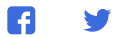

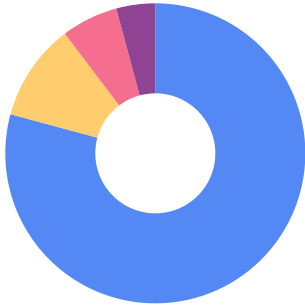

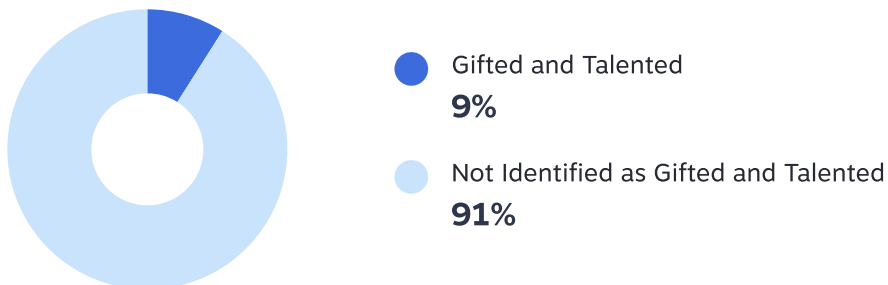
### Gifted and Talented >

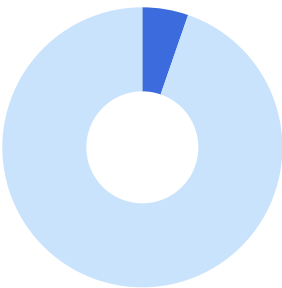

Indicators of school safety include behavior events, resolutions and legal sanctions reported by schools, as well as precautionary measures in place to promote the safety of students in schools.

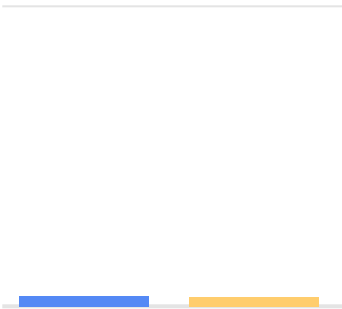
