



For each subject assessment, students are ranked as either Distinguished, Proficient, Apprentice or Novice. Comparisons may be made between school and district performances based on these performance scores.






Graduation Rate >


Graduation Rate indicators include high school graduation rates, advanced coursework success, dropout and retention.


