## Graduation Requirements

State Minimum Graduation Requirements for a basic diploma
In support of student development goals set out in KRS 158.6451 and the Kentucky Academic Standards, students must complete a minimum of twenty-two (22) credits, including demonstrated performance-based competency in technology.
Students wishing to receive a regular diploma must pass a civics test made up of one hundred (100) questions selected from the civics test administered to persons seeking to become naturalized citizens and prepared or approved by the Board. A minimum score of sixty percent $(60 \%)$ is required to pass the test and students may take the test as many times as needed to pass. Students that have passed a similar test within the previous five (5) years shall be exempt from this civics test. This shall be subject to the requirements and accommodations of a student's individualized education program (IEP) or a Section 504 Plan. ${ }^{5}$

In addition to the content requirements established by the Kentucky Academic Standards, and the credits required by the minimum requirements for high school graduation in 704 KAR 003:305, the Board may impose other requirements for graduation from high school. Students shall complete an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) that focuses on career exploration and related postsecondary education and training needs.

## Minimum Graduation Requirements for a Gallatin County Schools diploma

In support of student development goals set out in KRS 158.6451 and the Kentucky Academic Standards, students must complete a minimum of twenty-five (25) credits. Including demonstrated performance-based competency in technology, successfully complete a course or program in financial literacy and have received instruction in essential workplace ethics.

Students wishing to receive a regular diploma must pass a civics test made up of one hundred (100) questions selected from the civics test administered to persons seeking to become naturalized citizens and prepared or approved by the Board. A minimum score of sixty percent $(60 \%)$ is required to pass the test and students may take the test as many times as needed to pass. Students that have passed a similar test within the previous five (5) years shall be exempt from this civics test. This shall be subject to the requirements and accommodations of a student's individualized education program (IEP) or a Section 504 Plan. ${ }^{5}$

In addition to the content requirements established by the Kentucky Academic Standards, and the credits required by the minimum requirements for high school graduation in 704 KAR 003:305, the Board may impose other requirements for graduation from high school. Students shall complete an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) that focuses on career exploration and related postsecondary education and training needs.

## Graduation Requirements

## For Students Entering Grade Nine (9) on or Before the First Day of the 2018-2019 Academic Year

Credits shall include content standards as provided by the Kentucky Academic Standards established in 704 KAR 003:303 and 704 KAR Chapter 8. The 25 required credits and demonstrated competencies shall include the following minimum requirements:

Credits shall include content standards as provided by the Kentucky Academic Standards established in 704 KAR 003:303 and 704 KAR Chapter 8. The 25 required credits and demonstrated competencies shall include the following minimum requirements:

3. Complete three (3) postseondary eredit hours or more of a Kentueky Department of Edueation approved dual eredit course with a grade of C or higher,
4. Complete one (1) course and eorresponding assessment meeting the following eriteria:
a) Advanced placement (AP) with a seore of three (3) or higher,
b) Cambridge Advaneed International(CAI) with a seore at E or higher, or
e) International Bacealatreate (IB) with a seore of five (5) or higher,

For Students Entering Grade Nine (9) on or after the First Day of the 2019-2020 Academic Year (continued)
5. Obtain an industry eertifieation as approved by the Kenttueky Workforee Innovation Board,
2. Complete Earn four (4) credits from classes within a single Kentucky Department of Education approved career pathway;
3. Complete a Kentucky Department of Education approved process to verify 500 hours of exceptional work experience, or alternative requirements as determined by a student's Admissions and Release Committee and specified in the student's IEP; and
8. Complete two (2) years in an approved Kentucky Department of Edueation or Kentueky Labor Cabinet pre-apprentieeship or apprentieeship program.

For Students Entering Grade Nine (9) on or after the First Bay of the 2020-2024 Acadente Yeak

Gredits shall include content standards as provided by the Kenttreky Aeademic Standards established in 704 KAR 003:303 and 704 KAR Chapter 8 . The required eredits and demonstrated eompetencies shall inelude the following minimum requirements.

a) Advaneed placement (AP) with a seore of three (3) or higher,
b) Cambridge Advaneed International (CAI) with a seore at E or higher, or
e) International bacealaureate (IB) with a seore of five (5) or higher;
5. Obtain an industry eertifieation as approved by the Kentueky Workforee Inmovation Board,
6. Complete- Earn four (4) credits from valid courses classes within a single Kentueky Đepartment of Edtueation approvedeareer pathway,
7. Complete a Kenttreky Department of Education approved process to verify 500 hours of exceptional work experience, or alternative requirennents as determined by a student's Admissions and Release Committee and speeified in the student's IEP, and
8. Complete two (2) years in an approved Kentueky Department of Edueation or Kentueky Labor Cabinet pre-apprentieeship or apprenticeship program.
H. Meet one (1) of the following graduation prerequisites for reading and one (1) of the following graduation prerequisites for mathematies:
9. Score at or above the minimum criteria on the tenth ( 10 th) grade state-requirect assessments in reating or mathematies,
10. Seore proffieient or higher for reading or mathematies on the eighth (8th) grade state required assessment; or
11. A student collection of evidence submitted by the Prineipal to the Superintendent/designee for review and approval. The eolleetion of evidenee shall inelude the following:

- The student's ILP that ineludes student transeript,
- If applieable, for students with IEPs, evidence that the student has aehrieved progress on meastrable anntual IEP goals as determined by the Admissions and Release Committee;
- Performanee on the tenth ( 10 th ) grade state-required assessments in reading or mathematies;
- Appropriate interventions, targeted to the student's needs,
- Student work demonstrating the student's competency in reading or mathematies, and
- The student's post-graduation plans.

## Additional Graduation Requirements

In order to graduate, students must fulfill the following additional requirements:

1. Complete all portions of the State Student Assessments. Program ineluding EOC, ACT, PLAN, KPREP,KOSSA and/o industry eertifieations
2. Complete and pass a Senior Culminating Project, which the student shall present to the SBDM. (This requirement shall be waived for students that are eollege and eareer ready.)
3. Follow the promotions policy in regards to grade-levelassignments.
4. Meet all graduation requirements to participate in graduation exercises and graduation night.
5. Pass state-mandated civics test.
6. (Beginning in 2020-2021) Successfully complete a course or program in financial literacy.
7. Receive instruction in essential workplace ethics.
8. Demonstrate competency in technology.

The high school student handbook shall include complete details concerning specific graduation requirements.

## Other Provisions

The Board may grant different diplomas to those students who complete credits above the minimum number as established by the Kentucky Board of Education. In addition, the Board may award a diploma to a student posthumously indicating graduation with the class with which the student was expected to graduate.

The Board, Superintendent, Principal, or teacher may award special recognition to students.
Consistent with the District's graduation practices for all students, an alternative high school diploma shall be awarded to students with disabilities in compliance with applicable legal requirements. ${ }^{3}$
In keeping with statutory requirements, the District shall accept for credit toward graduation and completion of high school course requirements an advanced placement or a high school equivalent course taken by a student in grades $5,6,7$, or 8 if that student attains performance levels expected of high school students in the District as determined by achieving a score of "3" or higher on a College Board Advanced Placement examination or a grade of " B " or better in a high school equivalent. ${ }^{2}$

A student who is at least seventeen (17) years of age and who is a state agency child, as defined in KRS 158.135, shall be eligible to seek attainment of a High School Equivalency Diploma.

The District shall report individual student data regarding the completion of each graduation qualifier and each graduation prerequisite to the Kentucky Department of Education.

The Board may substitute an integrated, applied, interdisciplinary, occupational, technical, or higher-level course for a required course if the alternative course provides rigorous content.

## Graduation Requirements

## Early Graduation Certificate

Students who meet all applicable legal requirements shall be eligible for early graduation in relation to receipt of a graduation diploma and an Early Graduation Certificate. Students wishing to follow an early graduation pathway shall notify the Principal of their intent prior to the beginning of grade nine (9) or as soon thereafter as the intent is known, but within the first thirty (30) school days of the academic year in which they wish to graduate. A Letter of Intent to Apply shall be entered into the student information system by October 1 of the year the student declares intent to graduate early. ${ }^{4}$

Students working toward receipt of an Early Graduation Certificate shall be supported by development and monitoring of an ILP to support their efforts.

To graduate early and earn an Early Graduation Certificate, a student shall:

1. Score proficient or higher on the state-required assessments; and
2. Meet the college readiness exam benchmarks established 013 KAR 002:020 for placement in credit-bearing courses without the need for remediation.

A student who has indicated an intent to graduate early may participate in the student's state administration of the college readiness exam prior to the junior year, if needed. Students who meet all applicable legal requirements shall be awarded a diploma and an Early Graduation Certificate.

## Diplomas for Veterans

In keeping with statute and regulation, the Board shall award an authentic high school diploma to an honorably discharged veteran who did not complete high school prior to being inducted into the United States Armed Forces during World War II, the Korean conflict, or the Vietnam War. ${ }^{1}$
