



#### Memorandum of Cooperation

between
Pikeville Medical Center
and
The University of Kentucky



This Memorandum of Cooperation is made and entered into by and between **Pikeville**Medical Center (PMC) and the University of Kentucky for its Kentucky Children's Hospital (KCH).

Whereas, KCH is part of a leading state academic health care center that provides tertiary and quaternary health care services, and includes KCH, with a Level I pediatric trauma center, Level IV neonatal intensive care unit, and pediatric intensive care unit, and includes a leading research, education, and clinical care institution, that provides care throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky;

Whereas, the Kentucky State Health Plan requires all Kentucky hospitals with either Level II or Level III Special Care Neonatal beds to affiliate with a Kentucky hospital with Level IV services for consultations, education, training, and joint development of guidelines for development, review and revision of protocols, policies and procedures;

Whereas, KCH is one of only two hospitals in the Commonwealth that provides Level IV services:

**Whereas**, PMC is a leading regional medical center in Eastern Kentucky providing primary and specialty health care for the families, businesses and visitors of the Appalachian region;

Whereas, PMC provides a full line of pediatric clinical and OB services, including the region's only Level II Special Care Neonatal beds, advanced obstetric delivery service, a Pediatric Ready Emergency Department, and a Certified Autism Center™ (CAC) emergency department;

Whereas, PMC established the Appalachian Valley Autism Center (AVA Center) the region's first Advanced Behavior Analysis (ABA) Center providing developmental services for pediatric patients with autism between the ages of 2 and 12;

Whereas, PMC is expanding the services in pediatric care in Eastern Kentucky by constructing the region's first pediatric hospital with an anticipated opening in early 2022;

Whereas, both institutions desire to have an even greater positive impact on pediatric health, well-being, and the overall care for the children of Eastern Kentucky and the Central Appalachian region;

Whereas, healthcare and education are two essential components of quality of life, wellbeing, economic development, and prosperity for the families of the Commonwealth of Kentucky;

Whereas, a cooperative effort between both institutions toward improving the quality of healthcare offerings for the pediatric community has been shown to be an effective means of improving health outcomes while allowing patients and their families to remain closer to home; and

The Joint Pediatric Leadership Working Team will work collaboratively toward exploring the design and implementation of various projects and programs as and when feasible, including, but not limited to:

# Developing pediatric specialty clinics at PMC using Tele-health, virtual clinics, and/or in-person specialty care by KCH physicians including:

- i. Behavioral Health, Neurology, Cardiology, Oncology, Gastroenterology;
- ii. Remote monitoring and interpretation;
- iii. Virtual PICU consultations; and
- iv. Additional programs identified by the Team.
- Developing educational opportunities for KCH residents and fellows at PMC.
- Assisting PMC to form a partnership with Commission for Children with Special Healthcare Needs.
- Providing monthly on-site ADOS testing for pediatric autism diagnostic assessments.
- Achieving optimal site of service for autistic patients receiving ABA services, and their families, in PMC's service area.
- Assisting to identify PMC's needs for all areas of comprehensive pediatric care including pediatric physicians, specialists, mid-level & tech positions and assistance in the recruiting of personnel to fill those needed positions.
- Providing data for KCH's research efforts.
- Optimizing patient scheduling and transfer procedures for easier transferring and scheduling of PMC's pediatric patients.
- Providing guidance to PMC on implementation of PMC's children's hospital including:
  - i. Protocols;
  - ii. Policies;
  - iii. Staffing; and
  - iv. Other items identified by the Team.











The new pediatric wing will be located on the first floor inside Pikeville Medical Center's Emergency Department (ED) and Trauma Center. From child-appealing decor to trained staff, the physical and operational design of the new pediatric ED wing will support the PMC Children's Hospital's philosophy of family-centered care. That is why PMC decided to design new space within the current emergency department that considers the well-being of their youngest patients.

#### NEW EQUIPMENT WARMS INFANTS WHILE BEING TREATED

Kosair Charities recently awarded a \$21,000 grant to Pikeville Medical Center (P.M.C.) Emergency Department (ED). This grant allowed PMC to purchase a GE Paeda Marmer, an examination table made specifically to accompadate sick babies. The Panda Warmer keeps babies warm while ED staff work to diagnose and treat them. However, the worning bed does much more than that.

If we need to get an x-ray of the baby, we can do that without revening the infant from the Panda Warmer," explained PMC's ED Clinical Manager, Megan Allen.

"Having this piece of equipment will help us treat sick babies better than



befere. A buby that is cold is much harder to treat because the are agitated and many times cry. That, in itself, can cause the buby's heart rate and even temperature to rise. With this bed, we can keep babies warm and more comfortable, letting us better see what is truly works."

The Panda Warmer is the latest announcement from PMC relating to the emphasis on pediatric treatment. Announcements are coming soon concerning updates with the development of the PMC Children's Hospital, the first of its kind in costant Kontucky.






