01.1 Legal Status of the Board

HISTORY/BACKGROUND:

On January 4, 2021, the Kenton County Board of Education voted to reconvene the Local Planning Committee (LPC) for the purpose of amending the current District Facility Plan (DFP) due to the creation of District Programs, a reduction in enrollment at some District School Sites, and other unforeseen circumstances. In accordance with 702 KAR 4:180 the Local Planning Committee met on January 26, 2021, to draft and review a Draft District Facility Plan. On February 11, 2021, the LPC met and voted unanimously to approve the Draft DFP. Pursuant to Section 502 of Kentucky School Facilities Planning, the LPC is sending the amended DFP to the Board for its approval.
