



Assessment Results

Students are assessed in grades 3-8 and 11 in a variety of subjects on tests that were developed by Kentucky teachers. Students in grade 11 also take a college admissions exam. For each subject assessment, students are ranked as either Distinguished, Proficient, Apprentice or Novice. Comparisons may be made between school and district performances based on these performance scores.

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Advanced Coursework

Gifted and Talented

Career pathway opportunities available for students and career and technical education (CTE) student objective counts and percentages. For more information regarding CTE student objectives, please see the glossary.



Graduation Rate

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
Graduation Rate indicators include high school graduation rates, advanced coursework success, dropout and retention.


