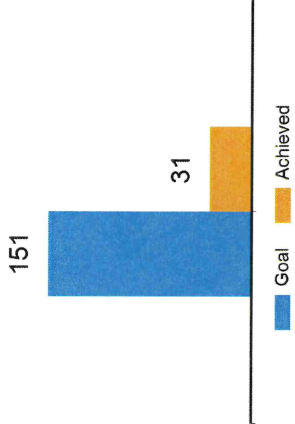

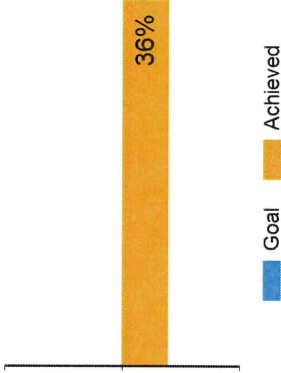
Measurable Skill Gain Results : 20%



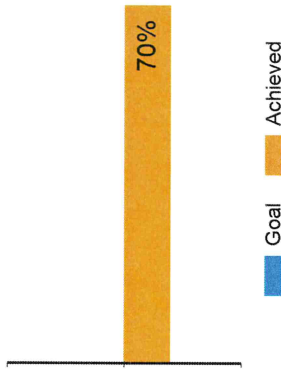
High School Equivalency Results : 25%
