Academic AM Sessions

- Meetings with all elementary, middle, and high school principals have occurred
- Schools working identifying students to be invited/recommended for participation
- High school academic offerings will be embedded into their existing ESS structures
- Principals sharing concerns that teachers not wanting to work in the summer so trying to create some structures with principals so that teachers do not have to work all summer long
- Elementary and middle looking at offering academic sessions in June and more transition-based activities in July for incoming Kindergarteners and targeting grade levels that have had limited in-person time since March
 - Example: incoming 8th graders transitioned to remote learning March 2020 and transitioned back to 4 full days before Spring Break 2021
- Special Ed department has met with schools and identified elementary and middle school students who will need COVID compensatory ed services for summer and into the 2021-2022 school year
- Will be providing MSD COVID compensatory ed services summer 2021 at high school level because all teachers willing; cannot provide these services at elementary/middle if all MSD teachers do not agree for due process issues
- Principals have spreadsheet due to me on 4/23 with number of potential students, staff numbers, supplies, needed, etc. so then we can post positions and coordinate transportation and food service

Re-Engagement PM Sessions

- All ESSER II level committees have met twice to set up planning for PM sessions along with creating a survey to distribute to teachers at each level for mini-camps
- FRYSC camp planning is also a part of this as well so we can provide a plethora of activities that interest students
- As of Friday, April 16th the following proposals have been submitted:
 - Elementary School: 25 submitted
 - Art, STEM, Paper Mache, painting, gardening, hiking, mindfulness, yoga, scrapbooking, cardio drumming, Robotics, coding, 3D printing, etc.
 - Middle School: 11 submitted
 - Forensics, cricut design making, Jazz camp, instrumental music beginner starter camp, percussion camp, cooking, embroidery, unplugged fun, etc.
 - High School: 16 submitted
 - Cross stitch, game design, Animal science, rugby, Female fitness, theater, etc.
