Student Achievement Report DISCUSSION

Let's reflect on these principles:

1. Our SBDM council is committed to all students mastering state academic standards.

How do we demonstrate that commitment? *Paula T.-meeting consistently and reviewing policies. Making sure they are up to date and applicable.*

Andrea Brin- "Using and creating innovative ways to encourage and motivate learning" Amy Jennings-"Meeting and reviewing data. Looking for growth areas to improve upon" Andrea Brin-"Identifying ways to support students during the summer."

How do we communicate to our shareholders? This is an area of growth for our school. Amy Jennings recommends an informational sheet or flyer, how parents can get more involved. A free flyer from KASC is a resource we will model after to create our own.

Liz-Our meetings are streamed live and put on the school calendar sent home with students. Andrea Brin-the use of the Remind app helps get information to parents. Liz will utilize the app more to communicate about site-based with parents.

How do we listen to our shareholders?

Liz-we have public comment during meetings, but no stakeholders utilize the opportunity. Paula T.-Very rarely has there been a parent utilizing the public comment section of site-based meetings. Liz agrees, in her experience, it is very rarely used.

2. Student understanding of standards is measured regularly in our school by.

Amy Jennings- Teachers use I can statements, exit slips, state testing. Classroom teachers have become good at framing their I can statement as their standards.

Liz- Iready testing.

Andrea Brin- suggests communicating the standards to parents

When students don't master the content, they ...

Amy J.-reteach in small groups or RTI. But when students don't master standards, that is not communicated in a way that is easily given to parents. Iready adjusts to student needs if a standard is not met. Small groups based on missed skills in the classroom.

REFLECTION:

For which questions were we able to give confident responses? Amy J- A was strong and maybe D. B and C are growth areas for us.

For which questions do we need better answers?

B and C are growth areas for us. We are doing some of these things well, but not communicating them well.

- Not bad, better than we thought
- Kindergarten Not bad

- Paula T- this year's third grade is going to continue to need support.
