## Lincoln Elementary School Board Report February 2021

- On our recent Staff Work Day held on Friday, February 12, LES teachers engaged in a multitude of activities/discussion including:
  - Analyzing Student Data Teachers spent time collaborating to analyze their students' data for the assigned online programs. They participated in a Scavenger Hunt and submitted their findings.
  - *"Taking Care of Myself"* session with John Mueller, District Mental Health Counselor
  - *Team Planning* Content teams and grade level teams had time to collaborate to determine next steps for curriculum, assessment and instruction.
- SuccessMaker Math ~ Our students in grades K 6 are now fully working in the program SuccessMaker Math. This is an adaptive learning program that continuously personalizes math instruction for student growth and differentiation.
- Plans for summer learning at Lincoln have begun. We are hoping to do an eight-week academic and enrichment camp collaboration with our 21<sup>st</sup> Century Learning Program. (June 7 – July 30)
- Return to full-time instruction ~ The LES administration has been collaborating with district administrators and the Safety to Schools team to brainstorm details/needs for getting our students returned to school for full day instruction. We are utilizing the CDC, KDE and survey results to help lead our plans.
- Scholastic Book Fair ~ The date for our next gifted Scripps Howard/WCPO Book Fair is set for February 26<sup>th</sup> – March 7<sup>th</sup>. All students (grades preschool through 6<sup>th</sup> grade) are anticipated to receive five brand new Scholastic books.
- Student Council is sponsoring INCLUSION WEEK the 1st week of MARCH. The National Day to Spread Inclusion this year is March 3. The theme is *CONNECTION*.
- Learning Expectations for our Lincoln students:
  - 2nd-6th grades AIMSweb Oral Reading Fluency is due by 2/26/21
  - Students have taken their Round 2 CASE Assessments
  - ALL LES students completed their IP (initial placement) in SuccessMaker Math and are working in the program
  - o All LES students are working in their individual online *Wonders* accounts.
  - Our first and second graders are now accessing their online "Words Their Way" accounts
  - All Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade students are working in our new *Heggerty Phonemic Awareness Program*
  - ALL LES students in grades 1-6 are working in their *Freckle Math* accounts
  - All LES students completed the *EnVision Math Readiness Test*
  - All LES students in grades K 6 are using their writing journals with guidance from their teacher
  - All LES students are utilizing and working within their *Lexia* account
