one-half hour before the scheduled program time and closed one-half hour after the scheduled program time.

F. Fire & Safety Regulations -

Approved users are responsible for the observance of county and state fire and safety regulations at all times. Corridors, exits, and stairways shall be kept free of obstructions. Members of an audience or spectators must never stand or sit to block exits, aisle ways, or stairways. Facility capacities as determined by the Fire Marshall shall be observed.

G. Condition of Rooms -

User groups are expected to leave all rooms and furniture in the condition and arrangement in which they were found.

H. Inclement Weather -

All activities will be cancelled when school is closed due to inclement weather. Outside groups using our facilities during inclement weather will be at their own risk. Facilities will be cleared for school use only.

I. Controlled Substances-

Controlled substances (i .e. alcoholic beverages cigarettes marijuana, etc) will not be permitted in school facilities or on school property at any time.

J. Use of Custodians -

When a group or organization uses a facility during the time a custodian is normally on duty, the custodian will see that the facility is properly heated, that lights are turned on and that doors are opened for the group's use of the facility. The employee will be responsible for handling furniture and equipment and seeing that the facility and equipment are left in good order after the activity is over. Outside organization rentals on Saturday and Sundays must have custodian present the entire time (depending on size and nature of event, a separate supervisor may also be needed).

K. Opening of Offices -

Building custodians have been instructed that only in the case of an emergency are offices to be opened and/or telephones used.

L. Food/Drink in Buildings -

No food/drink items of any type are to be used in school district facilities without the prior knowledge and consent of the Principal or Principal designee. Should a kitchen area be desired for use of food preparation, it is understood that an approved member of the school cafeteria staff will be necessary at user expense to supervise the kitchen. If food is brought into the facility the organization using the facility will be responsible for clean-up.

M. Use During Non School Time-

Use during summer months, holidays or during other periods shall not conflict with building cleaning or building renovations. Use will also follow the non school time schedule for fees.

N. Liability Insurance -

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the renter agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the District, the Board of Education, individual Board members (both past and present), the District's administration and/or any other District representatives, employees, agents and officials, for any claims, actions, liabilities, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, which are alleged to arise or result from, or are related to, the renter's use of the Property or the activities that are conducted by the renter on the Property. This liability includes, but is not limited to, claims for bodily injury or death of persons and for loss of or damage to property. This liability does not include claims resulting from the negligent or intentional acts of the District and/or its agents. Further, nothing contained within this provision shall operate to limit or waive, or be construed as limiting or waiving, the District's immunity from liability as granted by state and/or federal law.

A certificate of liability insurance will be required for Categories 2, 3, 4 and 5 at least two weeks prior to use. Insurance is not required for category 1 or any other group that falls under district liability coverage. Minimum liability insurance in the following amount must be provided: \$2,000,000 in the aggregate and \$1,000,000 per occurrence for general liability, \$10,000 for property damage and \$5,000 for medical expense/bodily injury. The Kenton County Board of Education shall be named as the additional insured on the copy of the organization's insurance certificate. User is responsible for getting the insurance.

O. Enforcement of Rules -

Responsibility for enforcement of rules and regulations regarding use of school facilities rests with groups using the facilities. Permits to use a facility may be canceled at any time when there is evidence that the rules and regulations outlined herein are being violated. In case of cancellation the Kenton County Schools assumes no liability other than return of fees charged. Any infraction of the building use regulations herein listed may also be grounds for refusing to grant subsequent requests for the use of school facilities.

II. REQUIREMENTS

A. Applicant -

Applications for the use of school facilities shall originate with a responsible adult representing the organization. Representatives who have been granted permits shall not reassign, transfer, sublet or charge a fee to others for the use of school property. A \$10 non-refundable application fee will be assessed when the completed form is returned by the applicant. The application fee will be applied to the organization's rental charges if the bill is paid within two weeks of the event.

B. Building Use Application –

The applicant is responsible for completing a Building Request Form for all requests for use of school facilities. Completed applications must be signed by the person requesting use and should be submitted a minimum of two weeks in advance of use. Building Use Forms can be obtained from the school's designee (facility scheduler). The form will be sent to the principal or designee of the facility for approval and to the Director of Student Engagement for consideration. Upon approval, copies will be sent to the custodial staff, the school office and to the applicant. A copy will be maintained in the office of Director of Student Engagement at the district Central Office. The applicant's

request should not be considered to be approved until the applicant receives the signed copy.

Applicant must have their request form in their possession at the event.

C. District Supervisor Fees

If services of the district supervisor are required and the district supervisor is called away from his regular duties, then the group will be required to pay the supervisory contracted rate for each hour or fraction thereof that he is obliged to work. Users will be charged for supervisory time required to setup special school equipment and furniture (e.g., P. A., tables for large banquets risers, etc.). All pay for district supervisors will be at the current rate of pay. The district supervisor must be an employee of the school that is being rented. If a district supervisor in the building is not willing to work the event, another employee (excluding an administrator) may work the event and payment to them will be at the current rate paid for supervisory duties. All payments for supervisory fees must be paid to the Kenton County Board of Education.

D. Custodial Fees-

If services of the custodian are requested and the custodian is called away from his regular duties, then the group will be required to pay the custodial contracted rate for each hour or fraction thereof that he is obliged to work. Users will be charged for custodial time required to setup special school equipment and furniture (e.g., P. A., tables for large banquets risers, etc.). All pay for custodians will be at the current rate of pay. The custodian must be an employee of the school that is being rented. If a custodian in the building is not willing to work the event, another employee (excluding an administrator) may work the event and payment to them will be at the current rate paid for extended school services. All payments for custodial fees must be paid to the Kenton County Board of Education.

E. Equipment Fees -

The use of equipment by non-school groups shall be granted only upon advance approval of the building principal or designee. Extra compensation must be paid for employees for moving, operating, or supervising special or extra equipment and will be charged to the using group.

F. Collection of Fees -

In all cases, fees for Category 2, 3, 4 and 5 users (which pay for use) will be billed within two weeks of the date of use. This includes facility rental charges, staff costs and fees for extra services which may be required. Estimated fees for Category 4 and Category 5 users shall be

paid in advance. A deposit fee of at least 50% of the total estimate is due at least two weeks prior to the date of use.

G. Notice of Cancellation -

The Administration reserves the right to cancel with reasonable notice any non-school event in order to maintain first right of use of school facilities for school programs. All approvals are granted with this understanding.

H. Additional Personnel Fees -

Food Service/Kitchen Supervisor- as established by current pay schedule.

Auditorium Sound/Light Technician- as established by current pay schedule

Life Guard - a life guard must be on the pool deck at all times. The school will approve the guard assigned who will be paid according to the current pay schedule.

II. CATEGORY AND FEE STRUCTURE – The District Director of Student Engagement will have the final say if a category is disputed.

Category 1: K-12 Program Activities

K-12 Program Activities are those which directly relate to regular or extracurricular K-12 events and are sponsored by the school or school district group. These include, but are not limited to, music performances, plays, athletic events, parent orientation meetings, meetings of school sponsored clubs, honor society induction's, award banquets, PTO and PTA organizations etc.

Fees for Category 1 – See fee schedule

Category 2: Community Education Programs/School Support Groups
Community Education programs solely or jointly administered by the Board of
Education will be granted a second priority for available school district space
and facilities. School-related support groups include but are not limited to:
Parent Advisory Groups, Boosters Clubs (such as band, athletic, etc.),
Special Olympics, local Scout organizations, 4H, high school sponsored
athletic leagues and camps, other school support groups who provide
services only for students who live in the Kenton County School District.

Fees for Category 2 - See fee schedule

Category 3: Community Non-Profit Groups/Other School Districts

Community non-profit groups such as governmental agencies, church groups or organized groups who provide local, civic, educational, or cultural activities and are staffed by volunteers. Examples of Category 3 users include but are not limited to: Jaycees, Kiwanis, Rotary, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, local youth football teams, YMCA, AAU basketball teams, club volleyball teams, youth baseball teams, etc.

Fees for Category 3 - See fee schedule

Category 4: Private Citizen Use/Non-Profit Groups

Private Citizen Use/Non-Profit Groups are defined as formally/informally organized groups of community residents who are interested in using school facilities for a particular use such as recreational, educational cultural, religious or charitable goals. This category includes, but is not limited to church services, neighborhood associations, political party meetings, etc.

Fees for Category 4 – See fee schedule

Category 5: Commercial Users

Commercial users are defined as private businesses for profit, vendors or entrepreneurs. Commercial users are discouraged from application for K-12 facility use. Applications for use of facilities by commercial users will be reviewed and permission must be granted by the Kenton County Board of Education. Approval of all applications in Category 5 will be based upon the following criteria: benefits to the school district and the community educational contribution, potential wear and tear on school facilities, appropriateness of the activity, relationship of the activity to the stated mission of the school district.

Fees for Category 5 - See fee schedule

Meal Charges

The Kenton County School District allows limited meal charges to cover the situation of a student losing or forgetting meal money. This service is not designed or intended to provide a credit service for continuous charging and collection of student meals. Under no circumstances can a-la-carte items be charged.

Students that have outstanding meal charges are not allowed to buy any a-la-carte items.

If a student incurs three meal charges, reasonable attempts will be made to notify parents/guardians by phone or email and US mail. If a fifth charge is incurred, attempts will be made by a designated school administrator to contact the parents and an alternative snack will be provided until the charges are paid. It is very important that you do not ignore charge notes that are mailed home. If a child incurs charges exceeding \$50 during Kenton County tenure, charges will be turned over to a collection agency. If there is a problem paying the charge or you feel that the charge is in error, please call the cafeteria manager to discuss it immediately.

If you are applying for free or reduced lunch benefits, you are responsible for all lunches until your form has been approved. If your child has transferred into Kenton County from another district and was previously on free or reduced lunch, please bring a letter verifying that from the previous school which will allow Kenton County to extend the same benefits without a delay.

Parents/Guardians are expected to pay for student meals on the day the meal is purchased or in advance with cash, check, or on-line with a debit or credit card. The on-line payment system, Mypaymentsplus, (formerly called Mealpayplus) can be found by going directly to www.mypaymentsplus.com. Online payments can be a big advantage to students and parents because the students do not have to handle cash. Parents that set up online payment accounts are also able to check meal balances, student purchases, receive email low balance warnings and have an auto replenish option.

Dual Credit Memorandum of Agreement between Northern Kentucky University and Kenton County Schools

I. Purpose

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) establishes a collaborative relationship between Northern Kentucky University (NKU) and Kenton County Schools to offer dual credit opportunities for secondary school students who meet the requirements for admission into NKU's School Based Scholars Program (SBS). This agreement incorporates by reference the stipulations included in KY HB 206 (2017), which continues the Kentucky Dual Credit Scholarship (DCS) Program, and is managed by the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA).

II. Registration Procedures

All students must be admitted to NKU and complete the SBS application. To be admitted into NKU's SBS program, the students must meet the following criteria:

- Applicants must be a high school junior or senior.
- Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Applicants must have a composite ACT score of 20 or higher. Students who do not have an ACT score may also submit an equivalent SAT or PSAT score. If a student does not have an ACT, SAT, or PSAT score, they may be admitted with a 3.0 or higher GPA and recommendation from their high school guidance counselor.
- Applicants must meet any prerequisites for individual courses.

Once in the program, students must earn a grade of C or higher in each class to take courses in the next semester.

Kenton County Schools will be responsible for transmitting all data required by the Kentucky DCS Program to KHEAA and following all procedures necessary to administer the DCS. NKU will be responsible for transmitting enrollment verification and final grade reports to KHEAA at the end of each semester, in accordance with the DCS procedures.

After each add or drop deadline during the fall and spring semesters, the SBS office will send a copy of each student who is signed up for a dual-credit course with the expectation that the appropriate person at the high school will verify the rosters with the high school's records and the school districts will submit any changes to KHEAA, as necessary.

III. Approved Courses

Northern Kentucky University and Kenton County Schools have agreed to work collaboratively to provide the following course schedule during the fall 2017 and spring 2018 semesters:

Additionally, students are permitted to take courses online or on NKU's campus.

NKU reserves the right to cancel a class that does not meet enrollment targets.

IV. Negotiated Costs

A. Tuition Rate

The tuition rate for all eligible attending SBS from any KY Public School system will be set at one-third of the KCTCS hourly tuition rate (expected to be \$54 per credit hour in 2017-18), the Dual Credit Tuition Rate ceiling as prescribed within the KY HB 206 (2017).

After the Dual Credit Scholarship money has been applied, NKU's Student Account Services will send an electronic bill to School-Based Scholar students for the remaining tuition balance, if any. Additionally, NKU will send a list to each high school with the students who have a remaining balance on their account. Once the high school has verified that the DCS has been correctly applied to each student's account, they agree to notify the students who owe a remaining balance.

B. Related Course Expenses

According to KY HB 206 (2017), the Participating Institution (NKU) "charges no more than the dual credit tuition rate ceiling per credit hour, including any fees, for any dual credit course it offers". The following additional charges associated with operating a college course will be allocated as follows and agreed upon by NKU and Kenton County Schools:

Participating high school students will be responsible for the cost of textbooks, digital content, or eResources; unless otherwise covered by the Kenton County Schools.

C. Unsuccessful Students

Per KY HB 206, the DCS will only reimburse 50% of the cost of tuition for students who do not successfully complete any course in which the student was to receive the DCS. Although the university incurs costs associated with teaching the course regardless of student performance, the remaining 50% will be absorbed by the university.

Field Trips

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Students who participate in approved co-curricular activities shall be counted as being in attendance during the instructional school day.

Field trips, school-to-work-activities, and other student activities involving travel shall contribute to the achievement of District and school goals and academic expectations. In the planning of such activities, primary consideration shall be given to the educational value of the activity and the safety and welfare of the students involved.

EARNED ATHLETIC AND ACADEMIC TRIPS

Students who compete in approved athletic, academic, musical, and other competitive activities shall contribute to the achievement of the District.

In the event that an individual student, an athletic team, an academic team, or other group representing a school or schools in the District becomes eligible, by successful completion of a qualifying event or test, to attend or compete in a subsequent event that requires travel, the Superintendent, or his designee, may grant approval for such travel upon request of the appropriate Principal.

All matters relating to Scheduling, Drivers, Vehicles, Supervision, Meals, Insurance, and Parental Approval for such earned athletic and academic trips shall be governed by the District's Field Trip policy.

BOARD APPROVAL REQUIRED

The Superintendent shall submit for Board approval a listing of excursions designated as local trips. The Board shall consider on an individual basis requests for overnight trips and trips taken to destinations more than fifty (50) miles from school except those destinations on the approved field trip list.

PRIOR APPROVAL

Prior approval of the Principal is required for each of the above trips. Approval shall be granted only when co-curricular activities and trips are instructional in nature, directly related to the instructional program, and scheduled to minimize absences from classroom instruction.

SCHEDULING

Trips that are longer than one (1) day shall be scheduled during vacation periods, if possible.

In order for students to be counted present during school-related trips during the school day, the activity must be co-curricular or instructional.

DRIVERS/VEHICLES

All District-owned vehicles shall be utilized and driven by an adult duly qualified and licensed to operate the vehicle. Drivers of school vehicles and operation of District-owned passenger vehicles transporting students shall be in compliance with requirements specified in applicable statutes and administrative regulations.¹

Field Trips

SUPERVISION

A certified or classified staff member must accompany students on all school-sponsored or school-endorsed trips. For overnight, out of state trips, a certified administrator shall accompany the group, which could include more than one (1) school at a single destination. For athletic trips, a nonfaculty coach or a nonfaculty assistant may accompany students as provided in statute. Persons designated to accompany students shall be at least twenty-one (21) years old.² The staff member(s) in charge of the trip shall serve in loco parentis for the participating students and shall be responsible for monitoring the behavior of both students and chaperones.

School personnel shall screen prospective adult chaperones (age 21 or older) and make the final decision as to who shall accompany the students. A reasonable number of chaperones shall be required. On all overnight trips there shall be a minimum of one (1) chaperone in each student room. Adults who voluntarily contribute their time to serve as chaperones on field trips shall be under the direct supervision of school personnel assigned to the activity. Chaperones are expected to act as reasonably prudent adults in providing for the safety of students.

All participants shall be required to comply with District policies and procedures, including those pertaining to alcohol and drug use.

MEALS

The planning process for all field trips across all grade levels shall include a statement of where meals will be provided in the event that students are not able to eat lunch at school. Whenever possible, sponsors are to work with the Kenton County School District Food Services Department to provide carry-on meals to be consumed at a predetermined single site. Planning documents will identify the location and source of each meal. For meals, each bus shall transport students to one (1) dining location at which all students on that bus must remain. Students are to be dropped off and picked up as close to the dining entrance as possible and supervised closely as they enter and exit. When multiple buses are involved, each bus may be assigned to a different location, but students may not leave the site to which their bus has been assigned.

INSURANCE

Only Board insured vehicles or appropriately certificated common carriers shall be used for transporting students.³

Use of certificated common carrier service shall be authorized by the Board on a case-by-case basis, and the reasons to justify such use shall be cited in Board minutes.³

MEDICATION

Administration of medication to students during field trips shall comply with applicable law, regulation and medication administration training developed by the Kentucky Department of Education.

When students will be travelling outside the state, the Superintendent's designee shall do the following:

- 1. Determine applicable legal requirements concerning delegation of student medication responsibilities in states through which students will be travelling; and
- 2. Assign staff to accompany students on the field trip to address student medication needs, when applicable.

PARENTS' APPROVAL

Parents are to be informed of the nature of the trip, the approximate departure and return times, means of transportation, and any other relevant information. Parents must give written approval for students to participate in school-sponsored trips.

Re: HR allocation request for "Human Resources Coordinator"

Human Resources requests the addition of a Human Resources Coordinator (HRC) effective immediately beginning with the 2017-18 fiscal year. The additional HRC will focus on the hiring, processing and servicing of classified staff, as well as assume other duties currently spread amongst the remaining four members of the HR team.

The addition of the HRC is necessitated by the following factors:

- The district currently employs 2,301 individuals in paid positions, of which:
 - o 903 certified staff are serviced by one HRC
 - o 740 classified staff are serviced by the HR department's Administrative Assistant
 - The HR administrative assistant is unable to complete all required tasks of the position since the majority of her time is spent with the hiring, onboarding and servicing of classified staff.
 - o 658 substitute staff and supplemental positions are serviced by one HRC
- Human Resources will assume the processing and management of worker's compensation, which is currently handled by the District's Safety Officer. Current HR staffing levels would not allow for the assumption of worker's compensation. If granted an additional HRC, worker's comp would be assigned to the HR administrative assistant. This shift in duties will free up a substantial amount of the Safety Officer's time to focus on districtwide safety.

The current makeup of the HR department consists of one (1) director, two (2) HRCs and one (1) administrative assistant. The average HR department for the top 15 school districts in KY, excluding Jefferson County, is one (1) director, four (4) HRCs, one (1) administrative assistant and one (1) clerk. Kenton County is the fourth largest school district in KY.
