You are receiving this letter as your child has been identified as an <u>At-Risk for Retention</u> student based on his/her academic performance during the first semester of school year 2020-2021.

Your child has failed two or more classes for the 1st semester. The Newport High School Administrative Team as well as the district have worked to create a schedule conducive to providing academic interventions and supports to provide your child the foundation of essential skills for academic success and the supports to avoid grade retention.

At this time, your child is required to attend virtual interventions for the classes they are failing during the afternoons. These academic interventions are designed to reinforce standards that were not mastered and earn credits. Newport High School issues half credits per semester for students in grades 9-12. Students in grades 7-8 must master content and pass coursework to be promoted.

In addition to the interventions embedded in the daily schedule, we are offering Extended School Services to students at varied times during the week to accommodate student schedules. The schedule is included with this letter and is posted on the Newport High School Website: www.newportwildcats.org

The current worldwide COVID-19 pandemic has created a situation which has been trying for families and school districts. We are refining processes and adapting to the current crisis. The situation we are faced with presents a wealth of issues for all, but the NHS Administrative Team and district leadership is committed to providing the skills and supports for your child to be successful and prepared for a transition to adult life. We would like to provide every opportunity for your child to be successful in this ever changing environment. We recognize that working virtually is a struggle for many students and has created challenges in acquiring credits, which are mandatory for graduation.

In order to meet the needs of our students, we are going to be allowing small groups to come to the high school during the following times:

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday 12:00pm-3:00pm	Wednesday - 8:00am-3:00pm

Students will arrive through the cafeteria entrance, following Covid protocols (temperature check, social distancing, and mask required). They will have the option to eat lunch in the cafeteria from 12:00pm-1:00pm. If students attend a Wednesday session they will check in the cafeteria entrance and receive breakfast until 9:00am. If students arrive later than 8:30am on Wednesdays, they will check in at the front office. Students will then be escorted to a designated space in the library, which will be monitored by zones and supervised by staff. If a student does not have technology, a computer lab is available.

Students will be expected to work on Edgenuity while at school in order to make up work and earn credits that are required for graduation. Staff will be available to assist students when needed. Students will be able to leave at their own discretion and parents will not be contacted when students leave the building. Transportation will not be provided at this time.
