!LEAD SERVICES AGREEMENT

BACKGROUND

- A. !LEAD's mission is to empower young people to be the leaders of their lives through an innovative program that utilizes an interactive training model to prepare them to take on life's challenges with strength and courage (the "Program").
- B. School desires to retain !LEAD to provide the Program to students at the School, on the terms and conditions that follow.

<u>AGREEMENT</u>

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>SERVICES</u>. !LEAD will provide the Program to School by performing the Services outlined in <u>Schedule A</u>, and such other services agreed upon by !LEAD from time to time (collectively the "<u>Services</u>"). School will provide those items outlined in <u>Schedule A</u> to allow !LEAD to perform the Services, including obtaining a Photo and Audiovisual Release ("<u>Release</u>") in the form attached as <u>Exhibit A</u> for each student participating in the Program. If School cannot obtain a Release for some students, School and !LEAD will work together to accommodate the student's participation in the Program.
- 2. <u>COMPENSATION</u>. For the Services to be performed hereunder, the School will pay to !LEAD a fee determined in accordance with the fee schedule set out in <u>Schedule A</u>. Unless otherwise provided in <u>Schedule A</u>, said fee will be payable within thirty days of receipt by the School of an invoice from !LEAD accompanied by documentation reasonably requested by the School evidencing all charges.
- 3. <u>RELATIONSHIP CREATED</u>. The Parties acknowledge and agree that !LEAD is not an agent or employee of the School for any purpose whatsoever, but is an independent contractor under the terms of this Agreement. !LEAD has exclusive control of the manner, means, and details of its performance under this Agreement, as well as that of its employees, agents, and licensees.
- 4. <u>INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY</u>. !LEAD retains all right, title, and interest in any invention, technique, process, device, discovery, improvement or know-how, whether patentable or not, hereafter made or conceived solely or jointly by !LEAD in performance of the Services. All writings or works of authorship, including, without

limitation, program codes or documentation, produced or authored by !LEAD in the course of performing the Services, together with any associated copyrights, are the exclusive property of !LEAD and are explicitly NOT works made for hire or the property of the School.

- CONFIDENTIALITY. Each Party acknowledges that the other respective Party maintains certain confidential information relating to its business and its students, including but not limited to protected trade secrets, student and client lists, contact information, personal information of students and customers, and other proprietary and confidential information (collectively, "Confidential Information"). During the term of this Agreement and indefinitely thereafter, neither party shall, directly or indirectly, reproduce, publish, disclose, use (except in the case of performing Services hereunder during the term of this Agreement), reveal, show or otherwise communicate to any person or entity any Confidential Information of the disclosing party ("Disclosing Party") (or its customers/students) unless specifically directed to do so by the Disclosing Party. Without limitation to the foregoing, in the event that a party receives Confidential Information from a Disclosing Party ("Receiving Party"), such Receiving Party agrees to (i) use appropriate safeguards to prevent the unauthorized or wrongful use or disclosure of Confidential Information; and (ii) notify the Disclosing Party immediately of any unauthorized or wrongful disclosure or use of Confidential Information. The covenant in this Section has no temporal, geographical or territorial restriction or limitation, and it applies wherever the Parties may be located. Upon the termination or expiration of this Agreement, all documents containing or referring to Confidential Information in the Receiving Party's possession or under its control shall be delivered to the Disclosing Party immediately, with no request being required.
- 6. <u>TERM AND TERMINATION</u>. The term of this Agreement will begin upon the Effective Date. This Agreement will remain in force until the Program End Date set forth on <u>Schedule A</u> or until terminated, and may be terminated at any time for any reason by either Party upon the delivery of a written notice of termination to the other Party at least 7 calendar days prior to the Program Start Date set forth on <u>Schedule A</u>. The termination of this Agreement will not affect the Parties continuing obligations under this Agreement, including School's obligation to pay any fees.
- 7. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>. School will indemnify and defend !LEAD, including its employees and agents, against any and all losses, damages, liabilities, deficiencies, claims, actions, judgments, settlements, interest, awards, penalties, fines, costs, or expenses of whatever kind, including professional fees and reasonable attorneys' fees, that are incurred by !LEAD in any claim or dispute by a third party arising out of !LEAD's performance of the Services or this Agreement.
- 8. <u>FORCE MAJEURE</u>. Neither Party to this Agreement will be responsible or liable for delay in the performance of, or failure to perform, any provision or part of this Agreement during the period of delay or failure to perform when such delay or failure is due to any cause beyond its/his control, such as, but not limited to, fire, flood, strike, other industrial disturbance, scarcity of labor or transportation, breakage of machinery, unavoidable accident, war, riot, storm, earthquake, act of terrorism, explosion, embargo,

inability to obtain materials, fuel or products, transportation controls, governmental action, or act of nature.

- 9. <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>. This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Ohio without regard to principles of conflict of laws.
- (a) All notices, consents, waivers, and other communications required or permitted under this Agreement will be in writing and will be deemed given to a Party when sent by facsimile with telephonic confirmation or electronic mail.
- (b) If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions will continue to be valid and enforceable.
- (c) This Agreement constitutes the sole and entire agreement between or among the Parties to this Agreement with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all prior agreements, whether written or oral.
- (d) This Agreement cannot be assigned without the prior written consent of the other Party.
- (e) This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed to be an original copy of this Agreement and all of which, when taken together, will be deemed to constitute one and the same agreement. The exchange of copies of this Agreement and of signature pages by facsimile, DocuSign, or electronic mail transmission constitutes effective execution and delivery of this Agreement as to the parties and may be used in lieu of the original Agreement for all purposes. Signatures of the parties transmitted by facsimile, DocuSign, or electronic mail are deemed to be their original signatures for all purposes.
- (f) The waiver by the School or !LEAD of a breach of any provision of this Agreement will not be regarded as a waiver of any subsequent breach by either the School or !LEAD.
