Heather Snyder is deserving of the Live Red staff award for the hard work she has put in this year. Mrs. Heather was assigned the first graders with the most potential for growth. She has embraced the challenge and flourished in the role. Her hard work really shined in the results from district common assessments. 100\% of SLES first graders scored proficient or higher in at least one area, with $82 \%$ scoring distinguished in at least one area. Mrs. Heather was eager to experiment with Seesaw as an app to use for communicating with primary students' families. She's used it with great success and was excited to introduce it to her peers and help them get started interacting with families via Seesaw. When in person, Mrs. Heather has done an excellent job of keeping kids engaged by mixing periods of hands-on instruction with brain breaks. During times of virtual instruction, Mrs. Heather has helped students experience success by bringing them in by appointment for targeted, small group or even individual instruction. Mrs. Heather, along with Mrs. Kim Hays, quickly realized that first grade was not having much participation or response to live availability for instruction via Zoom or Google Meet. That led Mrs. Heather and Mrs. Kim to adapt and start posting class instruction videos to Facebook. This has been met with approval and praise from parents.

I also love the fact that a small part of making a personal connection comes in the way that Mrs. Heather talks to her students. She doesn't refer to them as just as her class but as "Mrs. Heather's Friends".

## The LCHS CTE Department Uses Square Technology to Broaden Customer Purchasing Options

Using funding from the Perkins V Career \& Technical Education Grant, the LCHS CTE Department has recently purchased three Square Electronic Purchasing Systems that allow students and other patrons to pay for purchases using credit cards and other forms of electronic currency. The Business/Marketing Department is using their system in the school store, Central Spirit, to sell LCHS apparel, school supplies, drinks/snacks and holiday gift items. They have also been able to allow students to purchase copies of the yearbook using credit cards, which had not been previously available. The Family \& Consumer Sciences Department is using their Square System in operating the Cardinal Concession Stand for sales each afternoon to students/staff and at every home ball game. The Agriculture Department will be using their Square System in the operation of the LCHS Greenhouse and to make sales for their new Lime Spreader and No-Till Drill that will be used by local farmers. These systems will not only allow for electronic purchases, they also keep a running inventory for students to learn those skills along with marketing, purchasing, and customer relations.
