# Decision not to Winter MAP test at the Primary

- Input from stakeholders.
- Virtual assessment data not as reliable for kindergarten through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students.
- Students who tested virtually in the Fall did not perform as high when assessed in-person.

# Why did we not test students in person?

 Safety was number one concern. Covid-19 numbers at the time of the Winter Map were very high.



### F&P Benchmark Assessment

# Fountas and Pinnell Benchmark Assessment

 Determines a student's independent and instructional reading level (need support of the teacher).

#### How do teachers use the F&P data?

- Provides a placement level for small group reading instruction
- Form initial groups for reading instruction
- Plan for efficient and effective instruction
- Benchmark assessment
  - Fall, Winter, and Spring
  - Comparing student growth over time

#### Effects of the Pandemic

- Current Kindergarten Limited in-person instruction.
- Current 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Completed NTI work during the last quarter of their Kindergarten year. Typically, this is when K students excel at reading.
- Teachers were trained on and implemented virtual guided reading. Difficult to implement as effective as in-person due to being virtual.

### Celebrations

2<sup>nd</sup> grade had the lowest percentage of students scoring below grade level (47%).

64.5% of students are now attending school inperson four days a week.

#### **Summer School**

- Will provide students 150 minutes of reading instruction.
- 19 teachers committed to teach summer school and will service approximately 100 students.

### F&P Areas of Concern

Percentage of students scoring below grade level increased, when comparing Winter of 2020 to Winter of 2021.

- Kindergarten: increased by 41%
- First Grade: increased by 46%
- Second Grade: increased by 12%

## Supporting Students Below Grade Level

Daily small group guided reading.

Identify students' specific areas of need and providing Tier II interventions.

Maximizing all resources (positions) to provide additional student interventions.

Special area teachers and instructional assistants

# Students in Tier III intervention

- 4-5 times a week receive additional small group reading support
- Receive a total of 8-10 small group lessons a week

## Supporting Students Above Grade Level

# Small group guided reading 2-3 times a week at their instructional level.

 These students are fluent readers, but need additional vocabulary development and deeper comprehension strategies.

Utilize all staff to provide interventions.

## School-Wide Next Steps

Parent-teacher conferences - March 22<sup>nd</sup> – 26<sup>th</sup>

#### Focus on Summer School

- 6 weeks: June 7–July 1 and July 12–22
- Instructional Focus: Reading and math
  - 90 minutes of math, 90 minutes of reading, and 60 minutes of Reading Mastery (reading phonics/fluency)
- Classes based on Spring F&P scores
- All students encouraged to attend

#### 2021-22 Class Rosters

 Students will be grouped strategically to ensure effective small group guided reading.
