Summary of Services Performed (field test data, locations, elevations & depths are estimates) & Individuals Contacted.

ECS Representative arrived on-site, as requested, to observe test pit excavations throughout the back parking lot/Bus area. Five test pit locations are shown on the attached drawing. Gray lean clay that was soft when surface probed and visibly saturated was exposed at the surface in the area observed. Stiff soils consisting of a light to medium brown lean clay were encountered from 12 to 36 inches below the existing grades throughout the area. Based on our observations, ECS recommended that either the area be allowed to dry and re-evaluated or undercut to stiff soils and replaced with properly placed and compacted stone fill. The depths of the anticipated recommended undercuts are provided on the attached drawing based on the conditions observed in the test pits today. Actual depths of undercuts may vary some from the test pits based on the conditions the day the excavation occurs. If the area is allowed to dry, it should be noted that the materials may take up to several months to dry to suitable moisture contents based on our experience with similar materials and the time of year that this is occurring (i.e., winter and spring when it is typically cooler and wetter).
