MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

among

Dayton Independent Schools Bellevue Independent Schools Southgate Independent Schools

For the McKinney Vento Homeless Children Education Program

Dayton Independent Schools, Bellevue Independent Schools, and Southgate Independent Schools (jointly known as "the districts") agree to share responsibility for and the work of the McKinney Vento Homeless Children Education Program in our three school districts.

We agree to the following concepts, procedures, and activities:

- Dayton Independent Schools will serve as fiscal agent, employ a coordinator, and manage fiscal affairs of the project.
- The districts will comply with McKinney Vento and all relevant state law with regard to the education of students identified as homeless.
- The districts will collaborate to use existing and develop any new policy and procedures needed to ensure appropriate identification, enrollment, and education services are provided to homeless students.
- The districts will train staff members to recognize signs of homelessness and to refer children to the McKinney Vento program as needed.
- The school districts will encourage collaboration with national, state, regional, district, community, and school agencies and organizations that can provide needed supports for homeless students.
- The districts will provide resources and connections that will assist parents to be involved in the education of homeless children.
- The districts will implement the Strategic Plan of the attached narrative faithfully and will support any updates or modifications required to support homeless children's education.
- The districts will provide financial support from general fund or specific programs as indicated in the Strategic plan.
- The districts will provide data and analysis to enable the project to monitor implementation, progress toward goals and outcomes, and project effectiveness.

This agreement will take effect upon project funding and end three years from that date, unless changed or altered by mutual written agreement of the districts.

The district(s) assures it will:

- A. Remove barriers that hinder the enrollment of homeless students.
- B. Administer the program in accordance with all applicable statutes, regulations and applications.
- C. Use funds for the purposes described in its application for funding and will retain control of these funds and title to any property acquired with these funds.
- D. Provide all reports and data to the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) as are reasonable and necessary to enable the Department to perform its duties. This includes annually reporting of Adequately Yearly Progress data based on the ESSA in the areas tested for all students served by this program.
- E. Maintain records to assure the correctness and certification of such reports, including information relating to the educational effect on homeless children and youth.
- F. Make these records accessible as the KDE may find necessary.
- G. Not exceed the district's maximum salary schedule for a specific job classification for personnel hired with program funds.
- H. Maintain accurate time logs and documentation of services for personnel working in this program (actual time spent working directly with program).
- I. Plan specific activities to involve the parents of homeless children and youth in the program to the greatest extent possible.
- J. Comply with or will use requested funds according to local education agency requirements outlined in Section 722(g) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act. Section 722(2)(a) states the state (KDE) and local educational agencies (districts) are to comply with or will comply with the provisions contained in Consolidated State Application to the U.S. Department of Education.
- K. Ensure the homeless education program does not isolate or stigmatize homeless children and youth.
- L. Ensure that the coordinator will be involved in professional development which could include attending the National Homeless Conference and KDE sponsored professional development.
- M. Ensure that the coordinator will have log-in accessibility to the Student Information System (Infinite Campus), OR ensure the liaison is provided, upon request and in a timely manner, with Infinite Campus reports related to homeless students in the district.
