## **Lesson Plans**

FFA Camp is a long standing tradition that prepares students for their leadership roles in the upcoming school year. We will be taking up to 5 students who plan to be apart of the leadership team next year. These students will attend leadership training sessions and general sessions during the three day event.

This year Camp Director and State Staff worked on a modified version of FFA camp that was approved through the Kentucky Department of Education. Frequently asked questions regarding safety and sanitation protocols have been asked and I am including them below. Additionally, if there are any other questions or concerns then our Camp Director is ready to address those.

- The way we came up with cabin numbers was by taking the 900 square feet of the cabins and dividing them by 144 square feet (that allows 6 feet separation in every direction) and we arrived at 7 people per cabin. We normally have 20 sleeping spots (10 bunk beds). Each cabin has multiple air conditioners so there will be air movement and some filtration.
- Our normal capacity for camp is 400 students, plus advisors and staff. We will be operating below 25% for this summer to assure maximum social distancing.
- As far as COVID procedures, we are going to be following the "Healthy at School" guidelines and have hired a school nurse for the summer, as well, to make sure we are doing the appropriate wellness and temperature checks throughout the day and have proper spacing and distancing for classes and meals.
- We also have the local Health Department scheduled to come in soon to prep the site to accommodate camp.
- Any athletic activities will be open-air/outdoor activities and will follow KHSAA guidelines.
- Additionally, we received funding from EESR II money to pay for the nurse, purchase PPE, hand sanitizing stations, thermometers, outdoor tents for open-air classrooms and extra masks.
- Our leadership worked REALLY hard in Frankfort to get this through, and it was ultimately approved by the Commissioner of KDE and the Governor's office.
