MEAL CHARGE POLICY CHANGE HIGHLIGHTS

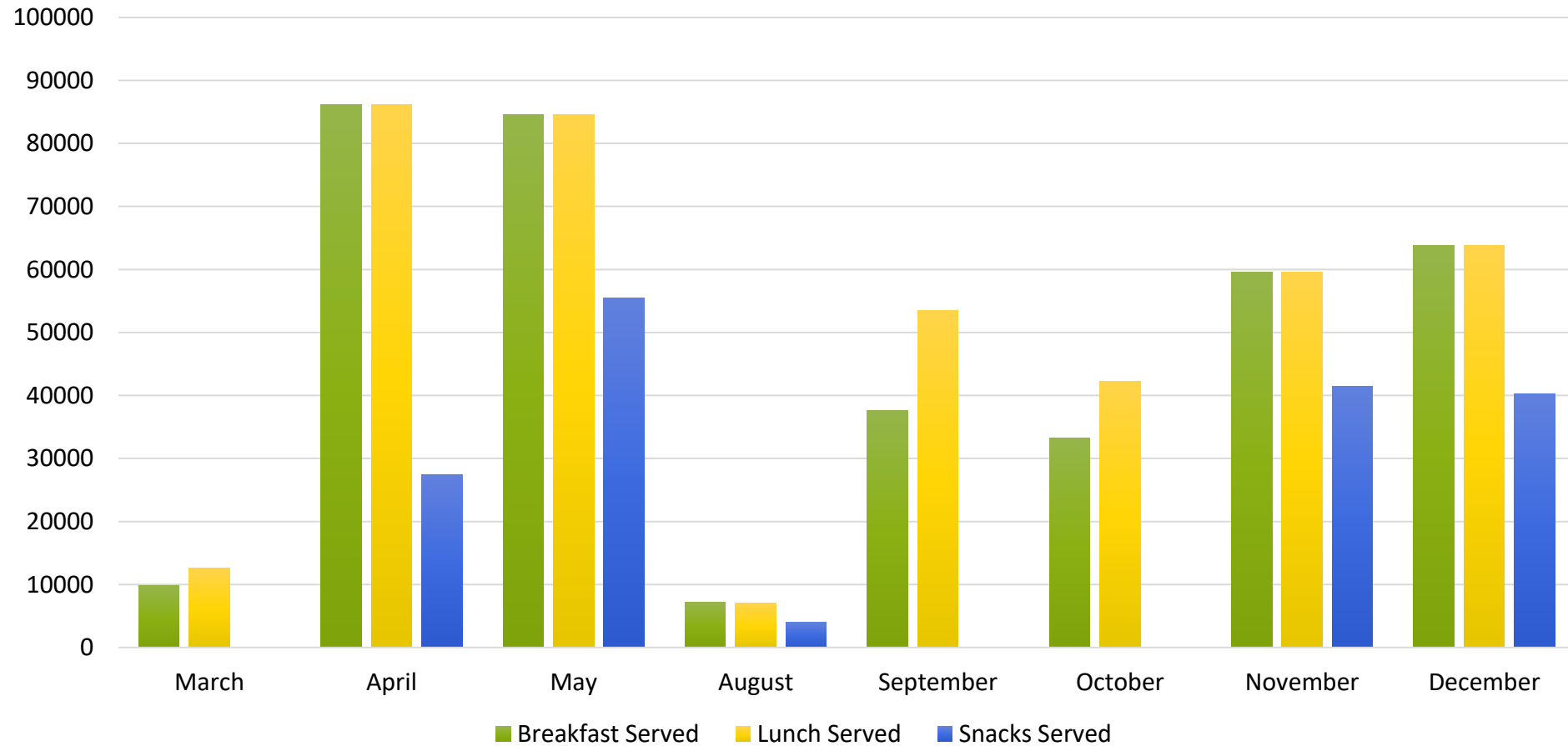
OLD POLICY
