- **Learning at Lincoln** –

- 82% of our students are now participating in the blended model of in-person and virtual learning
- 18% of our students have continued to stay with the all virtual learning model
- Intervention Wednesdays – Teachers will be bringing students who have targeted learning goals into Lincoln on Wednesdays to work on their specific learning needs.
- Students are working in a multitude of different online programs on their new learning devices – *Lexia, Wonders, EnVision Math, Freckle Math, Words Their Way, AR, Epic, Stemscopes Science*, etc.

- **Teacher Professional Growth Plans** -

All LES certified teachers have submitted their Professional Growth Plans. Mr. Wolf, Ms. Dragan and Mr. Chenot are reviewing these plans as a leadership team and meeting with teachers to discuss their professional growth needs and how we can support them to learn and grow.

- **Book Donation** –

Unataza and *The Book Bus* partnered to make a generous donation of multi-cultural books to our school. With this donation, we will be able to have a strong start-up for a multi-cultural section of our library for students.

- **Scholastic Book Fair** –

The Scripps Howard Foundation has again gifted Lincoln with another set of book fairs for our students this school year. The next *Scholastic Book Fair* will be held during October 23rd – November 6th with students EACH receiving FIVE books this round. The students will be selecting their books a bit differently this year, but it is promised to be a great experience for them! We are so incredibly grateful for this generous gift!

- **LES Virtual Clubs** –

Our virtual clubs are about to kick-off here at Lincoln. All club sponsors will be offering their usual clubs and have developed unique ways in order to present them virtually. Club examples will be shared with the board of education.
